




# I. Mid-Year Survey to Parents and Staff Regarding 4-Day School Week



### Please Explain:

It allows for a catch up day from a week filled with activities for school. The four day week with after school activities allows my son to stay busy all day at school until I get off work which helps out immensely.

4 day week works best for our family!

It gives an opportunity to spend more time together as well as schedule appointments on non school days.

It works because I am home on Fridays

Child is left alone on Fridays, child refuses to attend Friday programs.

I guess don't like it

Our child is a senior she has enjoyed having time to explore options for her future on the day off

As my child did not go in person school for about one year because of pandemic, it is better if she can attend school for five days as she need more support and interaction with peers.

Less Exposed to Germs

Enjoy having 4 day school week because it's nice for the kids to be off on Fridays.

We use the off day for appointments and supplemental homeschooling.

Would like to have the option for assistance on Fridays if necessary.

We love having the extra time together on Fridays to work on reading, music, sports, and other areas together as a family that is difficult to do during the week.

I feel like my children are happier, more excited for school and more mentally healthy on the 4 day week. It is great to see them have the ability to decompress and they are still scoring well on their testing.

I believe that all children need a break in order to be successful, I also like having a day off during the week this allows for appointments to be made on these days which helps with attendance,

They aren't doing anything on Fridays

Family time on Fridays have been wonderful for our family.

It's nice so he is able to go to any Appointments and it is not interfering with his school.

We love the 4 day schedule. Works best for our family.

Both parents work on Fridays.

I like the 4 day schedule It has not caused issue with our family.

We can get all doctor appointments and to not miss school. He has been able to maintain a job. He has developed better time management skills & stays on top of his work. This is great prep for college being that most classes are in 4 days. Life seems far better manageable and I wish this had be done years ago.

Got to spend more time with the family together. Got time to attend all Dr appointments etc.

Students not being sent home with work to do, also needing to find sitter to watch children on Friday's.

Works great for our family allows for more family time on weekends

It helps with appointments and catching up with a busy week along with mental health reset.

I feel like my child is less overwhelmed. The 3 day weekend gives my child a great mental reset and is eager to go back on Monday. I think the e day weekend is helping with their mental health.

We schedule dr and dental appointments on Fridays it also reduces the number of times our children have to travel on dangerous highways to and from school not to mention the number of days our kids are potentially exposed to Covid-19 and it's variants

It gives our family more time as a family. We have more time to bond as well. My family and I are really enjoy it.

He can work part time on weekends

Give me more quality time with my son.

I love it! It gives him a break, time to attend the "specials" Friday program offers that he would otherwise not have the opportunity for, time to get homework done, work, sports, etc.

My kids do get antsy to go back but I feel they are more rested having 3 day weekends

We will like a 5 day's

I like it my daughter likes it.

- 1. There are significant coverage gaps on random Fridays, not much different from before the additional Friday programming was implemented.
- 2. The program director does not appear to know much in advance when Friday programming will be cancelled. For instance, on the Friday \*before\* the Thanksgiving holiday, we were waiting at the bus stop when we discovered there would be no programming that day.
- 3. The program director does not appear to have a good way to get in touch with parents.

4. My kids don't get much of any benefit from the Friday programming, which would be OK if they were at least enjoying it, but they find it to be akin to babysitting, with few activities and a puzzling combination of strict rules and low supervision.

I think is perfect

The schedule works for my family because we have the time/flexibility to get most of what we need, done during the week. I'm still not 100% sure about academic affect (if any) but it seems to work well schedule-wise.

With work schedules and Dr appt. 4 day school week works better for appt

I believe it has helped my kids be in class more without disrupting them and the class around them for necessary tasks that can be scheduled for Fridays. It allows for better planning for things such as doctors appointments, weekend trips, sports, work, and other extra curricular activities.

We work and have to find things for our kids to do on Fridays.

Our kids love the three day weekend

I don't feel that my student is getting as much instruction time.

The four day week works for our family. This gives the students opportunities to catch up on any missed assignments and minimizes the loss of instruction lost due to sports.

