Information about Required Vaccines

Summer is coming! Be sure to get your vaccines scheduled so they are completed before school starts. Please note what is needed for incoming 6th graders.

Vaccines required to enter school (K-12)

Colorado law (Board of Health rule 6 CCR 1009-2) requires all students attending Colorado schools and licensed child care to be vaccinated against certain diseases, unless an exemption is filed.

- Hepatitis B
- Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (DTaP) *
- Inactivated poliovirus (IPV) *
- Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) *
- Varicella (chicken pox) *
- Tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis (Tdap) **

*Students 4 through 6 years of age are required to have their final doses of DTaP, IPV, MMR and Varicella *prior to kindergarten entry*.

**Students are required to have Tdap prior to entry into 6th grade even if under the age of 11. One dose of Tdap is required for 6th through 12th grades.
