Dear Ms. Cooper,

We, the undersigned, applaud Pepco's stated commitment to 'supporting the District of Columbia's climate change, clean energy, inclusive innovation and resilience goals, making it the greenest, healthiest and most livable city in the United States.'

Unfortunately, the timing and content of Pepco's September 14th letter to DC Construction Codes Coordinating Board (CCCB) Chair Gurkin, as well as Pepco's October 20th email, had the effect of sowing doubt among board members in Pepco's core ability to handle electrification of new commercial buildings in the District.

We understand that following the CCCB vote, Pepco clarified that it did not oppose the TAG's proposal for electrification, nor did Pepco propose any amendments. However unintentional the planting of doubt regarding Pepco's ability to perform may have been, the resulting doubt still had an impact on the code development process and the District's trajectory towards carbon neutrality.

Consequently, we ask that Pepco clearly and unequivocally communicate at the December CCCB meeting that it can and will support the electrification of new commercial buildings in the District. Anything less than a clear statement of unambiguous support for Pepco's role in meeting the District's climate commitments would be inappropriate and irresponsible, and could warrant consideration of the District's statutory power to establish an authority to enact the legally required energy transition. Conversely, such clarification by Pepco may prompt the board to move towards approval of the proposed all-electric new construction code necessary for the District to meet its obligations under DC's <u>Climate Commitment Amendment Act of 2022</u>.

We trust that Pepco will publicly clarify its position and embrace the role of a leader among electric utilities helping communities achieve climate, equity, health and resiliency commitments.
