Dear Families,

We had another wonderful week here at Lilja! As you know, starting Monday, students and staff were able to choose whether to wear masks at school. Our emphasis here at school has been on personal choice and respecting our own and each others' decisions on what feels healthy, safe, and comfortable. 

# **Ongoing Reminders and Information**

<u>Mask Mandate Information</u>: As you know, the Natick Board of Health rescinded their prior mask mandates for schools and busing effective Monday, March 7th. Natick Public Schools has moved to a "Mask Flexible Culture." Please see <u>this link</u> from Dr. Nolin for more information and note that staff has previewed the information with students this afternoon using this slideshow.

Per this new guidance, everyone will have a choice about if and when they want to wear a mask at school and on buses. As a school community, we will respect those choices and honor each family's and student's decision and levels of comfort with this change. That leads us to a flexible masking environment, described below:

# What is Flexible Masking?

- Students and staff may or may not wear a mask to school, depending on their own preferences, personal health choices, and family values.
- We will not be taking note of which parents and children prefer masking and which do not. Families will need to guide their children.
- Masking will be required for all staff and students when in the Nursing Office. Please send your child to school with a mask in case they need to visit the nurse.
- Any unvaccinated individuals across the district are "strongly encouraged" per DESE/DPH to wear a
  mask but are no longer required by state guidelines.
- Staff and students who have health needs that require additional supports (504s, health care plans, etc.) will continue to be given support and accommodations through those means and through interactive dialogues with Human Resources for staff.
- Students or staff returning from Days 1-5 of COVID isolation must wear a mask for Days 6-10 except at lunch, snack, and/or outdoor recess.
- Students feeling unwell or displaying COVID symptoms should always remain home.

## How are we preparing for this shift?

- All students and faculty will encourage a school culture supportive and respectful of flexible masking.
  - We will not comment on whether students choose to wear a mask or not. This includes well-meaning comments like "It's so wonderful to see your smile!" or "I love being able to hear you without a mask!" as it could inadvertently persuade or shame those who choose to continue to wear masks.
  - We will model respect for the personal choices of students and teachers.
  - We acknowledge that many reasons exist for why a person selects to wear a mask and we will be respectful of their privacy in making this decision.

- Teachers will, according to choice, also be flexibly masked and unmasked, modeling both options as part of our school culture.
- Parents are expected to provide masks for their children if that is their choice but extra masks will be available in the office should a student ask for one.


Please know that we are committed to supporting students, families, and staff through this next transition and will continue to teach and model respect for students' and families' individual and private choices and levels of comfort in wearing masks or not.

<u>At-Home Antigen Testing Program:</u> Currently, 85% of Lilja students have opted in to the new at-home antigen testing! Read all about this program and Frequently asked Questions by clicking <u>HERE.</u> for English. As a reminder, At-Home Antigen tests will be distributed to students every other Tuesday. Each kit contains two tests, enough for two weeks of at-home testing. Tests should be administered on Wednesday mornings and any positive results should be reported to Nurse Naser at <u>bnaser@natickps.org</u>.

At this time our current masking plan will stay in place (all students will be using district provided KN95 masks) purifiers will still be on, and bell covers will still be required.

Drop off procedures will remain the same (you will continue to see me standing outside greeting students). Please do not drop off students earlier than your scheduled time because if you don't see me, I may not be there yet.

I know that for some of you this will be a sigh of relief for a more consistent schedule but for others it may come with some anxiety. Please know that I will do my best to spread kids out as much as we are able in the spaces that we have available to help keep us all safe.
