 - Classroom activities, assignments, projects, work rubrics, quizzes, and test
- Grade percentages will be: (work is graded on academic level not grade level)
 - Test & projects = 50%
 - \circ Quiz = 25%
 - \circ Classwork = 20%
 - Homework = 5% (students will have 1 homework assignment a week)
- Semester grades are calculated as follows:
 - o 1st quarter 40%
 - o 2nd quarter 40%
 - Exams (EOC, NCFE, Teacher made) = 20% of semester grade

• Makeup Work - Students will be given five days to complete work missed due to an excused absence.

Attendance

School attendance has a direct effect on student achievement; therefore, your child must be present every day. However, when sickness or another emergency arises, students should email me as soon as they know they will be absent. For the absence to be excused, I will need a note from the parent giving the reason for the absence and these notes are turned in to Mrs. Ray. In the Occupational Course of Study Program students must meet a minimum number of specific work hours before graduation, so they must be careful to not let absenteeism prevent them from earning the appropriate number of hours, thus eventually jeopardizing the ability to graduate with a diploma.

Class Expectations --Students are in training for work in the real world and this classroom is their training station. I act as the employer and grades are the pay. We will review our class and school expectations the first day of school.

- Treat everyone with respect
- Use appropriate school (work) related language and social skills
- Have a positive and cooperative attitude (even when it is hard)
- Be prepared there are NO EXCUSES
- ** Mr. Johnson shared that each classroom must have a location for students cell phones to be placed during class. In our classroom students cell phones are to be placed on front table and left there for the duration of class. Students will not be allowed to carry cell phones to the bathroom. Students are not allowed to accept phone calls or text during class. Students will be allowed to use their cell phones for specific task in class and they can earn free time to use their cell phones at the end of class.

Consequences - the consequences will relate to the offense when possible. As a class, we will discuss the consequences in more detail as a group.

- 1st disruption, offense = verbal warning
- 2nd disruption, offense=verbal warning with a conversation
- 3rd disruption, offense=teacher conference with student & parent
- 4th disruption, offense=office referral

Reinforcement

- Thank you notes to the student and message sent home
- Trip to the Reward Box
- Few minutes of free time at the end of class
