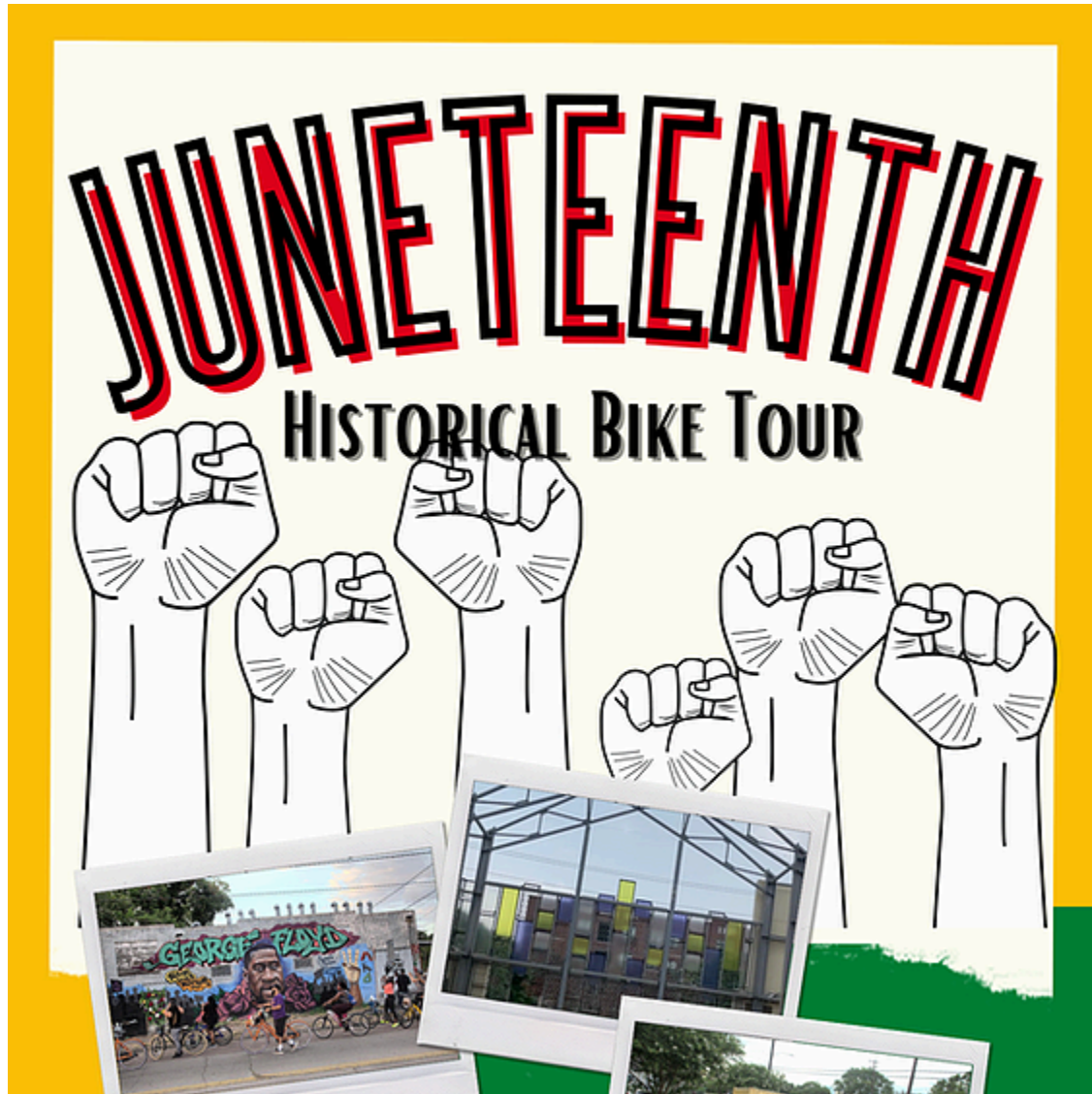

The City of Edinburg – Cultural Arts Division is proud to announce Juneteenth Jubilee. An event dedicated to African American Culture for Juneteenth Celebration Anniversary. This event will take place on June 19th, 2021.

Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration commemorating the ending of slavery in the United States. On June 19, 1865, the Union soldiers landed in Galveston with news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free, according to the Austin History Center. The celebration of June 19 was coined "Juneteenth" and grew with more participation from descendants. On January 1, 1980, Juneteenth became an official state holiday. It's a day to celebrate African American freedom and achievement while encouraging self-development and respect for all cultures. Juneteenth has been celebrated in the City of Edinburg for the past 27 years.

This celebration of prosperity begins with a memorial observation from 9:00 am to 11 am at the Restlawn Cemetery (1701 E. Richardson Road) and is followed directly by a caravan to Betts Elementary (2320 S Cesar Chavez Road) that highlights the Historical Black District. At 7 pm festivities continue at the Edinburg City Hall Courtyard with a plethora of family friendly activities for all to enjoy. Join us in observance, remembrance and celebration of the journey and achievements of the Black Community, not only of the Rio Grande Valley, but that of the entire country as well. We look forward to seeing you here!

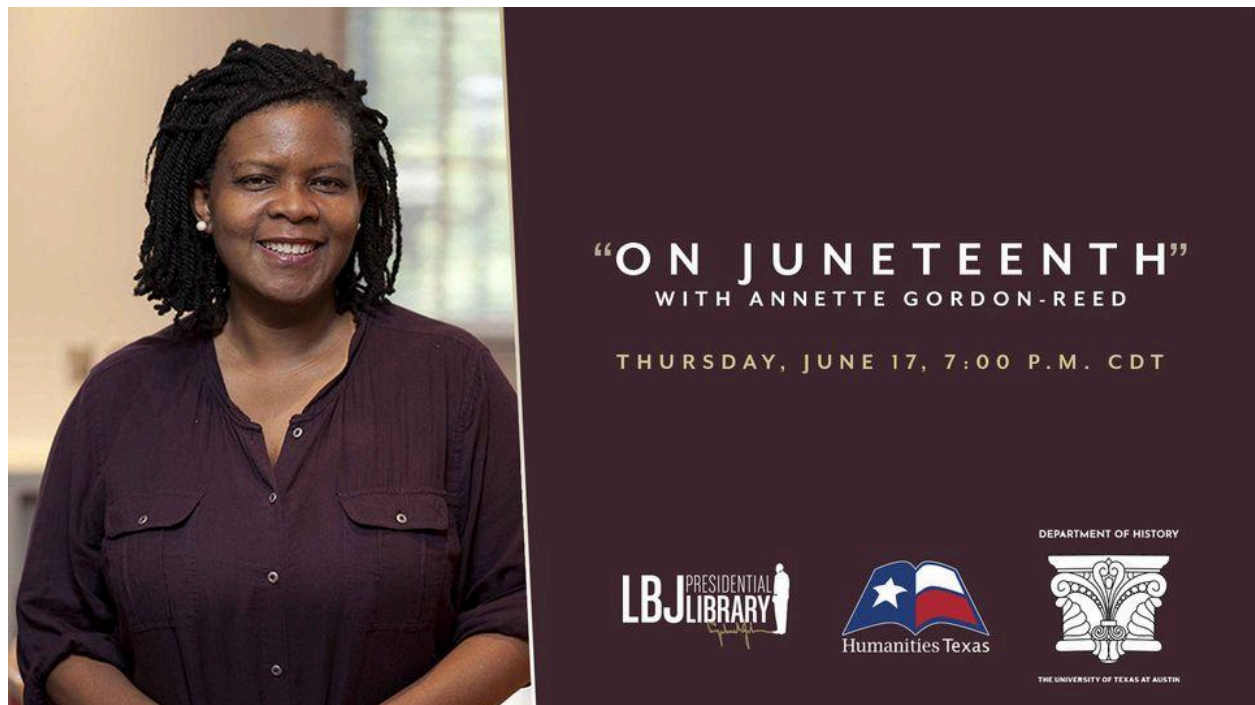

Dr. Daina Ramey Berry, Chair of the History Department at The University of Texas at Austin, will moderate the discussion.

