

SAMPLE MODERATOR SCRIPT (3/2/2024)

This sample script is for a legislative candidate forum, and it is co-sponsored by the local Chamber of Commerce and assumes a live audience is present and a printed agenda.

Speakers' Opening Comments (to audience prior to going on air or beginning to record):

(League Member)

Hello. I am [Name], President of LWV Anytown.

(Co-Sponsor)

I am [Name], President of the Anytown Chamber of Commerce, co-sponsor of tonight's forum.

(League Member)

Welcome to all of you and thank you for coming. We will start the Candidate Forum in a couple minutes, but before we do, we have a few requests and announcements to make:

We ask that no campaign buttons or campaign attire be worn in this room and that no signs or literature be distributed. Campaign literature is available on a table outside this room. Please remain as quiet as possible while the candidates are speaking so that everyone can hear, and please hold your applause until the end of the forum so that candidates will have the maximum time to respond to your questions.

(Co-Sponsor)

Please silence your electronic devices. It is the League's policy to record and post the entire candidate forum, without editing, so that the public will see the event in its entirety and not just selected scenes or sound bites. Excerpts or edited clips of candidate forums may not be used for partisan or political purposes. This Forum is being recorded by Anytown Community Television and will be available online. The website address appears at the bottom of the agenda. You are welcome to submit as many questions as you would like. Note cards are available for this purpose. Just hold up your cards and ushers will collect them throughout the forum. Please address your questions to all candidates.

(League Member)

Questions that are unclear, hostile, or of a personal nature will not be asked. Those that fall into the same general topic area may be consolidated to allow us to cover as many topics as possible in the allotted time. All questions submitted are the property of LWV Anytown.

Speakers' Opening Comments (live on the air or once recording starts):

(Co-Sponsor)

(League Member)

There is never enough time to cover all the issues. If you feel that your question was not addressed, please contact the candidate directly after the forum. And now I would like to introduce our Moderator, [Name], a certified Moderator from the Sunnyvale League of Women Voters.

(Moderator)

Good evening, everyone. We will start the candidate forum with the opening statements. Each candidate will be given 11/2 minutes for their opening statement and 11/2 minutes for their closing statement. Opening statements will be in alphabetical order, beginning with the candidates running for Legislative District 98A: Rashad Raskin and Saul Spearman, and then 98B: Iona Ireland and Marlena McElroy. The closing statements will be in random order. The order of answering questions will be rotated. Candidates will have 11/2 minutes to respond to the questions.

Please note our timekeepers Connie Yung and Cory Smith who have a 30 second and then a 15 second sign [wait for timekeepers to raise signs and be sure that candidates can see them]. They also have a stop sign or will call "time" to be sure each candidate has the full 11/2 minutes.

(Moderator)

We hope that most if not all the questions will be those submitted by the audience. We also have questions submitted by email to the League of Women Voters of Anytown and to Anytown Chamber of Commerce.

Let's begin with the opening statements. [use first and last name -OR- "Candidate" plus last name. In some cases, just first names are ok. Determine this in advance.]

• Our first question is: why are you running for the state legislature?

- I will now read questions submitted both by the audience here and submitted by email.
- We have time for one last question.
- Candidates will now have 11/2 minutes for their closing statement, to summarize their qualifications and positions.

I would like to remind everyone again that the views expressed in this forum are those of the candidates, not those of the League of Women Voters or the Anytown Chamber of Commerce. Sponsorship of this forum is not an endorsement of any candidate by LWV Anytown or the Anytown Chamber. And now for our closing, [League Member Name].
