To make sure double Blinded Review process, the authors do not write authors identity in the article journal, but the authors must write the identity in metadata accurately. **Any authorship change is at the Editor's discretion;** they have the right to refuse any authorship change they do not believe conforms with our authorship policies.

ABSTRACT

The abstract should be written briefly and factually in English. It contains **what your research about, what methods have been used, and what you found.** The abstract is self-contained, without any abbreviations, footnotes, or incomplete references. It should be a concise summary that makes sense on its own. The writing of abstract flows naturally. You should also avoid including any images, background information or technical terms that may not be understood without further explanation. Word count of abstract is around 200-250 words.

Keywords: Searchable by search engine, alphabetical order. Don't use phrases, only words. 5 to 6 keyword is recommended.

INTRODUCTION (*this section integrated with the literature review*)

The length of article is 4500-8000 words (exclude title, abstract, reference, acknowledgement, and CRediT author). The introduction contains **the purpose of article/research** that is formulated and presented by an adequate introduction and avoids detail references and research result presentations. **The research urgency, supporting facts, and data must be included.** A preliminary research result should be explained as the basis of the research. A good introduction must answer the following questions:

- a) What is the problem that must be solved (problem statement)?
- b) What people have done to solve existing problems, from time to

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- time (state of the arts)?
- c) What escaped the attention of previous researchers or what the potential is available and not yet explored by other researchers?
 - d) What concepts are offered to fill the "blanks" or something that has escaped the attention of previous researchers ?
 - e) What is to be achieved from this work ?

The author needs to explain the concepts offered and the novelty of the research based on quotations from several original and important works from several journals, including the most recent review articles.

METHOD

The method used should be accompanied by references; the relevant modification should be explained. The procedure and data analysis technique should be emphasized in a literature review article. **Method reveals how research objectives are achieved with the appropriate tools, procedures, and stages, and must be supported by hyperlink to access those instruments.** The stages and analysis of the research must be explained in detail and draw into a diagram process

FINDINGS AND DISCUSSION

The results and discussion should be presented in the same part, clearly and briefly. The discussion part should contain the benefit of the research result, not the repeat result part. The results and discussion part can be written in the same part to avoid the extensive quotation. Tables or graphs must present different results. The results of data analysis must be reliable in answering research problems. References to the discussion should not repeat the references in the introduction. Comparisons to the findings of previous studies must be included.

Here is the quotation format: Font type is Garamond; font size is 11 pt. Quotation in another language (Indonesian or else) is written italic and should be completed with the translation. (Surname, Year: PageNumber)

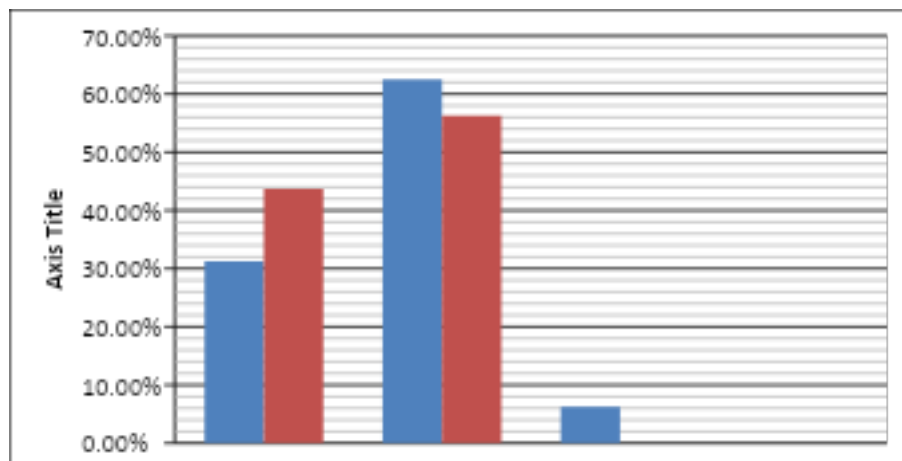

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Explanatory notes or a key should be present if the figure contains patterns, colors, symbols, or other formatting that indicates significant data. Add a key if you include any symbols, abbreviations, etc. in the figure but not elsewhere within the text. **Color photographic images – 300dpi, Grayscale photographic images – 600dpi, Line art or monochrome images – 1200dpi, Combination images (photographs and labelling) – 600dpi**

CONCLUSION

The conclusion section contains a summary of the research findings, which correlate with the research objectives written in the introduction. Then state the main points of the discussion. A conclusion generally concludes with a statement about how the research work contributes to the field of study as a whole (shows how progress from the latest knowledge). A common mistake in this section is to repeat the results of an experiment, abstract, or be presented with a very list. The concluding section must provide clear scientific truths. In addition, the conclusions can also provide suggestions for future experiments.

In the acknowledgment section, the author can state the source of research funding and more specifically to the contract number. Make sure the statement complies with the guidelines provided by the funding agency. The author can also notify and obtain permission from those they wish to identify in this section. The process of obtaining permission should include sharing the article, so that those being identified can verify the context in which their contribution is being acknowledged. **Any assistance from AI tools for content generation (e.g. large language models) and other similar types of technical tools which generate article content, must be clearly acknowledged within the article.** It is the responsibility of authors to ensure the validity, originality and integrity of their article content.

REFERENCES

Usually, there are more errors in references than other parts of the manuscript. However, with reference management software, it is now easier to avoid this problem. In the text, the author must quote all references referred to and vice versa. **Prioritize articles in English and articles from reputable journals by stating DOI. Majority references for last 10 years, and 30 minimum references.**

To make accountable references, the author can use reference management software, such as **Mendeley**. Make a list of references and citations in text **that fit the APA 7th Edition style**. Example of writing references in APA 7th Edition style:
