 academic success. In this class, students will have the opportunity to recover credit for
 graduation. Students will be guided to make up credit through an online program.

 the student gains a sense of belonging in an online educational environment. This
 course is for students who are significantly behind in credit for graduation.

9903A Hope Squad - 1st semester 9903B Hope Squad - 2nd semester

- Grade Levels: 10, 11, 12Credit: Not applicable
- Length: Semester
- Prerequisite: Not applicable
- Corequisite: MUST be in the LHS Hope Squad
- Hope Squad is a class designed to support the work of the LHS Hope Squad, therefore, students must be in the LHS Hope Squad to be eligible for the class.
- Members may take the class for either one semester or both.
- Hope Squad nominations for the freshmen class take place at the beginning of each school year. Freshmen members with room in their schedule may opt to take it 2nd semester. Please contact your School Counselor to make arrangements.

9917 Peer Tutor Intern

- Grade Levels: 10. 11. 12
- Credit: 1.0Length: Year
- Prerequisite: Application, Interview, and Coordinator Approval
- Corequisite: Must be a Peer Tutor
- Peer Tutor Interns support the work of the LHS Peer Tutoring Center. Students must have tutored for a least a semester prior to applying to be a Peer Tutor Intern. Interns will be selected through an application and interview process in order to be eligible for this class.
- This program allows students to support other students and tutors during the school day. Responsibilities include one-on-one tutoring, leading tutor trainings, creating marketing materials for the center, maintaining supplies as well as assisting with

day-to-day operations in the center including matching tutors and tutees, monitoring tutoring sessions, and assisting with post-tutoring reflection forms,

9405 Resource

Credit: 1.0Length: Year

Prerequisite: Individualized Education Program (IEP)

• Corequisite: Not applicable

• Resource is a class in which students receive specially designed instruction as outlined in their Individualized Education Program (IEP).

• This is an elective credit-bearing class.

9408 Tiger Lab (formerly Learning Lab)

• Grade Levels: 9, 10, 11, 12

Credit: 1.0Length: Year

Prerequisite: Tiger Lab Teacher/School Counselor Recommendation

- Corequisite: Not applicable
- Tiger Lab is an environment for students who need more guided support than a traditional independent study hall in order to gain assistance on daily assignments from all of their academic classes.
- This course is designed to provide teacher-guided academic support to help the student develop study skills, manage assignments, and improve their organization.
- This is an elective credit-bearing class on a pass/fail basis.
- This course requires a commitment from the student to utilize the additional support.
- This course requires a current Tiger Lab teacher recommendation or school counselor recommendation.

3031 Math Learning Lab CANCELLED FOR 24-25

- Grade Levels: 10, 11, 12
- Credit: 1.0
- Length: Year
- Prerequisite: Teacher Recommendation
- Corequisite: 3030 Geometry or 3050 Algebra 2
- Student eligibility for this course is based on teacher recommendation. This course is
 designed to support students in Geometry and Algebra 2 courses that would benefit
 from additional time with a math teacher. This is a math focused study hall. Students
 will be able to get individual and small-group instruction from a math teacher on current
 content being covered in their core math class.
- This course does not fulfill one of the four required math courses for graduation.

AM00180 LCSD Ambassador - one semester only AM00182 LCSD Ambassador - both semesters (must also choose AM00180)

- Grade Levels: 12
- Credit: 1.0 per semester this will take up 2 bells per semester
- Length: Year
- Prerequisite: Application, Interview and Coordinator Approval (Spring of year prior)
- Corequisite: Not applicable
- This program allows senior students to travel to other Loveland City School buildings during the school day to assist teachers and staff.
- Students may take this course for either one semester or two. If choosing two semesters, sign up for both AM00180 and AM00182. A full credit is earned each semester.
- This class will take up two bells for each semester taken to allow a longer time period for travel, etc.
- Responsibilities may include mentoring, one-on-one or small group tutoring, tech support, teacher aiding and more.
- This program is particularly ideal for seniors interested pursuing a helping profession.
- Enrollment is based upon requests and the needs of other buildings, as well as student interests. There is not a guarantee of a requested host teacher match.
- Acceptance into this program is not guaranteed until all placements can be confirmed.
- This elective is credit-bearing on a pass/fail basis.
- An application is required (available from Mrs. Aspenwall in Room 322 or in the Office of School Counseling). This course requires that you adhere to rules of attendance, punctuality, dress code, and behavior. Inability to do so will affect the grade earned in this course.

- Grade Levels: 12
- Credit: Determined by number of hours; 1.0 at a minimum this will take up two bells per semester
- Length: Both semester and yearlong options are available
- Prerequisite: Application and Parent/Counselor Approval
- Corequisite: Not applicable

- Senior students may choose to assist an LHS teacher during the school day. This is arranged by the student with the teacher.
- Student aides are available on a limited basis.
- Only seniors are permitted to be aides.
- The application should be obtained by the teacher from the Office of School Counseling.
- Students may be an aide for one term per year only. Any exceptions to this policy must be approved by the principal.
- Participation may impact college admission and athletic eligibility.
- Students may not have a study hall and an Aide bell in the same semester.

EG00013 Early Graduation

- Grade Levels: 12

- Prerequisite: Application and Parent/Counselor Approval

- Students who have completed all graduation requirements of Loveland City School District may be eligible to graduate prior to the anticipated graduation date.