Both parents work on Friday. The district-provided Friday program seems to be just babysitting instead of educational programming, from what my kids say. I would prefer they be in the classroom 5 days per week. If we return to a 5 day week, I would also prefer that the kids be in school on Friday. Last school year, the kids were off multiple Fridays per month, which is basically a 4 day week.

The 4 day week really helps me, please don't go back to 5 days a week.

My husband and I work 5 days so this schedule have really been hard on us. That being said i feel like if we are going to stick to a 4 day school week, the curriculum needs to be structured more. My 2nd grader comes home and tells me they had 3-4 recess a day. So extending out the school day and then sending them to recess is counteractive. I also feel if it stays the bus to San Antonio needs to be addressed, they don't get picked up until 7:50 and don't get to the school until 8:20 which is 25 mins after school starts. Maybe pickup time needs to be earlier.

We like it because he plays sports and he not missing any school time on Fridays

They have been doing better in school I guess not so much pressure.

I believe with everything going on that this is appropriate. I would have hoped for a different schedule of days being in and A-Day/B-Day format so students and teachers can not only focus on subject matter for a productive amount of time, but also to help teacher-student relationship. I believe with the shorter class periods and everything going on has definitely has put unnecessary stress and pressure for our children and especially their teachers to get students back to the level that they should be academically. This then affects us parents. However, I do support the 4 day either way.

Not enough time left for extracurriculars, kids don't want to do Friday activities, kids are generally overtired.

Too much time lost for curriculum

Finding childcare on Fridays can be difficult. My younger child I'd in a 5 day pre school being that my wife and I both work 5 days a week.

It's good to gave a day to take care of appointments and not miss school days

We like the 4 day week. I just wish Charter would also go 4 days- it makes it hard as a family to have one kiddo go to school and the others are off. I do realize the district has no say in the charter calender unfortunately.

Our student likes the 4 day week as do I. It gives us more time to do projects around the hoyse.

The schedule would work better if the Athletic Director would schedule games to accommodate a 4 day schedule. Maybe reach out to Magdalena or other schools to see how they schedule games so Student Athletes attend more than 2 full days of school. When the schedule was first pitched the Superintendent and Johnson said games would be scheduled on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday for away games so athletes will be able to rest the next day. However this has not been the case.

I feel the kids would be better served academically with 5 days plus the extra day off is a disruption to their routine

Having a four day week allows my son to have a weekend job, helps on football trips, allows for time to get to appointments without missing school

With our days and work day we had to opt in for our kids to go to the extra Friday school

My son is an only child and both parents work M-F 8-5pm. He needs more structure and more required activities to keep the brain active.

We love having our kids home more during the week

The HS doesn't have any extra instructional time added. The addition of Advisory can't make up for the missed time in all the other classes. I do like how they are trying to add cool classes on Friday, but I don't feel like enough of the students are taking advantage of them.

They are getting their one on one with teacher and plus they get to work on their own at home

It gives more time for extra curricular activities and time to complete homework.

Fridays off have worked with my work schedule and my child seems happy with 4 day week. Learning seems to not be a problem

This schedule allows us to make appointments out of town..and our child's attention to school tasks has increased

Student got extra time to spend time with family.

I am able to work from home and have time to help my kids with homework. Four day weeks give me an option for scheduled appointments without pulling the students from school for the appointment.

Parents have to work on Fridays so a 5-day school week will be preferred. Though attending after school program helps.

I think everyone work and school should be a four day work school week. Better for mental health and time to enjoy family and life.

Unsupervised children while parents work

Making the 4 days longer and skipping learning on the 5th day never works well. Kids forgetting things over the 3 day weekend and schools added a third recess for the extra time per day. So at the end it is a disservice to the students.

I work on Friday and want my kids in standards based school with routine and rigor. They are behind nationally, though excelling in their cohort.

The long days left the children wiped out, and the 3-day weekend was too much time away from school, there was always a ramp up needed to get them back into the swing of things on a Monday morning.

