- Pretty much just Pickmentation but for horns
- I blame Mirrin for this
- Introduces a new flag - {pc.hornColor} - it's purely for aesthetic and will appear mostly in the PCs description

Location: Sold anywhere that sells other 'color picker' TFs

Short name: Hornucopia

Long name: H.copia

Description: A bottle of varnish that's constantly changing color, complete with brush. The Xenogen Biotech logo is stamped into the lid.

Tool tip: A varnish created by Xenogen Biotech after the success of their Pickmentation product, this time designed to change the color and material of the user's horns - its particular focus being on metallic or gem-like properties. There's a brush included with a color picker on it, allowing for easy application.

Price: 2000 Credits

Effects

- Change horn color to:
 - [Metal] {Tool tip: Change your horns to look like ornamental metal}
 - Gold, Bronze, Copper, Silver, Platinum, Gunmetal, Steel
 - [Gem] {Tool tip: Change your horns to look like ornamental gemstone}
 - Diamond, Jade, Ruby, Sapphire, Emerald, Topaz, Turquoise, Amethyst, Pearl, Jet, Malachite
 - [Regular] {Tool tip: Just change the color of your horns}
 - Light red, Red, Dark red, Light blue, Aqua, Blue, Dark blue, Ultramarine, Light green, Aquamarine, Green, Dark green, Light yellow, Yellow, Dark yellow, Light orange, Amber, Orange, Dark orange, Light purple, Purple, Dark purple, Light brown, Brown, Dark brown, Black, Grey, White
 - [Natural] {Tool tip: Restore your horns to their natural appearance.}

Consumption Text

[[Metal]/[Gem]/[Regular]:You flick the color picker to your chosen color, swirling the brush around in the bottle of varnish until the color takes.}[[Natural]You flick the color picker to the 'natural' option, swirling the brush around in the bottle of varnish. It starts to take on a thinner consistency, the color leaving it.}

You take out your codex, turning on the camera application and making sure to angle it so you can see your horns properly - you don't want to miss a spot!

Painting the varnish on takes quite a while with how small the brush is, but you're eventually done. You sit back, letting it do it's work.

[[Metal]: As you watch, your horns seem to visibly harden, becoming slightly more angular in appearance. The {gold/bronze/copper/silver/platinum/gunmetal/steel} toned varnish you applied seems to be soaking into your horns too, the color no longer just surface deep. Once you're sure that you're not going to rub anything off, you reach your hand up to touch your horns.

Oh! They're cold!

You were expecting a simple color change, but feeling this, it's almost like your horns have been coated, or maybe even replaced, with an actual metal! Looking at your codex, they're even subtly reflective.

You have {gold/bronze/copper/silver/platinum/gunmetal/steel} horns!!

A check of your codex confirms that it's not <i>quite</i> the same as real metal, though, so you won't have to worry about getting electrocuted any more than usual.}

[[Gem]: As you watch, your horns seem to visibly harden, becoming slightly more smooth in appearance. The

{diamond/jade/ruby/sapphire/emerald/topaz/turquoise/amethyst/pearl/jet/malachite} toned varnish you applied seems to be soaking into your horns too, the color no longer just surface deep. The change is more pronounced than just the color though, your horns seem to be changing in density, even becoming slightly translucent. You were expecting just a color change, but once the transformation stops, a quick touch of your horns confirms that it really is like your horns have been turned completely into gemstone!

You have

{diamond/jade/ruby/sapphire/emerald/topaz/turquoise/amethyst/pearl/jet/malachite} horns!

A check of your codex confirms that it's not <i>quite</i> the same as real gemstone, though, so you won't have to worry about someone trying to saw them off for profit.}

[[Regular]: As you watch, the {light red/red/dark red/light blue/aqua/blue/dark blue/ultramarine/light green/aquamarine/green/dark green/light yellow/yellow/dark yellow/light orange/amber/orange/dark orange/light purple/purple/dark purple/light brown/brown/dark brown/black/grey/white} toned varnish you applied seems to be soaking into your horns, the

color no longer just surface deep. Once you're sure that you're not going to rub anything off, you reach your hand up to touch your horns.

They feel the same as ever - no feeling of sticky or set varnish left on them, and you're satisfied that **you now have {light red/red/dark red/light blue/aqua/blue/dark blue/ultramarine/light green/aquamarine/green/dark green/light yellow/yellow/dark yellow/light orange/amber/orange/dark orange/light purple/purple/dark purple/light brown/brown/dark brown/black/grey/white} horns!**

{[Natural]: As you watch, the unnatural coloration of your horns begins to fade, leaving behind traditional {pc.hornType} horns. After a while, the varnish has completely wicked away, and **your horns are now their natural color and appearance!**}

Appearance blurbs

Metal:

Your horns appear to be crafted from polished {gold/bronze/copper/silver/platinum/gunmetal/steel}, and have a pleasant, reflective shine. {Silly mode:{if {pc.hornColor}=Steel}: You're getting used to comments that they're a little too on the nose.}

Gem:

Your horns appear to be made of cut, shaped and polished {diamond/jade/ruby/sapphire/emerald/topaz/turquoise/amethyst/pearl/jet/malachite}, giving you an almost regal appearance.

Regular:

Your horns are not their typical color, instead being {light red/red/dark red/light blue/aqua/blue/dark blue/ultramarine/light green/aquamarine/green/dark green/light yellow/yellow/dark yellow/light orange/amber/orange/dark orange/light purple/purple/dark purple/light brown/brown/dark brown/black/grey/white}.
