

**Toddler Mom**: We offer ideas for sensory play that fit our theme of the month so that even the littlest ones are included! I will provide a sheet to play on to keep things clean and a bin for the sensory play items. All you need to do is provide materials for the sensory play idea of the month, read the story to the children, and supervise their play.

These are usually household items like rice, cereals, dry pasta, paper cut-outs, play-dough, etc. Suggested items will be made known a month in advance for easy planning. You are free to change up the materials if you like!

Everyone loves birthdays and we have a particularly special birthday to celebrate this month! September 8th is the birthday of our beloved Mother in Heaven, the Theotokos! For this month's sensory experience, the children will make birthday cupcakes with cloud dough.


#### Supplies:

- J 2 cups corn starch
- J 1 cup lotion (unscented is best)
- J 1 jar of sprinkles
- J Cup cake liners or cupcake pans
- J Scoops or spoons

#### Instructions:

Knead together the cornstarch, lotion, and jar of sprinkles until the desired consistency is achieved. You will know it is ready when the dough still looks "powdery," but when you squeeze a small amount in your hand, it holds its shape. Add more lotion if the mixture is too dry; Add more cornstarch if it becomes too sticky.

Cover your play surface or take your materials outside. Place the "batter" in front of the children in a bowl along with their spoons, scoops, and cupcake containers. Talk to them about birthdays and perhaps even sing happy birthday to the Theotokos as you play. Sit alongside them as they enjoy this wonderful new texture!





# **Crafting a Scripture Journal**

## **Supplies Needed:**

A folder or narrow 3-ring binder for each student

Markers, construction paper, wrapping paper, stickers, jewels and craft glue, anything the students might use to decorate their new Scripture journal.