I feel like they lose out on learning and they have to stay too late to make up for not having the 5th day and it's hard for the students that play sports as well

Even though I feel safe with my kids staying home ... for me, it's about the social aspect of it all. I want them to go through the same weekly grind as most not only to prepare them for adulthood but also because they need more social interaction with other students & people. Covid has already changed so many aspects of their lives that I believe some core habits should stay, I think they are already hurting both emotionally & mentally (maturity) with all the digital time they get as it is with all the days off they get now. Our community isn't equipped or set up for another day off every week, more kids will try to find something to do and there ain't much in Socorro. It's drug infested, sadly the balance has shifted to that here. Socorro has failed big time in creating safe n healthy outlets for our youth. Most can't afford child care either. It would just hurt families all around.

Our work allowed us to adjust work schedule, that allowed more time with our children.

Makes it easier for him and me to not have to worry about getting him to school while I work

The 4 day schedule works out perfect for our family. It helps with their appointments

My child misses out on 1 extra day of learning in a structured manner. Because my child has medical needs he is not able to attend the Friday programs. He attends San Antonio school and there are no programs offered on Friday's there.

Can not find child care

Our family is fortunate to have the means to make arrangements for our children not attending Friday school. We can feed them. We can make sure they are looked after. What about the families that aren't as fortunate? This isn't an inconvenience for our family. It's an inconvenience for our children who are not going to be prepared for life after school and they aren't getting adequate in-class hours.

Are family is constantly on the go and the extra day is nice and my kids are keeping up there grades so much better with the extra day of rest

I am neutral on the 4-day week. It works fine for our family because we can afford daycare for our child on the fifth day. Our son occasionally goes to the Friday program at Parkview, but he really doesn't love it there. For young children, four days of school seems to be enough for them to handle emotionally.

We like the 4 day schedule because it helps us really rest for the school week. I feel like we get more family/rest time and that promotes better learning for our children

We are on the fence about school on Fridays. On one hand, we have to find childcare for our daughter and it can be kind of a pain. The Friday program is really nice, but our daughter doesn't always want to go and I don't feel like she is learning any academic skills there. (She does have fun and the coordinators seem great.) On the other hand, the extra flexibility is nice when we're able to get Fridays off of work and spend an extra "weekend" day together.

I think any time school schedules and work schedules don't align, it's really challenging for parents to find childcare. During the winter break for example, we scrambled to figure it out. Without the 4-day work week coinciding with the 4-day school week, it's very hard for working families to find the extra childcare support necessary to make Fridays a seamless experience for both students and parents.

My son's mental health is much better since we started the 4 day. I know some people didn't like it but it has made a lot of difference in how happy he is going to school. Thank you for making this a priority!

We have busy and awkward work schedules, one less day of mayhem makes life just a little more pleasant!

It's hard to continue a routine

More daddy/daughter time


It works very well

4 day week works well for appointments

We will like 5 days

The after school programming appears to be very good, and significantly better than the Friday programming. The district really seems to have delivered on this promise.

I understand the reasoning for wanting to go to a 4-day week, but while it does not appear to have been the disaster I expected academically, I'm not seeing tangible benefits to the students.

The Friday programming concept was supposed to make up the difference and we parents were expecting it to smooth over the gap between school schedules and our work schedules. The ambiguity and frequent cancellations of the Friday programming subvert this benefit in a way not all that dissimilar from before, when there were in-service days every other week and we just had to deal with it. I'm not satisfied with how this has come together.

I don't know whether the 4-day week has helped with teacher morale or recruiting enough to offset the problems. If it has—which I doubt, since I believe every district in the nation is having trouble recruiting right now—then I will accept the district's decision to continue with this. But in the absence of evidence to support that, it feels like a half-hearted apology for poor pay rather than something motivated by providing kids with better educational outcomes. I personally would rather we fight to raise the taxes enough to pay competitive wages and return to the 5-day week than continue this experiment. It would seem that Fridays would be a perfect time to really delve into any academic deficits or any concepts students would be having trouble with. I think more teacher encouragement to attend tutoring or study sessions on Fridays would be great.

