

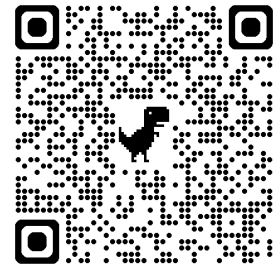
Bengal Regiment Parent Checklist 2026

Due May 23rd**

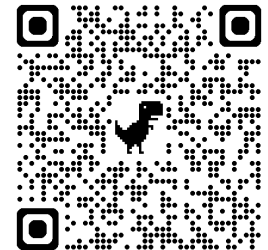
This confirms you have read and agree to all policies in the handbook and will be fully participating in the Bengal Regiment. This is not an “interest” form, do not fill this out unless you are going to complete the season and all of its obligations.



Students who submit information after May 23rd, but before August 10th, are still welcome to be part of the band, but will be added to the show at an appropriate point (ex. after the first movement, etc...)

2. Pre-Arranged Summer Absence Google Form (electronic)

Please use this form for any summer and in season absences that are already known. This will help start a conversation around excusing the absence. Filling this form does not guarantee excusal.



3. Review the Marching Band Calendar and ensure all dates are on your family calendar

4. Emergency and Travel Forms (electronic) look for a future email regarding these forms, no action is currently needed

5. Make deposit payment by June 12th

Lakewood High School Bengal Regiment Band Handbook



The handbook has been designed to help answer your questions and understand policies. When you have questions, start here. This document can be found in the Bengal Regiment Google Classroom.

All students/parents/guardians are responsible for being familiar with the complete handbook and will be held to the policies contained within it.

Attendance Overview

Marching band is an activity unlike most others in that each student plays a unique and irreplaceable role within the custom design of the show. This requires accurate numbers and balanced sections. Because of this, it is imperative that all students adhere to the attendance policy outlined below and all policies documented in the band handbook. This is a co-curricular course, meaning all scheduled events/rehearsals/sectionals are required for earning credit.

Summarized Attendance Expectations

- Review both the Attendance Policy and the band schedule carefully in order to avoid unnecessary conflicts.
- Give as much notice as possible (a few months isn't too much!) for anticipated absences by using the absence form and speaking with Mr. Melaragno or Mr. Jankowski.
- Schedule work, social activities, and appointments around rehearsals and performances. We practice less than any other in-season activity, therefore, everyone must be at every rehearsal, with all materials, ready to get work done.
- Be proactive in planning for homework, projects, and any other responsibilities that arise during the season. Every student has them!
- Our band program is year-round for all brass, woodwind, and percussion students. Participation in the assigned large ensemble (band and/or orchestra) is required in order to join the marching band. Colorguard students have the option of performing as part of the extra-curricular Winter Guard program, typically running December-April. This is strongly encouraged to continue growth.

Full Attendance Policy

Students are required to attend all scheduled sectionals, masterclasses, clinics, rehearsals, and performances. Plan ahead and avoid scheduling vacations or major medical work on or right before performance dates. Every student's success relies on this high level of accountability. Band is the ultimate group project! All unexcused absences will result in a lowering of grade.

Absences for required LHS academic or athletic events must be excused on a case-by-case basis. Students involved in these events are expected to contact Mr. Melaragno at least one week ahead of an absence to get approval. Students who anticipate recurring conflicts with LHS activities should consult Mr. Melaragno to work out a schedule that allows them to participate in both.

If there is to be an absence for a non-school affiliated event, students are expected to fill out the pre-arranged absence form with no less than a week's notice for consideration. Approval for such absences may be granted on a case-by-case basis at the Director's discretion. Absences for non-emergencies will be considered unexcused unless pre-approved.

Homework, work, babysitting, social events, and similar conflicts will not be excused. **PLAN AHEAD.** Students with jobs will be expected to be at all rehearsals: inform your employer accordingly. If the student has one unexcused or two excused absences from rehearsals within a one-week period, they may not be allowed to perform, as an unprepared performer can be a safety issue. Students who are absent from the rehearsal before a performance will not be able to perform in that show.

