Goals

Our goal at Open Country Horse and Felidae Sanctuary is to improve the quality of life for all horses and felines and thereby improve the lives of people through their human bond with horses. We also aim to improve public awareness and knowledge of the standards of care necessary to keep equines healthy and safe. Our mission and philosophy are reflected in our programs.

Equines have the ability to improve the quality of life, health, and well-being of people with disabilities. Through therapeutic and enjoyable equine activities, humans learn horsemanship that stimulates physical, mental, and emotional growth. Our Barn Buddy program uses the rescued horses to help Disability VA improve their lives through involvement with these horses. Working with horses can also give a therapeutic effect on people struggling with psychological problems.

In our ongoing attempt to establish equine rescue services. It became apparent that the level of equine knowledge and care amongst equine owners often does not measure up to the standard of care necessary to keep a horse healthy and safe. our horse rescue center offers ongoing educational classes and clinics for horse owners and enthusiasts, as well as for our volunteers. Our primary goal is to save the horses. We do rescues at all times, but particularly in times of despair and crisis. Our organization is made up of volunteers with a mission to stop the abuse and slaughter of equine and felidae animals.

Milestones

To end animal cruelty and rescue animals, Horse and Panther rescue has left no stone unturned. Horse and Panther rescue has multiple different programs and sub-organizations focused on the safety of animals. **Such as establishing good animal shelters.**

What they've achieved: In 2021 alone, their [Animal Rehome program](#) has **relocated over 5 animals into new homes.** They've assisted vulnerable animals in 7 cases and saved 4 animals in their homeless and starving



situation across America. On top of rescue and protection, they have fed over 200 stray cats.