4 days school week helps greatly to limit the infection and gives students extra time to work on their own staff or anything they need to catch up.

Please consider doing surveys a different way since most underserved families do not do these. The 4 day week has not been successful. The "Friday classes" are not applicable to all. We have tried to participate multiple times. It's hard to get a solid answer from administration. The kids don't seem to understand the schedules or what's offered. What I've been told is offered applies to maybe 5% of the schools population. If that Friday consisted of much more then what it has now, I could try to get behind it. The program can't even entice half of the student population to join. At least with 5 days a week our children are receiving an additional day of learning.

The 4 day schedule does have a negative impact on student athletes. Parents were told the Athletic Director would schedule games to accommodate the new schedule. The Athletic Director is not following through with scheduling of games. I do believe Johnson would have worked diligently to

change the athletic schedules to accommodate the 4 day week however this is not being done at this time. The 4 day schedule has potential but also needs some adjustments to be more inclusive.

It's nice as long as we can opt into the extra Friday class it's like a play day for my kids. Since the Friday activities were not mandatory, I do not see how the 'day off' benefits our children at all. This community suffers from poor and uneducated and we need to provide more support and education for this population, not less.

There is no reason that the only way I saw the Friday Schedule was by coming across it in a Facebook post 3 days after the program started.

I love the way our school works. And I believe the children are accustomed to the schedule they have now and it makes them not dread going an additional day. It gives them the right amount of time at school and off school. I would hate for it to change and I'm very hopeful that the 4 day school week remains. I don't feel an additional day would benefit our children during these times. It's a good balance where it's at, no change is needed.

When there is a holiday, a 3 day school week is not enough, when they have school on Fridays everyone's schedule is thrown off.

Our students are going through a lot in life with a pandemic. They lost a lot of in-class-time due to the schools shutting down. If there ever was a time for a 4 day week, it's is definitely not now. Our students are underperforming and are last in a state that is last in the nation for education. This isn't about what is best for adults and what adults opinion is. Adults, parents, school board members, faculty all need to understand and do what is best for our students.

#### Not at this time

I don't think that society in Socorro (or general) is well-suited for a 4-day school week. I work at NMT, and there are middle schoolers roaming campus and campus buildings on the off Fridays. On the other hand, for young children, the emotional break is a good thing. The Friday program at Parkview could have and should have been much better than it was. The communication was poor, and many parents lost confidence in it as an option before the program even started. Our child would go grudgingly, and we really wanted him to like it and for it to be successful. I applaud the Board for taking the plunge and choosing the 4-day as an option when it was needed. If they want it to continue a 4-day, the District needs to figure out how to engage students on Fridays, and prove to the working parents of Socorro that it is advantageous in the long run to keep this. Finally, any and all data showing that student success is not deteriorating due to the 4-day week needs to be presented. Virtual learning is not happening like they explained. Friday class they do and say nothing to each other or the teacher to students.

#### None

The teachers deserve an extra day of rest!

Generally we have been pleased with the 4-day week for our kindergartener. If we had a vote, we would like to continue the 4-day week for elementary school (or at least kinder), and return to a 5-day week for middle and high school.

While we appreciate the opportunity for Friday enrichment, and our child seems to enjoy it when they go, we have received almost no communication from the program coordinators. Especially at the start of the school year, when information would have been most useful... We have sort of figured it out "by feel", but we still have no idea what our child does on Fridays and we receive no feedback or communication of any kind from the Friday program. As a result, it is known to several of us as the "sketchy Friday program".

Have dealt with middle school kids with nothing to do and no supervision on Fridays damaging public property repeatedly

#### No

I think that the 4 day week probably works well for younger children as they make the adjustment to school. I am concerned that as she gets older, the 4 day week may actually not be rigorous enough academically. It definitely allows some more flexibility to family time and taking short adventures but I worry that it could impact her academically as she gets older.