Reporting & Approval of Absences

- All absences from rehearsals must be reported directly to Mr. Melaragno and to the school attendance line. Marching band is a class and attendance is recorded as such. If it is an emergency he can be reached by e-mail at Bryce.Melaragno@jeffco.k12.co.us. If it is pre-arranged, make sure it is entered into the pre-arranged absence form. Also, notify the Section Leader. Notifying does not automatically excuse the absence.
- Guard/Percussion must also notify the student's Captain Head. Kathy Marvin for percussion. Marisa Wagner for guard in case of any rehearsal absences.
- If a student has one unexcused absence or two excused absences within a one-week period, they may not be allowed to perform, as an unprepared performer can be a safety issue. This hurts the entire ensemble as we rely on every member to do their part.
- Students who miss the rehearsal before a performance will not be able to perform at the game/competition. Students will still be expected to attend the performance and help get on/off the field and will stand on the sideline.
- An unexcused absence may be either an absence for reasons not approved by the Directors or an absence for which the student fails to give prior notification to the director. Please note that work, babysitting, homework, and social events will not be excused during the school year.

Summer Rehearsal Attendance

- Summer absences are expected as we respect family, camps, or other obligations that cannot be adjusted to our schedule.
- Work, babysitting, social events, and similar activities are not excused.
- Students should submit the pre-arranged absence form for expected absences from summer rehearsals.

School Year Rehearsal and Performance Attendance

- Students are required to attend all sectionals, rehearsals, and performances.
- Absences for required LHS academic or athletic activities must be negotiated on a case-by-case basis. Students involved in these activities are expected to notify Mr. Melaragno of any such conflicts as soon as they are known. Students who anticipate recurring conflicts with these activities should consult Mr. Melaragno to work out a schedule that allows them to participate in both. We support your being in all the things you want, but please communicate.
- In the event of rehearsal absences for events or activities not included above students and/or parents should contact Mr. Melaragno as early as possible. Approval for such absences may be granted on a case-by-case basis at the director's discretion. Absences for non-emergency events/activities will be considered unexcused unless pre-approved.
- In the event of serious illness or emergency situations, Mr. Melaragno should be notified as soon as possible after the situation has been dealt with.
- Medical, dental, and orthodontic appointments of a non-emergency nature should be scheduled around rehearsals and performances.
- Homework, work, babysitting, social events, and similar conflicts will not be excused for any reason.

Attendance Consequences

- In the event of unexcused absences, the following series of actions will be taken:
 - All unexcused absences will result in a lowering of work habits or performance grades.
 - Students may not be allowed to perform until they can demonstrate that they are caught up; absences endanger the safety of all performers.
 - Excessive Absences will result in the student being dismissed from the program, forfeiture of fees, and a withdrawal from the course with a failing grade

Communication

Our season is busy and requires a large amount of logistical coordination, parent engagement, and student accountability. We try very hard to help students and parents stay informed, so please take the time to read any and all communications. We will utilize the following ways to communicate with students and families:

- A weekly newsletter is distributed through Google Classroom, and CutTime.
- Remind will be used for shorter as needed notifications for both parents and students
- Students and parents are responsible for knowing the calendar on the website and newsletter.
- CutTime software will manage financials, inventory, calendar, and more. Please make sure students and families can login and do so on a regular basis.

Financial Policies

All families must sign the online commitment agreement that includes a commitment to the fee schedule and an opportunity to request confidential financial assistance. Statements will go out periodically by email, please make sure you are up to date, as the band will have to cut programs if funds are not available. Financial help is available based on need, please indicate need on the contract for consideration.

Financial Expectations

- Payments are to be made on a schedule outlined in the Band Handbook by recurring Credit Card payment, check/check cash or paid in full.
- All families can offset their fees by using fundraising (peaches, discount cards). Many families never pay a cent for band because of active fundraising.
- If a family is in a financial hardship situation, financial assistance can be requested by contacting lpactreasurerCO@gmail.com.
- No student will be excluded from the co-curricular program because of financial hardship if a financial agreement is put in place. Communication is key!
- Optional trips or extra-curricular opportunities are available to students enrolled in the program as per the agreement, who do not have arrears, and must be fully funded by the family through payments or fundraising.

