Tattoos & Piercings - Health & Toxicology

Introduction:

Tattoos and piercings are popular ways to express oneself, but it's important to understand the health aspects involved. This workshop will help you learn about some of the vocabulary related to these practices, as well as think about the potential risks and safety measures from a health and toxicology perspective.

Part 1: Vocabulary Exploration
