

Here's a brief cheat sheet to help you with MySQL commands:

**SELECT:** Retrieve data from one or more tables.

**INSERT:** Insert new records into a table.

**UPDATE:** Modify existing records in a table.

**DELETE:** Delete records from a table.

**CREATE:** Create a new database, table, view, procedure, function, etc.

**ALTER:** Modify the structure of a database, table, or column.

**DROP:** Delete a database, table, view, procedure, function, etc.

**GRANT:** Assign privileges to database users.

**REVOKE:** Remove privileges from database users.

**JOIN:** Combine rows from two or more tables based on a related column.

**INDEX:** Improve query performance by creating an index on a column.

**VIEW:** Create a virtual table based on the result of a query.

**TRIGGER:** Define actions to be performed automatically in response to specific database events.

**PROCEDURE:** Store a series of SQL statements for reuse.

**FUNCTION:** A reusable piece of code that performs a specific task.

**AND, OR:** Logical operators used in WHERE clauses.

**GROUP BY:** Group rows based on one or more columns.

**ORDER BY:** Sort rows based on one or more columns.

**HAVING:** Filter groups in GROUP BY queries.

**LIMIT:** Limit the number of rows returned by a query.
