Digital Media Syllabus

CONTACT INFORMATION:

This course combines visual design, computer applications and business techniques. Students will create, manipulate and use print media, audio recordings, video recordings and websites to communicate information and ideas effectively to multiple audiences. Possible projects include: Photoshop, digital animations, sound bites, movie productions, and digital portfolios. This is a one semester elective course in the middle school Instructional Technology Department.

UNITS OF STUDY

Unit I Don't Move (Static Images)

(4 Weeks)

Students will learn the elements of design and apply the elements when creating static visual output using Photoshop and drawing tools.

<u>Unit II Can You Hear Me Now? (Audio)</u>

(3 Weeks)

Students will learn and apply best practices when creating auditory output.

Unit III Pictures in Motion

(5 Weeks)

Students will learn the best practices of design and apply them when analyzing and creating pictures in motion.

Unit IV Website

(2 Weeks)

Students will learn the design principles for creating websites. They will build a website that integrates text, static images, audio recordings and motion pictures. Artifacts created by the student in Units I-III will be used in their website.

Unit V Final Course Project

(2 Weeks)

Students will incorporate one of the units learned throughout the course and prepare a final project that encompasses what was learned.

THE FOLLOWING ARE FOR SUCCESS IN THIS COURSE:

- I. **Attendance/Tardiness/Discipline**: The IPSD student handbook will be followed and enforced. Attendance is extremely important as new material will be introduced daily.
