World Literature

Literature and Composition

This course focuses on a study of literary genres. Selections from world literature will include poetry,

drama, informational texts, short stories, and novels; our emphasis will be on analysis and comparison. Students will take a deeper look at how events shape literature, and how literature influences change. Students will continue to

develop the understanding that theme is what relates literature to life, and that themes recur in the literary world. Students will also explore the effect of themes regarding interpretation.

Students will also demonstrate competency in a variety of writing genres: narrative, expository, and technical. Students are expected to improve their writing skills; part of this process includes improving their vocabulary.

This course focuses on engaging students in a varied exploration of humanities through the modes of reading, writing, grammar and usage, and speaking and listening. While studying long and short works of fiction and nonfiction, poetry, drama, and the epic, students will think and discuss critically and constructively while becoming familiar with literary elements and techniques. Students will write creative pieces of fiction and poetry in addition to expository papers using a process of writing. These writings will establish knowledge of standard grammar and usage as well as a sense of audience. Students will engage in speaking and exercise listening skills through active discussion and oral presentations.

*Note: Required reading will be disclosed in the first full week of classes.

Daily Routine:

- 1. Be on time to class and seated in your assigned seat before the tardy bell rings.

- 10. Adhere to and honor deadlines. <u>Extended time for assignments will be built into the due date given.</u>
 - a. Note: Completed late work will be accepted, with penalty points deducted (-5) for each day the assignment is late. Incomplete work will not be accepted. If you submit it, it will be returned to you ungraded. Take pride in the work you turn in. Be thorough.

Classroom Expectations:

- NO CELL PHONES ALLOWED for the duration of the class period. Students will be asked to keep cell phones out of sight or turned upside down on their desk. There will be special occasions where students are allowed phones.
- NO SOCIAL MEDIA ALLOWED for the duration of the class period. Students do not have my permission to record my materials, classroom, myself, or any other entity associated with this specific Literature Class.
- 3. NO AIR PODS ALLOWED for the duration of the class period. Students do not need Air Pods or other electronic devices for any activities during class, unless otherwise permitted.
- 4. NO CHARGING DEVICES permitted for the duration of the class period. Students may not use wall outlets to charge cell phones, smart watches, or Air Pods/headphones.
- 5. NO FOOD, CANDY, or DRINKS ALLOWED for the duration of the class period (water is permitted). *If a student has a medical condition, this must be presented to the school Nurse.
- 6. First 15 minutes and Last 15 minutes of class NO STUDENT will be permitted to leave the classroom, for any reason.
- 7. If a student arrives to class tardy, the student is expected to enter the classroom quietly, provide the teacher with their tardy pass and have a seat. Students who disrupt the learning environment will receive consequences. 1) Verbal Warning 2) Teacher-Student Conference 3) Parent Contact 4) Office Referral.
- 8. ALL STUDENTS must remain in their assigned seat for the duration of the class period. Students will not roam the classroom and will not change their seats for any reason.
- NO PASSES students will not be provided any passes to leave the classroom for the Gym, Vending Machine, Main Office, or to "See another teacher". Students are expected to use their 5-minute transition time to handle all their personal needs.
- 10. Profanity, vulgar language, disrespect towards self, peers, or teacher will not be tolerated and will result in parent contact, teacher-student conference, or office referral at the teacher's discretion.

Tardy Policy: Students must be seated/ logged in and ready for class at the scheduled class time. If you are late for class, you will be counted tardy for attendance. I will

adhere to the guidelines in the Student Handbook when disciplining tardies.
