- Is it financially feasible or wise to attend graduate school in the near future?
- Are there family obligations that will be affected by your decision to attend graduate school?
- Will you be able to work while pursuing your graduate studies?

Here are a few of the **best reasons** to attend graduate school<sup>1</sup>:

- A graduate degree is necessary for entry into a chosen field.
- A graduate degree is important for upward mobility and increased earning potential in a chosen profession.
- A graduate degree is necessary to make a wanted career change.
- Passion for the subject.

There are also, of course, lots of **misguided reasons** to choose graduate school, including<sup>1</sup>:

- Uncertainty about the future.
- The economy/job market is bad right now.
- Avoiding financial or other obligations.
- Meeting the expectations of others.
- Making more money.
- The college classroom is warm and welcoming.
