Be it enacted by the Senate of the Student Government Association of The Johns Hopkins University assembled that:

Moves the duty of setting the agenda and presiding over general body meetings to a President of the Senate elected from amongst its members, ensuring the agenda and actions of the legislature matches the will of the elected legislature.

Establishes a more limited SGA “efficiency” requirement for the VP, working to ensure the areas in which the executive branch regularly interacts with are functioning well, while also not overburdening the Executive President with this role nor requiring the VP works to ensure efficiency of areas the VP has little engagement with.

<p>Moves most programming duties to a separate section of the SGA, housed under the Executive Branch.</p> <p>Class <u>programming</u> council executive teams remain elected, but are separated from legislation focused “class representatives”. This allows students wishing to join SGA to choose whether they wish to focus on class-specific programming or legislation/advocacy.</p> <p>Crafts an explicit duty for a member of SGA to be in communication with other programming bodies, and to actively pursue SGA co-sponsorship of others’ events, instead of waiting for those groups to come to us.</p> <p>Defines “class year” for the purpose of SGA elections.</p> <p>Ensures SGA is kept up-to-date on upcoming campus events</p>

<p>These positions are primarily skill based; as such, they should undergo an application process instead of an election process wherein technical proficiency is less able to be assessed.</p> <p>The President’s Cabinet should inherently reflect the priorities of the President; as such, they are empowered to shape it with additional members in ways that best match their current initiatives.</p> <p>Allows non-exec members of PRDC, CMC, and Class <u>programming</u> Councils to take other SGA roles.</p>

<p>The Legislative Branch shall be composed of the Student Senate and shall meet at least once a week.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Senate shall be presided over by the Vice President, who shall have a vote only when a tie exists. The Senate shall have 28 members, 7 of whom shall be elected from each class for a one year term, and each shall have one vote and the power to introduce legislation. The top six candidates who gain the most votes shall be elected as Senators. There shall be a separate Class President position, who shall be the primary class representative and must run as a separate position on the ballot, but still be a Senator for the intent of the Senate. 	<p>The Legislative Branch shall be composed of the Student Senate and shall meet at least once a week <u>during the fall and spring semesters.</u></p> <p><u>The Senate shall be comprised of the following representatives, elected from amongst their constituent groups:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <u>Five Class Senators from each graduating class, totalling twenty class representatives.</u> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <u>One of these representatives, who shall be the primary class representative and must run as a separate position on the ballot, shall be chosen by a classwide election for “Class President”. This position remains that of a Senator for the intent of the Senate.</u> <u>The remaining four representatives shall be chosen by a concurrent classwide election for “Class Senators”.</u> <u>Class representatives may serve as non-voting ex-officio members of their Class Programming Council if they</u>

	<p>so choose.</p> <p>2. Seven Academic Senators from the Krieger School and Five Academic Senators from the Whiting school, totaling twelve representatives.</p> <p>3. One Senator from each category of student organizations SGA recognizes, elected from amongst the student body, totalling nine representatives.</p> <p>4. A Chair of each SGA Caucus shall be elected from amongst the student body, and be a Senator in the Senate, if the following conditions are met:</p> <p>a. The caucus must have been established in the SGA Bylaws prior to January 1st of the election year.</p> <p>b. The caucus must remain in existence at the time of elections.</p> <p>Representatives shall be chosen by raw vote total within each election (i.e. the top five representatives from each school are chosen).</p>
Rationale	
<p>Meeting timeline updated to accommodate school breaks.</p> <p>The Senate considers legislation that impacts all students, frequently independent of the class year they are in. As class representatives would no longer be engaged in programming, the only reason to elect from amongst the class is to bring class-specific viewpoints to the Senate. However, we can ensure representation of other viewpoints in additional ways, through additional elected positions representing distinct organizations, identities, and academic schools.</p> <p>Expands the size of the Senate to increase our impact.</p> <p>Maintains a symbolic “Class President” for speeches, outreach, etc.</p>

	<p><u>The President and Vice President of the Senate shall be elected from amongst its members at the first Senate meeting following inauguration.</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <u>1. The President of the Senate shall preside over the meeting except in their absence or recusal, in which case the Vice President of the Senate shall chair the meeting. The chair of the meeting is hereafter referred to as the Presiding Officer.</u> <u>2. The Vice President of the Senate shall be charged with facilitating communication between SGA positions and with fostering community amongst the membership.</u> <u>3. In both cases, the election for President and Vice President of the Senate shall be facilitated by the Student Body President or, in their absence, the next position in the line of succession outlined in Article VIII</u>

	<p><u>Section Six.</u></p> <p>4. <u>At any time, a senator can motion for the re-election of the President or Vice President of the Senate. In such cases, the President of the Senate shall be granted five minutes to give their position on the matter. Thereafter, a vote to enable re-election shall be had amongst the Senate, facilitated by a JHU staff member. Rationale	
<p>Moves the chair of the Senate to be a member of the legislature, ensuring that the agenda and operations of the Senate reflect the views of the Senate. Enables a more flexible chairing process. Ensures better Senate-Exec communication by putting a member of the Legislature in meetings of the President's Cabinet in a non-voting capacity.</p>

1. Any referendum that receives a plurality of votes shall become binding to the SGA.
 - a. A referendum is considered to have plurality when more respondents vote “yes” than “no” and the total number of students who voted yes amounts to at least 1/3 (one-third) of the undergraduate student body.
 - b. Votes in abstentions shall not count towards plurality.

Section Four: Referenda for a Constitutional Amendment

This Constitution may be amended by a student referendum:
