THE ROMAN EMPIRE

In class you will create with your group a column that commemorates the given period of growth in the Roman Empire. Your teacher will assign your group one of the following.

- Rome's Conquest of the Italian Peninsula, 509-264 BCE
- Overseas expansion during the Punic Wars, 264-146 BCE
- Expansion during the final years of the Republic, 145 to 44 BCE
- Rome becomes an Empire 44 BCE to 14 CE

Once assigned follow these steps:



Step 1: Each member of the group takes turns reading their given section of Chapter 34 taking notes along the way.

Step 2: As a group choose 4 main events or important information that led up to that specific conquest and assign each person an event.

Step 3: Each person is given one sheet of paper. The section of the column will be designed vertically and at the bottom will be a simple description of the event.

Step 4: Illustrate your column. Above each inscription each group member will sketch a design to represent their column piece.

Step 5: Assemble the column. Put the events in order and glue together your column vertically. When complete, your teacher will give you the top of the Roman Column (this will need to be cut out), and another sheet of paper that will be glued horizontally at the bottom. On this sheet you will write your given topic.