About the speakers:

Annette Gordon-Reed is the Carl M. Loeb University Professor at Harvard University. The author of Pulitzer Prize-winning *The Hemingses of Monticello*, she lives in New York and Cambridge. Gordon-Reed's honors include the National Humanities Medal, a MacArthur "Genius Grant," and the Frederick Douglass Prize.

Daina Ramey Berry is the Oliver H. Radkey Regents Professor of History and Chairperson of the History Department at the University of Texas at Austin. She is also a Fellow of Walter Prescott Webb Chair in History, the George W. Littlefield Professorship in American History, and the former Associate Dean of the Graduate School. She is "a scholar of the enslaved" and a specialist on gender and slavery as well as Black women's history in the United States. Berry is the award-winning author and editor of six books and serves as a consultant for museums and historical societies throughout the United States.

About the Book:

Weaving together American history, a dramatic family chronicle, and searing episodes of memoir, Annette Gordon-Reed's *On Juneteenth* provides a historian's view of the country's long road to Juneteenth, recounting both its origins in Texas and the enormous hardships that African-Americans have endured in the century since, from Reconstruction through Jim Crow and beyond. All too aware of the stories of cowboys, ranchers, and oilmen that have long dominated the lore of the Lone Star State, Gordon-Reed—herself a Texas native and the descendant of enslaved people brought to Texas as early as the 1820s—forges a new and profoundly truthful narrative of her home state, with implications for us all.

