### New Junior Cycle well embedded

### Feedback on Learning

**2017/18**: A group of 6 teachers undertook a pilot project to explore and develop effective feedback strategies.

**2018/19**: A template was created and it is included in the staff handbook.. The group of teachers have continued to develop feedback strategies and are working with a number of classes to develop templates suitable for different subjects. These templates will be used to provide feedback to students to improve learner outcomes. The DEIS team Partnership with Parents' will work with parents to create an awareness of this new feedback initiative.

### 2018/2019 - Assessment strategies in the classroom

A new teaching and learning group has been set up to gather information on assessment strategies in the classroom. The group in consultation with teachers, students and parents will look at the different methods of assessment in our classrooms and the frequency of assessment. A number of strategies will then be implemented over the school year to help us develop successful assessment strategies. This group has commenced work