Bengal Regiment Cost and Payment Plan

- The Cost for Bengal Regiment 2025 will be \$550.
 - i. \$500 per student will be paid to LPAC
 - 1. Covers the cost of additional staff members, meals, show design, uniforms, and equipment.
 - ii. \$50 will be paid at LHS registration through infinite campus school fees
 - iii. Students are responsible for purchasing their marching shoes (dinkles) - typically \$45
 - iv. Potential Jeffco Activity Fee (new for 2026 - more information to come)
- Payment Schedule
 - i. June 1 - \$125 (non-refundable deposit)
 - ii. July 1 - \$125
 - iii. August 1 - \$125
 - iv. September 1 - \$125
- Payment Options
 - i. Zelle bank transfers (PREFERRED) - use email address lpactreasurerco@gmail.com
 - ii. Credit Payment thru Cuttime
 - iii. Check – Payable to LPAC and placed in the black box in the music office
 - iv. Cash

- Families in need of assistance should contact Mr. Melaragno ASAP to work out a payment plan, and to discuss fundraising or scholarship opportunities. Such requests are kept confidential.

Fundraising Opportunities (Family Funds)

- Family Funds – Individual “Family Funds” accounts are automatically set up for each student in CutTime by the boosters. This account may be used by the student for band fees, uniform needs, and trip costs. Accounts are funded by payments into the account and/or money earned by participating in fundraisers. During the year, fundraising opportunities are provided for the student to earn money for his/her account.
- Palisade Peach Fundraiser (June/July) – Portion of proceeds go to LPAC General Fund to help run program, portion of proceeds goes into student’s Family Funds
- Butterbraids (Typically January/February)

Fundraising Opportunities (LPAC General Program Fundraisers)

- King Soopers Cards
- Lakewood Fundraising Campaign (August) - Funds raised help offset costs for the entire music program

Bingo

- Slammer’s Bingo (Jewell and Wadsworth)
 - i. This is our most profitable fundraiser and is incredibly important to the overall success of our program and the opportunities we can provide!
 - ii. Every Thursday – 6:30-9:30pm
 - iii. We ask that all Marching Band students work three bingos over the summer and then volunteer again once the season is complete to cover concert season bingos. CHOOSE 3 BINGOS FOR THE SUMMER!
 - iv. We need parents too! Adults who can help monitor different areas of the bingo hall – cashier, bookkeeping, caller, etc.

School and Classroom Policies

Locker Policy

The LHS Band Program is able to provide currently enrolled students with a storage space for materials related to courses. Using this space appropriately protects personal and school property. Proper use of storage is necessary to keep the Band Room clean.

- Lockers are only used to store items related to the student’s participation in our classes. Examples include instruments, binders, pencils, and clothes for marching band. No Food!
- Any materials that are not related to the student’s participation in instrumental music classes can be confiscated and turned into building administration.
- Lockers are to remain closed and locked when not in use. Doors left open invite theft and other problems. Items may be confiscated if left unsecured. You will be charged for lost locks.

Discipline Policy

Students who violate school policies will be subject to the school discipline process. Band policies go above and beyond the school policies and carry their own program specific consequences.

Band specific discipline may include the following: Verbal warning to the student, deduction in work habits grade, school referral, parent contact. Depending on the severity of the offense, the Directors

reserve the right to remove any student from the program (W/F on grade report card) due to disciplinary issues.

Instrument Rentals and Insurance Policy

Students are expected to provide their own quality, working instruments, except for the larger or more exotic instruments such as percussion, tuba, baritones, bassoons, oboes, bass clarinets, etc. Lakewood HS will charge the students a \$62.50 per semester per instrument rental fee for the use of a school instrument. Please make sure this fee is on a separate check and payable to Lakewood High School. This fee will be placed on Students Campus accounts at the beginning of the school year.

Woodwind/Brass must provide their own reeds, mouthpieces, oil, etc. Percussion must provide their own basic implements for concert season.. Ask Mr. Melaragno for a required list.

