- Coordinate meeting times with parents to discuss student academics, online programs or interventions.

As a parent, I will:

- Review all information sent through Jupiter or the Kingsmen Parent Newsletter on a weekly basis.
- Engage in my child's school by volunteering at NCM or attending school meetings.
- Communicate with NCM teachers, counselors or staff when my child is struggling socially or academically.
- Contact NCM staff when I have questions or concerns.

The school engages Title I, Part A parents and family members to improve the achievement of their children in meaningful interactions with the school. This Compact supports a partnership among staff, parents and family members, and the community to improve student academic achievement. To help reach these goals, the school has established the following practices:

The school provides Title I, Part A parents and family members with assistance in understanding the state's academic content standards, assessments, and how to monitor and improve the achievement of their children (ESSA Section 1116[e][1])

- Academic content standards and assessment information is provided at the annual Parent Curriculum Night held in the fall.
- Title I Parent Workshops are held periodically in the morning and evening to assist parents with monitoring their child's academic progress on Jupiter.
- Parents are invited to request parent conferences with school counselors, teachers or the Student & Parent Center for further and individualized information pertaining to their child.

The school provides Title I, Part A parents and family members with materials and training to help them improve the achievement of their children such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate to foster parent involvement. (ESSA Section 1116[e][2])

- Parents may receive 1:1 support with monitoring their child by making an appointment with their child's school counselor or the Student & Parent Center staff.
- Parent workshops are held on a monthly basis to provide parents with materials, tools and training to participate in the education of their child.
- Parent training consultants are utilized during semester two to provide further parent support to assist parents with increasing their child's engagement in school.

With the assistance of Title I, Part A parents and family members, the school educates staff members in the value of parent and family member contributions, and how to work with parents and family members as equal partners (ESSA Section 1116[e][3])

- Curriculum Night is utilized at the beginning of the school year to start the partnership between parents and the classroom to ensure parents are knowledgeable on the routines and coursework of each course at NCM.
- Teachers are encouraged to communicate with parents through routine use of Jupiter, email and personal phone calls regarding student achievement and behavior.

• Regular parent workshops and parent trainings are held each month to provide valuable information for parents to support their children.

The school coordinates and integrates the Title I, Part A parental involvement program with other programs, and conducts other activities, such as Parent Centers to encourage and support parents and family members in more fully participating in the education of their children (ESSA Section 1116[e][4])

- Coffee with the Principal is scheduled for the most part on a monthly basis.
- Parent workshops are held at least once per month to provide parents with materials and training to participate in the education of their child.
- Parent training consultants are utilized during semester two to provide further parent support to assist parents with increasing their child's engagement in school.