I also have been underwhelmed by the Friday programing. There is basically no communication and so I am not sure if it is enriching or not. Our daughter seems to enjoy it but we have literally no idea whether it it worth the risk of COVID to send her at this point. Improved communication would help us to better judge whether the Friday programming is worth the risk.

If the 4 day week does allow for better teacher retention and prevention of burn-out then I think it is probably worth the risk academically for our kids. I would like if we had more feedback from the Rio Grande Educational Collaborative to better understand whether this program is actually adding enrichment, especially for the older grades where a 5 day week may be more necessary academically.

SCSD should return to a traditional 5 day school week.



## What is your position?



### Please explain:

Its not too bad for me, but I have a hard time getting through the material with so little class time.

Students are overtired by the end of the day, and the reduction in instructional time (literally almost a full fifth) is noticeable. Participation on Fridays is minimal.

It is impossible to teach all the things I need to in a week in just four days.

The four day week has made me feel like I don't care as much about teaching as I used to. Like the students, I am focusing on other things and school doesn't seem like the most important thing anymore. Also, the longer day makes me tired and less productive after school, so even though I'm often here until 4:30 or 5:00, I still fall behind with my tasks. So then I work on those Fridays off, for which I am grateful. It's true that I work less on weekends now.

It is very exhausting with no benefit for the students

We still had to work.

Though I appreciate the 4-day work week, it has been challenging to schedule students as Ancillary staff. Caseloads remain similar to last year, but we have a day less to schedule, complete paperwork, and assessments. It is doable, just a new challenge.

By 7th period the kids were burnt out, also this didn't allow the golf team to practice for several months.

Although the 4 day work week is nice as far as days off, it is very disruptive for people like myself that like to work a typical work week. I personally think that he has made staff and students somewhat lazy in their approach to everyday lifestyle. This is my personal opinion.

4 Days a week at the current bell schedule isn't letting enough be completed in class. Every day feels rushed through with not enough time for focused learning in my classes. Students come get set up and it seems I get to teach for only 30 mins and they'll have to start wrapping up.

I like having Fridays off to get things together for the next week.

I have time for appointments on the days that we are off, and I get to spend extra time with my son

It gives me extra time to grade and do lesson plans

Fridays for staff PD and extracurricular / tutoring for students has been highly beneficial.

It forces us to focus more deeply on instruction, making every minute count. It also gives time for students to digest what they have learned by having an additional day off during the week.

It gives our family the opportunity to spend more time together and plan appointments with out having to miss school and work.

The longer days were hard to adjust to, but we are used to it now. It would be very hard to revert to a 5 day week.

it works for me but my main concern is the students, so far I haven't seen that is has had a negative effect on them(as far as my kids are concerned)

I feel that I am getting a lot more done this year. I am missing a whole lot less for appointments. It is also very nice to have that extra day for training or work.

By having Fridays to work on professional training and school matters, I am better able to focus on these quite well and still have time to keep up with other personal needs.

It has helped my work and home life balance. I am always ready to come back to work on Mondays. I am rested and ready to preform my duties.

It gives teachers time to do grading and lesson plans.

I am able to come in on Friday's as needed to catch up, however I've been making as many doctor's appointments as possible for Fridays.

The schedule allows me the flexibility to come in on Fridays if needed and work without interuptions or distractions. It also gives me more time with my kids.

The one problem I have is that our school is always shut down. In all the years of teaching, I have been able to go into work on weekends and holidays. I'm glad we have Fridays to go in only because of Friday school. I don't believe that covid has shut the school down. If the school is sprayed it's fine. I go to my room and work because I need more time. After the longer day I want to go home.

I feel the students and staff come to work more relaxed and rested and things run more smoothly...at least that's what I see in my classroom. I like the fact that students that need extra support get it on Friday, as well.

I prefer working four tens because I have another job .

It's easier to make appointments on the fridays we're off.

The days are long, but I am able to catch up on grading etc. on Fridays, which is a great relief.

I felt the 4 day worked for me, it gave me the break I needed. It gave me time to get ready for the next week.

Why the 4-day week has worked so well for me is because I like the extra day we get on our weekends, it is a great rest period and when it's time to come back to work I feel refreshed and ready to work my full best.

