I am not happy with the BBC's response after I complained. Their reply is inadequate and avoids the actual complaint.

The show did not cover the Godhra train burning or the thousands of Hindus that suffered in the aftermath of the Gujarat riots. There are many interviews with Muslim victims but none to the same level of Hindu victims.

Where were eye witness accounts of Hindus and what happened to Hindu families?

The undertone of the whole documentary had audio clips of Hindus making inflammatory statements about Muslims. Where are the audio and visual clips, which even a lay person can easily find, of Muslims making much greater amounts and more severe violent calls against Hindus, including the Muslim ministers.

There was coverage of Kashmir, but no mention of the Kashmiri Hindu massacres, forced conversions, and exodus at the hands of Pakistan-backed terrorists.

There were no interviews with Kashmiri Hindus so that they could give their side of the story as to how their human rights have been affected. This was sloppy, dangerous, partisan and inflammatory propaganda by the BBC.

## Reason for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the BBC's final response

The BBC avoided my actual complaint and as a tax-paying and TV licence fee-paying British Hindu, it is unacceptable for my community to be demonised by the BBC. Hindus have a right to balanced, well-researched programmes that give us a voice.
