There is also the possibility of wasting time if there isn't anything pre-planned on the trip. Local events are popular among those interviewed. Even if they are not big into that type of event. This could be a great opportunity for this application to take advantage of.

Molly

Think of the last time you were planning a trip to a new place. What specific tools, apps, websites did you use besides a basic internet search (Googling) to find places to see, cultural events, historical sites and unique places to the location?

- Yelp is the main source rather than random searching.
- Likes that the ratings are built in
- Likes that the information is simple and easy to digest
- No other tools used besides yelp and basic internet searching

- She would waste 25 minutes searching for something to do then not have time to do what she found.
- She would use google and yelp to find to where to go or what to see