I am able to use Fridays for extra planning.

This has been great for me as far as being not so burnt out during the school week. That extra day helps me to balance my kids and work. I have been able to schedule appointments on those days. My attendance was so much better until we got Covid and I had no choice, but to quarantine. The 4 day week just seems like it has been good for everyone and kids really enjoy the Friday programs.

We have had to make many adjustments and we have had to prioritize curriculum mapping, but in the end, having a day to schedule doctors' appointments and other personal matters lets me focus on school and not have to take as many days of leave.

I am able to cover the material I need to cover in a 4 day week.

At first I thought it would be hard but it has been a great change.

The schedule is great, because it helps to get work graded, plan lessons, have more to time to look for extra resources for my classes. Since we close at 4 pm, it really hard to get anything done after school, so the Fridays really helps with planning for classes.

Gives me time to rest mentally and physically but also gives me time to go to appointments instead of missing work .

I have not taken any days off for doctor's appointments this year due to the 4 day week. There are some offices that are not open on Friday, but thankfully I haven't had to take any regular days off yet.

I did some research and found that nationally, studies show there is no significant difference in academic gains by children on a four and five-day schedule. The research also shows that the work-life balance is improved for teachers on a four-day week which contributes to improved motivation. Attendance is also improved. Teachers do not have to take school days for appointments, health visits, etc. Because there is no research that says that a shorter school week hurts students academically and because my work-life balance has improved, I support a four day work week.

Allows for better organization of time and tasks and also supports balance of home and work. Days do feel longer but Fridays off are very needed especially at this time as people are going through a great deal of emotional healing.

I'm able to complete job duties and expectation while maintaining access to my children and their schedules.

I have more time to work on my studies and spend time with my family.

The 4 days are way more efficient since the Friday is not necessarily an option.

AS a coach and teacher we do not have to have subs for many of our games.

Having Fridays available for personal time helps me to no longer have to take a day off for necessary appointments.

I am able to see students and complete my documentation within the 4 days.

I've completed this survey once but I have more to say.

COVID has been heartbreaking and lifechanging in many ways for many people. But it has also given us time to reassess our lives. We have found out that many jobs can completed in fewer days, not fewer hours but fewer days. Historically, teachers have always worked many more hours than those which they are contracted. And we will continue to do that even with a four-day week. But having a better work-life balance is something I welcome. It has improved my motivation. I fear that if we return to a five-day work week, we will lose many of the qualified, dedicated, quality personnel we gained when we went to a four-day work week.

Employees everywhere have reevaluated their priorities and are rearranging their lives to address their priorities. This is not going to change and ignoring the impact of going back to a five-day work day, in my opinion, will likely result in a step backwards for education in Socorro.


It took an adjustment. I had to adjust my time management with my work load to fit it into a 4 day week.

#### Please explain:

The students who also have classes at the end of the day have a hard time focusing on doing the work.

It isnt providing the diversification we were hoping for, and its adversely affecting outcomes during regular instruction. While I personally enjoy it, I do not feel it is best for students.

It does not seem developmentally appropriate especially for the younger grades. This schedule seems to be made for staff with no thought for the students.

There is not enough time for the students to learn, especially with the recent gaps. 156 days of school makes no sense when our students are already last in the nation. Surely there must be a better way to make school work. Maybe more total school days. Curriculum resources are generally based on a five day week. Attendance this year has been poor.

The students lost a whole day of instruction of the subjects they learn in spite of having longer day because each subject still 50 minutes daily

most students are falling behind

I believe most students appreciate the schedule. However, some of them benefit and look forward to getting away from home and their situations. Many of our students have challenges they face at home and look forward to coming to school where it is a safe space for them.

Any kid would like an extra day off from school.

I think kiddos should go to school 5 days a week, especially all of the academic in class learning lost over the past 2 years due to the pandemic.

Students seem rested, motivated, and less stressed.



I also love having full days of Professional Development time for the teachers. They need to time for training, collaboration, and implementation.
