inside your cabin, there is a little slot on the wall. It looks like this:

That little thing the red arrow is pointing to is a feature on many ships. The electricity in your cabin will not work (or not long) if nothing is in that slot. It is intended that you put your keycard in it when you are in the cabin and take your keycard out when you leave the cabin so you do not waste electricity. However, you can use about any card (business card, credit card, do not disturb card, etc or even your keycard).

Another thing to know is that you will have something like shown in the picture for your electrical service



The 110V 3 prong outlets are pretty obvious. Your cabin may have only 1, normally they are right above the desk in the cabin. The circular ones marked 220V are European ones. There are many different types of outlets in the rest of the non-US world. Most of the rest of the world uses 220V rather than 110V. Note that throughout the ship, you will probably not find many

other 110V outlets at all but most common areas have a 220V outlet that the ship uses for vacuum cleaners and such.

You can use the 220V outlets with the proper plug but make sure your electrical device can handle 220V. Most modern electronics (computers, CPAP, etc.) will automatically adapt to 220V without you needing to do anything HOWEVER make sure before you plug in your device because I am not responsible if you burn it out.

You can buy an adapter from anywhere, including Amazon, and here is a link to one I use https://www.amazon.com/dp/B07SQTOZQP/ref=cm_sw_em_r_mt_dp_10GTV8EK42XNEZGZK47K. Note that this is an adapter only and not a converter. The power will still be 220V so again check to be sure your device can handle 220V but the good news is that most can. If you wish, you can get a converter and it will convert the 220V to 110V if you want to pay the extra. Since I often like to take my laptop with me to sit comfortably around the ship, I use my adapter a lot so that I can plug in to power in the common areas.