Students/parents are required to sign a liability form for the school instrument they have been assigned. Loss or damage of school property will be at the student's expense. Parents, please make sure your homeowners insurance covers your student's instrument. Unfortunately, with the large number of students involved in this type of activity, accidents can happen. Carrying insurance on your student's instrument may help if an accident occurs.

Student Release Policy – Picking up your student after a performance

Occasionally parents may wish to take their child directly following a performance. This must be handled in writing or in person. When picking up a student at the competition site, the parent must sign out with the bus chaperone (Melaragno/Jankowski). If the student is leaving with another adult, they must provide a note signed by their parent/guardian, before the student is released. No student will be allowed to leave a site with anyone other than his/her parent, without written permission from their parent/guardian. Adults will be asked for identification if the chaperone is not familiar with them. These requirements are in place to protect your student. The student is also responsible for finding another student to unload anything they were responsible for when returning to the school.

Uniform Policy

The LHS Band Uniform and any apparel bearing the Bengal Regiment logo are a great source of pride for the band. Your actions while in band gear, reflect upon our band, school, and those who came before you.

- The uniform is either on or off...never in-between (unless specified by staff to be in "half dress"). No unzipped jackets, folded over pants...The uniform will be worn properly at all times.
- The uniform consists of black bib pants, jacket, black Dinkles (shoes), tall black socks, uniform gloves, gauntlets, shako with plume (hat), show t-shirt, and thin athletic shorts under bibs.
- Uniforms remain at LHS in band hall closets when not in use. Leadership Team will check in/out.
- When in uniform: No PDA, no eating, no swearing, no running (unless told to do so by staff)
- No baseball hats, tennis shoes, bright nail polish, jewelry, etc. while in full uniform.
- Students with hair that extends below the collar of the jacket must have their hair appropriately put up with hairpins, ties, etc., while in uniform. Facial hair must be neat or clean shaven.
- The Guard will wear warm-ups as part of the "uniform" during the season and appropriate undergarments (based on the uniform design)
- All pieces are assigned and numbered. Students will be charged full replacement cost for any uniform materials that are lost or damaged.

Physical Guidelines Policy

It is part of the curriculum of the marching band to develop and maintain a certain level of athletic coordination and conditioning that in turn is part of the program for competitions. With this understood, there are several guidelines the staff and students must be aware of and follow.

- All students and parents are aware that physical conditioning, training, and endurance are an integral part of the skill sets required for the success of the marching programs.
- Students who have medical issues should have their doctor's permission to participate in any marching program. In addition, the student and or parent should discuss the situation with the directors before any rehearsals.
- If an emergency does occur there will be a designated adult to provide support to students and/or staff to make the appropriate decisions regarding what is best for the student. There will be an established procedure for this person to administer the appropriate steps to alleviate the emergency and then to contact the appropriate authorities and/or parents, and/ or Director.

Students should wear comfortable clothing to all rehearsals. T-shirts/sweatshirts, shorts/sweats, socks, and athletic shoes are the most acceptable attire. Shirts must be worn at all times. Jeans and sandals are not acceptable. Please check weather reports in the morning/evening and plan your attire accordingly, we will rarely cancel for inclement weather. When after school rehearsals begin, you must bring proper attire to change into your school clothes for the day if they do not fit the requirements for rehearsal.

Rehearsal Expectations for Students

- Each student is expected to be early to all events. If you are on time, you are late!
- Each student is expected to have all materials (instrument/equipment, music, dot book, pencil, water jug, and anything else the directors ask) ready prior to starting all rehearsals/performances.
- Students are expected to show respect to whomever is running rehearsal, whether it be the Director, staff, drum major, or a guest of the band.
- There are 3 places your instrument should be: In your hands, "stacked" in your section, or in your band locker.
- Cell phones are to be in "airplane mode" during rehearsal or left in your bag on the sideline.
- When on the field, it's all business. Do not speak unless asked. Focus all your attention on improvement. Do your best and you'll reach excellence.

