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Randy Lautenschlager ...retired art teacher; 66

WESTFORD — Ellwood E. "Randy" Lautenschlager, 66, died Tuesday at the Lahey-Hitchcock Clinic in Burlington. He was the husband of the late Jane F. (Moorehouse) Lautenschlager, who died Dec. 9, 1987.



Born Oct. 24, 1929, in Oshkosh, Wis., he was the son of Alma (Thiele) (Lautenschlager) (Hannes) Farvour of Oshkosh and the late Alex Lautenschlager. He was the stepson of the late Martin Hannes and Harold Farvour, both of Oshkosh.

Mr. Lautenschlager attended Oshkosh High School and received a bachelor's degree in vocational education from Fitchburg State College.

He retired from the U.S. Air Force in 1970. He had previously served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II. He also served with the U.S. Air Force during the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam War, reaching the rank of technical sergeant.



Mr. Lautenschlager taught commercial art at the Greater Lowell Regional Vocational Technical High School for more than 20 years before retiring in 1992.
