Community Leader:

- Cornell area resident or someone who works in Cornell or surrounding communities and has not received **this** award in the last 5 years (2018 Ginna Young, 2019 Kristine Hemenway, 2020 Ashley Carothers, 2021 Shelley Lee and Pat Sime)
- Has shown community leadership in addition to his/her vocation or employment
- Individual has demonstrated an active interest and significant involvement within the community and has raised the standards of social responsibility. (Seen as a role model)

Volunteer of the Year:

- Cornell area resident or someone who works in Cornell or surrounding communities has not received **this** award in the last 5 years (2018 Scott & Michelle Bowe, 2019 Kathy Swanson, 2020 Natalie Helland, 2021 Ashley Carothers)
- Nomination must be for volunteer work only (non paid time)
- Someone who has made a lasting impact on the community and distinguished themselves through volunteerism in the community going above and beyond their paid profession. They have contributed their talents in helping others through acts of goodwill, without personal gain or monetary compensation.

Legacy Award:

- Cornell area resident or someone who works in Cornell or surrounding communities.
- Never received **this** award before (2018 Andrea Smith, 2019 Jenny Blaisdell, 2020 Eino Martino, 2021 Pat & Julie Kosher)
- Someone who has made an impact on the community **over many years**.
- May be awarded posthumously.

New Venture of the Year Award (can be a business or individual):

- Business, individual or organization that has made an impact on the community **within the last 2 years**.
- Business or individual should be based in or from Cornell area and never have received **this** award before (2018 Moonridge Brew Pub, 2019 Hey Everything, 2020 Stacker Nutrition, 2021 Rocque Ridge Guides and Outfitters).
- Could be a new program or service or event held in Cornell Area.

Civic Organization:

- Based in the Cornell area or makes a significant impact on the Cornell area.
- Never received **this** award before (2018 Cornell American Legion, 2019 Cornell Food Pantry, 2020 Cornell & Lake Holcombe Camaraderie Club & Our Saviors Lutheran Church, 2021 Lake Holcombe Lions Club)
- Non-governmental group, composed mostly of volunteers
- Demonstrate involvement in the community

Business of the Year: (May be divided up to small: 1-25 employees and large businesses: 26+ employees)

- Based in the Cornell area or makes a significant impact on the Cornell area.
- Have not received **this** award in the past 5 years (2018 Northwestern Bank, 2019 Mule-Hide Manufacturing, 2020 JM Screen Printing and Moor LLC, 2021 Sam's Place Diner)
- Demonstrate involvement in the community
