Memo: Implementation of QuickScreen COVID-19 Visitor Screening Tool

Effective August 30, 2021, all visitors reporting to Cedars International Academy will be screened for respiratory symptoms as a precautionary measure to reduce the spread of COVID-19 within the organization.

Every visitor will be screened before they enter Cedars International Academy through the QuickScreen tool. The link to the QuickScreen tool is below.

The visitor's answers to the self-assessment questions will be documented, and the document will be maintained in a confidential medical file.

A visitor who has assessed themselves as having a **RED** screening result will not be allowed to enter the campus and asked to self-quarantine. The visitor should monitor his or her symptoms and call a doctor or use telemedicine services if concerned about their symptoms.

Please contact the Administrator's Office at (512) 419 – 1551 Ext. 0 if you get a **RED** screening result.

A visitor sent home can return to campus when:

- He or she has had **NO** fever for at least 24 hours without taking medication to reduce fever during that time; AND
- Any respiratory symptoms (cough and shortness of breath) have improved; AND
- At least ten (5 days) have passed since the symptoms began. (Based on updated [CDC guidelines](#))

A visitor may return to campus earlier if a doctor confirms the cause of their fever or other symptoms is not COVID-19 and releases the visitor to return to campus in writing.

A visitor who experiences fever and/or respiratory symptoms while home should not enter the campus. Instead, the visitor should contact his or her immediate Administrator's Office for further direction.

These questions are for new symptoms that a person has not had before and not for chronic medical conditions. We or the school system cannot determine if they are due to allergies or not. That is a medical diagnosis. Recommend that the visitor talk to tele-health or self certifies that these are due to chronic medical conditions that they have.