Code of Conduct

- All school rules and policies are in effect at all band functions.
- All members are responsible for keeping our spaces clean and organized.
- If you don't wish to explain it to your parents, Director, or a Principal...Do Not Do It.
- Profanity, hazing, or destructive activity is unacceptable in our program.
- Any band member possessing or using any controlled substances, during any band function is subject to referral to school authorities, and if applicable, the local law enforcement agency.
- Sexual harassment of any form will not be tolerated. This includes all unwanted sexual attention or the creation of an intimidating or offensive environment. Harassment *can* include Sexual jokes, Pressures for dates/sex, demeaning comments, touching, threats, demands.
 - *NOTE: Please respect people's personal space because it differs for everyone.* If you feel you have been harassed, contact the directors so the appropriate action can be taken.
- NEVER WALK ALONE at any band function, members must move in a group (at least 3).
- Always be a respectful, attentive, and positive audience for other performing groups.
- Non-band members are not allowed to sit with the band while at any performance venue.

- When the Bengal Regiment “falls in” to move, there is absolutely no talking. We are observed by the public/other bands, and our traditions demand that you always exhibit the highest level of personal and ensemble discipline. You are “performing” whenever you are in public wearing our uniform or anything featuring the Bengal Regiment logo whether you are getting off the bus, marching to the stadium, or on break.

Band Camp and Rehearsal General Information

Daily Required Supplies

Your student will need:

- An insulated half-gallon (or larger) water jug
- Sunscreen - SPF 30 or higher
- Shorts, light colored t-shirts, and athletic shoes. Students will not be allowed onto the field in sandals. In the fall, kids will need layers of clothes to keep them warm as the weather cools.
- Hat and sunglasses to protect them from the sun
- Pencil(s) to make rehearsal markings
- Brass/Woodwind/Percussion students are also required to have a binder with page protectors for music and handouts

The Staff and Leadership Team will help remind students of all the materials that they need.

A Word of Warning

Rehearsals, especially the early days, can seem a lot like boot camp. Training exercises for flexibility/cardio help students get physically ready for the demands of the activity. For some students it is a very intense experience that can leave them feeling frustrated. How you handle this is based on your parenting style and your child’s personality. Try not to blow off your child’s concerns but try to keep in mind there are some valuable life lessons to be learned about working with others. Talk to them, support them, and encourage them to hang in there. Before you make any final decisions, talk to the directors and an experienced band parent. We can offer insight and suggestions on how to get past this hurdle, we’ve all been there!

Drop off Times

On time is late. The students must be in their designated practice space with their instrument/equipment, ready to go by the time rehearsal starts. Please plan on having your student at the site at least 15 minutes before the start of rehearsal. Earlier is even better. The Leadership Team will be at rehearsals 30 minutes prior to help individuals take advantage of this. Occasionally, a section will have an earlier than usual start. Your child should know about this in advance and keep you informed. It helps to keep checking in with your child because they get busy and they do forget.

Pick up Times

If practice ends at 7:00pm, the band still needs to put gear away. Some sections have a brief section meeting right after practice, and members of the front ensemble need to move their equipment from the field to the band room and put it away. Do not be surprised if 7:00pm is really 7:15pm. This is consistent throughout the season and rarely do practices end early. Please make sure to pick up your student no later than half an hour after the determined end time. Directors are responsible for students until they get picked up and are required to stay at the school until every student is back with their parents. We appreciate your attention to this so that directors can get home to their outside of school responsibilities.

Evening Rehearsals

You are welcome to stop by our evening rehearsals and see the progress of the band. You will watch the show evolve and sit in awe of your child's accomplishments! There is something really great about being part of the growth with the students. Remember to keep the noise down so you don't distract the student's work. A final run through normally happens the last 15 minutes of rehearsal.

Safety/Health Information

ALL students are required to have a Medical Acknowledgement Form, Travel Authorization, and Commitment Contract/Handbook Acknowledgement on file EVERY YEAR. The digital forms will be sent out as soon as they are available. We require these forms before we can administer any medication to your student. In case of emergency, these forms greatly assist the Nurse/Doctor in making the correct diagnosis or in administering effective medication. Medical services will be provided by our medical personnel and on an emergency basis, at a local hospital. Parents will be notified immediately if any major injury or illness is sustained by their child.

