- What needs to be changes/ improved for platform to be useful for research

Researchers - Put forward questions from the community for them to answer and build research around to further bolster funding applications

we have to allow for emergence / lateral thinking between individuals

Problems:

avoid high concentration of set skillsets in inappropriate cities

What can we do? Points raised within the session!

Edwin: what your offer is vs > find somewhere to take a big risk > find somewhere and do it > document it and qualify everything

Identify ER's already in the community who can get excited about it where they already are

Using wider network >

Go in through local resident groups authorisations > good links

Share the idea with some of the authorities that might participate > to get their feedback

Sooner the better > to keep the momentum going

Connect with Hackspaces, polish spaces aren't so focused on computers and tech > connect with squatters and hackers, with a clear message, we're trying to subvert the local municipalities > we can not name it a squat > we'd love to work with you.

Create a demand from the local people, to get the value added

Embrace the different modes in which individuals manage and execute this project, top down and bottom up > DO NOT CRITICISE OTHER INDIVIDUALS FOR THEIR APPROACH

We need tools > more models to adapt > create widgets and apps style thinking

Frame the problem from different perspectives > what are your values and perspective > you need those running the city and individuals - they don't see the problem in the same way - officials don't want to look stupid. What is the argument? Remember you are dealing with representatives of conservative forces. Mayor cannot do what ever he likes. (UNDERSTAND which officials have power levers in different contexts)

Avoid asking money at all costs, harnessing resources that are currently unused. Maximum Core offerings: USE THE MEETUPS IN OTHER CITIES TO COMMUNICATE THE MESSAGE OF THE MONASTERIES AND STRATEGY: SELF ORGANISE EDGERYDER EVENTS IN POTENTIAL CITIES OF CHOICE AND INVITE INFLUENTIAL OFFICIALS PERSONAL NEWSPAPER - BLOGGER AND JOURNALISTS SUPPORT TEAM FOR LEVERAGE (I.E landlord threatens to raise rent and we say "oh no the paper will be upset and it has a readership of 10,000) EQUITY STAKE FOR INVESTORS > WHO LEVERAGE AND PROVIDE RESOURCE FOR THE **PROJECT** Angel Investment in the form of social assets? Re-BOOTING COHESIVE DEMOCRACY

Our Nomadic Residency initiative invites local government to host nodes of cutting edge social renewal.

A typical three-year residency houses a fluid collective of interrelated project workers with access to a network of global tools. The group's steadily expanding ring of projects are designed to interact with local community based initiatives and provide visceral stimulus for community rebuilding between youth and a culture of visionary governance.
