The statewide delegation came to engage in the convention processes. These individuals care about our country, state, and future. The convention is history and as we reflect we're keenly aware there is much to do. Our hope at NDGOP is to focus on campaign season as the endorsed candidates require our service and assistance. Our Campaign Committee is mobilizing to work their tails off for Governor candidate Congressman Kelly Armstrong, Congressional candidate Alex Balaz, and all the Republican Statewide candidates.
