The goal is to eliminate all poor-quality roads by 2024. The district has 1,495 miles of sidewalk to maintain. Work plans consist of roadway resurfacing, alley restoration, sidewalk restoration, and markings.

DDOT uses a rating system (Sidewalk Condition Rating) to determine the types of treatments needed to repair an area and response time. (Excellent, Good, Fair, Poor). Based on that, a certain priority is given to fix it, and accordingly is managed.

Coordinator Role: Review Plans for design and construction within the public ROW to comply with applicable laws, politics, and regulations, and ensure accommodations.

ADA Transition Plan: Ensure the District's public right of way is accessible to all - specifically for sidewalks, crosswalks curb ramps, accessible pedestrian signals, and bus stops, a “living” document that is submitted to the Federal Highway Administration annually, must receive the approval of the Federal Highway Administration, and plan to provide equal transportation network access