Our biggest and most troublesome problem at band camp can be sunburn. Some students could even develop second-degree burns from being out in the sun with little to no protection. We suggest a sunblock of SPF 30. Any lower number, you're at your own risk! Students are also encouraged to wear appropriate summer clothing – we are outside and it is HOT! Bring layers and be prepared for anything.

Instructional Staff

A complete staff of background-checked, qualified instructors have been contracted for our season. They are experienced band personnel, who will assist in field and music instruction. They will become your student's biggest supporters and help them to achieve excellence!

*** ALL SCHOOL RULES and BAND CODE OF CONDUCT APPLY ***

The Top 9 Tips for Students

1. ALWAYS be on time, which really means 10-15 minutes early.
2. Have a positive attitude, even when it's tough.
3. Show respect to everyone! Peers, student leaders, staff, parents, bus drivers, directors, etc...
Don't expect to know everything the first day (or ever). Everyone has something to learn.
4. Always have all your materials close enough that you can get them quickly.
5. Keep up on your schoolwork. Take every opportunity to do your homework. On the bus, extra time given in class, at appointments — do whatever it takes. Be as productive as possible.
6. Be comfortable with being called out. It's how we improve, and the intent isn't negative.
7. Trust the staff and directors. They want you to succeed and know how to help you get there.
8. When in doubt, stop talking. You'll be amazed at what you can learn if you listen.
9. You may want to give up sometimes. DON'T!

The Top 6 Tips for Parent/Guardians

1. Your student is more capable than you realize.

Even if you have all the time in the world, you will start to feel like a personal servant if you don't ask your kids to take some responsibility for their own stuff. Your student can fill a water jug and prep their 'gear'. If you are so inclined, help them create checklists and schedules.

2. Get out of the car and come join us.

Friends and Family are welcome to attend our evening and Saturday rehearsals. Frequently, there are parents working on projects or hanging out. It is a great time to make introductions. (Look for parents in band gear, they can point you in the right direction.) Park the car and come to the field. The last 15-20 minutes of practice will typically be a run through of what the kids have learned so far. Watching the evolution of the band and the kids is really inspiring. Join the welcoming crowd to see what all the excitement is about! The kids love the encouragement from an enthusiastic audience!

3. Program Directors are people, too.

The Bengal Regiment Directors care deeply for the success of the students and program. They work long hours and their main focus is *your kids*. If you have a specific concern about your child and the band program, set up a time to discuss it. If you need general information, try a fellow parent first and encourage students to ask the Leadership Team first.

On another note: Band requires dedication/discipline, this is a good thing! The job of the staff is to help your student excel. When mistakes are made, especially due to inattention or lack of effort, there are consequences. Relax and allow the process to work...Encourage your student to do their best, listen, and work hard. Everyone wants your child to be successful.

4. *We can't do it without you—volunteer and come to the booster meetings.*

You will be asked to commit time, energy, donations, and the band fees to the band program. The LHS Bands must have parent volunteers for the programs to run smoothly, and it is the best way to get to know others. Plan to attend as many events as you can so that you can get updates from the Boosters and Directors. About volunteering ... no experience is necessary and doing so helps keep YOUR band fees down. Sometimes the parents have more fun than the kids!

5. *Join CutTime, Remind, and READ YOUR EMAIL.*

This could be said 1,000 times and still not be said enough. Check your email often, especially on Monday mornings. Sign your student up too, share calendars. Be organized.

6. *Yes, it's worth it!*

All of the rides, lessons, time, and effort that you put into it will be worth it. You may not be able to appreciate that in the beginning. Your student may get discouraged at first. There is a lot of repetition, cold/hot days, and sometimes disappointment. Then the show starts to come together and everything changes. There is a new energy, a new excitement. Most kids LOVE band after the first year so get them to honor their commitment. It will be worth it!!
