"Netiquette" is network etiquette, the do's and don'ts of online communication. Netiquette covers both common courtesy online and the informal "rules of the road" of cyberspace.

The majority of our communication takes place remotely in this course. Our primary means of communication is in the written word. The written language has many advantages: more opportunity for reasoned thought, more ability to go in-depth, and more time to think through an issue before posting a comment. However, written communication also has certain disadvantages, such a lack of face-to-face signaling that occurs through body language, intonation, pausing, facial expressions, and gestures.
