 The Early Childhood Education/Child Associate Teacher Certificate is designed to meet the needs of people planning a career working with young children in early childhood education settings and/or those who are already employed. The certificate is aligned with the Child Development Permit Matrix. Caring for children from birth through school-age, in professional settings outside of the home are the primary focus. Children's growth, early childhood programming and curriculum, as well as working with diverse families are major components of the program.

2. Provide a brief rationale for the program:

This is the first certificate in a sequence of two that will prepare students to apply for their Child Development Permit through the CA Commission on Teacher Credentialing, to work in the field of early childhood education, and to transfer to BS-level programs. These two certificates, together, will replace an existing 24-unit certificate of achievement.