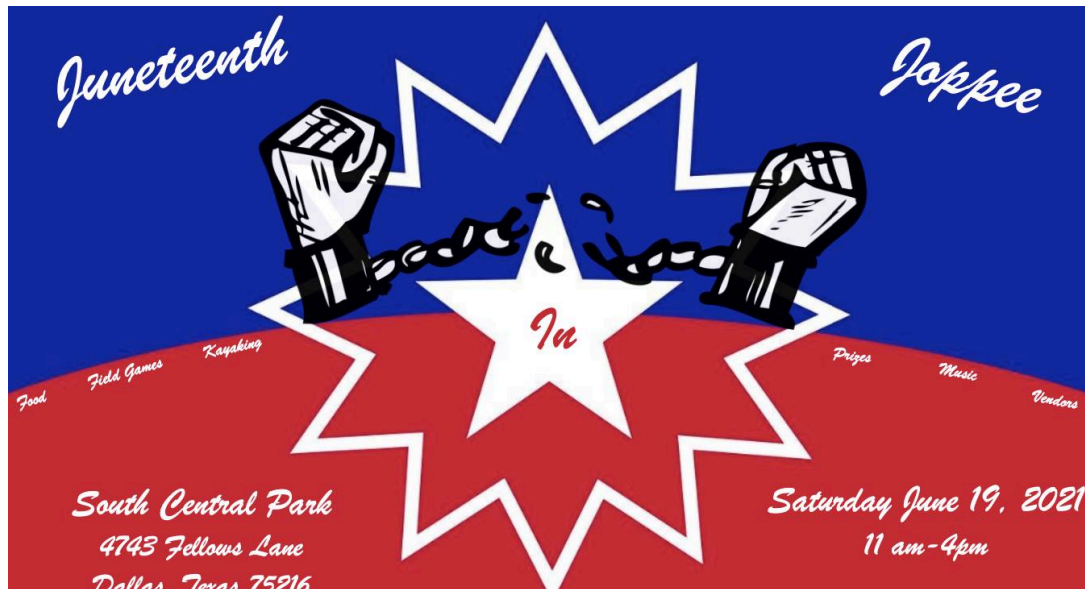

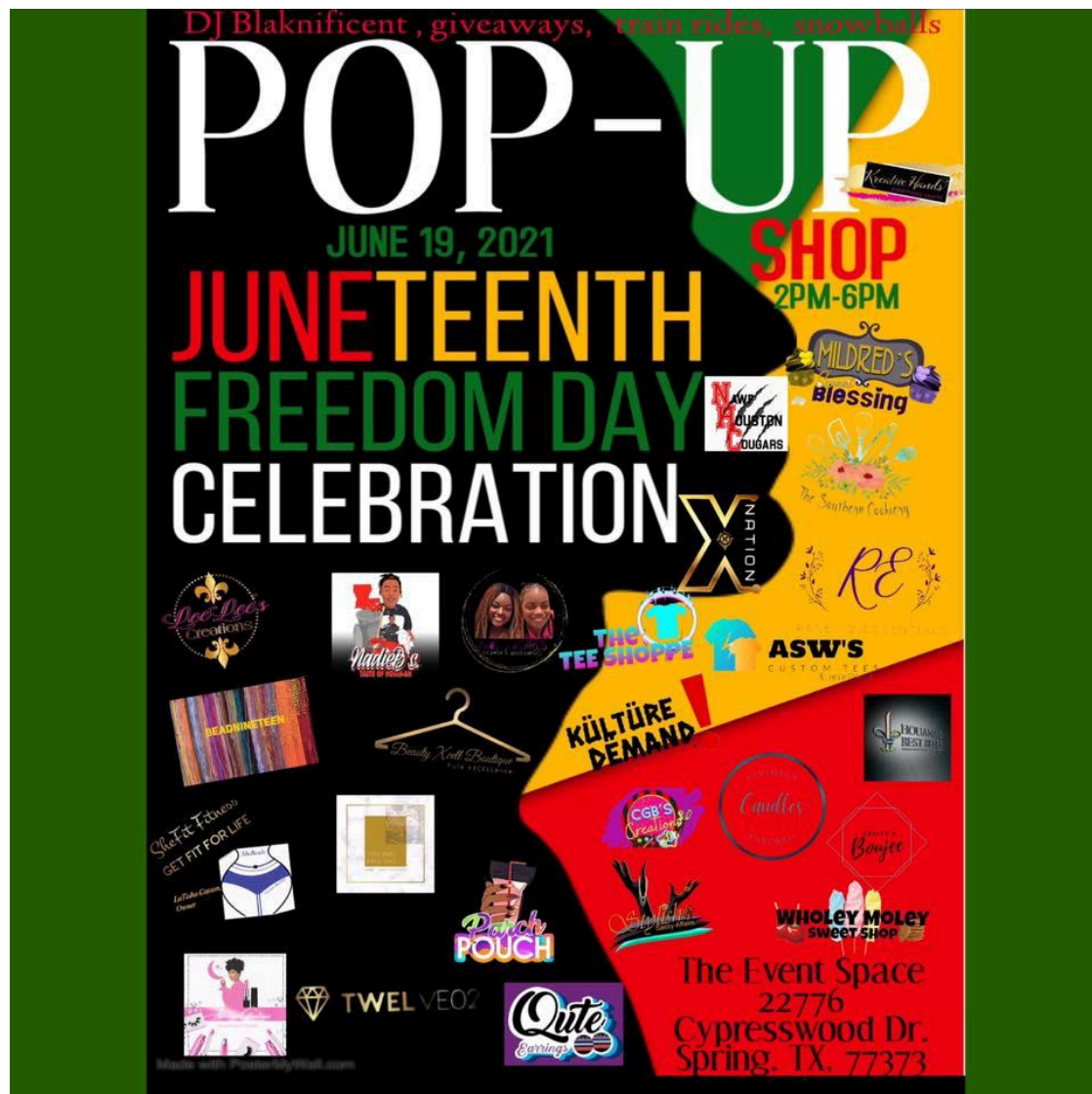
