CHILD SAFETY

There have been several reports of STOP SIGN RUNNERS around our School Buses across Jefferson County, Kansas. This is a Violation of Kansas Law KSA 8-1556 and endangers children and is punishable by a fine and court costs in excess of \$420.00

Jefferson County Sheriff Department and ALL City Police Departments will stop violators and issue tickets if observed passing a stopped School Bus with lights and Stop Arm activated.

Schools are now installing cameras to take photos and license plates of violators who WILL BE contacted by Law Enforcement.

PLEASE stop and keep our children safe. Kids may not be visible when they step out away from the bus.

SLOW DOWN when in school zones, STOP when you see the bus activate the Stop Sign Arm and Flashing Red Lights.
