Attended IPC - asks which classes have been cancelled after the deadline. Gregory Anderson said that they are trying to stop cutting classes after the drop date. There is a very extensive process of doing so - Spring 2016 620 sections were offered, and 29 were cancelled, the average number of students enrolled were 8 per class. Average schoolwide is 35. If we kept under-enrolled colleges, it would cost \$150,000 to keep it running. Classes added were \$65,000.

VIII. New Business

a. Armed Forces on Campus Discussion

Rupinder Bajwa / 10 minutes

Rupinder says that this is a 7-8 month process, and there is no reason to panic yet. This is something that Rupinder wants to discuss with the three colleges. Only perspective from about 20 people in the room, so we need to formulate how to get feedback from the entire campus. There are hundreds of options but there are 3 mains ones (Public Safety armed). One is to hire police officers, second option is to look at non-lethal weapons, and the last is to keep it the same. Skyline has made a taskforce already, but Rupinder wants us to wait from surveying and asking. He recommends to wait until he talks to public safety and district staff.

- Andee asks that the discussion is brought up because of mass shootings around campus. She
 asks if we were to have public safety/police on campus if they would only be authorized to
 use their guns on campus or to their discretion.
 - Rupinder says he can't answer, and that he doesn't know if students will be arrested.
- Domi asks why do we need guns on campus.
 - Rupinder says a while back there use to be guns on campus, but the district says that it was a philosophy change.
- Cindy asks if the current public safety officers.
 - They are not sworn in, but the new officers are trained.
- Alondra says that it's very expensive to train a new officer. Stanford does not use tasers because it can have health issues.
- Eli asks if we were to have RWC police on campus, and if that would include different salaries.

Commissioner of Activities Andee Liljegren moves to allocate 5 minutes to this item. Seconded by **Senator Fatin Mustafa**.

Opposed by **Senator Camuel Baldwin, Commissioner of Publicity Tori Sazio, and Commissioner of Public Records Cindy Streitenberger.**

Motion passes with consent of those present.

• Andee says the students have not been trained on what to do in case of a shooter. She says that it will be beneficial to have a training session for students and to add arming public safety. The students should be educated on what to do.

- Joseph says in order to stop a shooting, we would need more officers on campus. He is against guns and believes there will be more violence.
- Cam says that having a police on campus is not a concern because they are here to serve, and that no amount of training will help us because we will end up running and hiding. He says that these officers have been trained and that we should not fear them. We should know what we are exactly scared of.
- Joanna asks if the issues of gun is still relevant.
- Dominique says we should think about this why we would want on campus or why not and bring it to the table and that we should hear from everyone.
- Camuel and Eli say they do not understand why that we fear guns on campus.
- Andee says that although they have different views, we should still discuss as a unity.

Senator Joseph Bass moves to allocate 5 more minutes on this item.

Seconded by **Senator Dominique Franceschi**.

Commissioner of Activities Andee liljegren moves to amend the motion that the extra 5 minutes will be taken from item VIII B.

Seconded by **Senator Joseph Bass**.

Opposed by Senator Ann Amir, Senator Camuel Baldwin, Commissioner of Publicity Tori Sazio, and Commissioner of Finance James Ford.

b. Student Body Fee Resolution
