Interview with Superior Gubernatorial Candidate Kevie Mason - 14 June 2022 - 7:00 PM - Lauren Thorken, Editor-At-Large for Superior Journal . Chicago, Superior.

Lauren Thorken: Dr. Mason! So nice to see you again.

KevieMason: Lauren, you know better than that. It's Kevy (laughs).

Lauren Thorken: Okay, Kevie. How have you been? It's safe to say that your candidacy shocked us all.

KevieMason: I've been well, thanks for asking! I know that this may come as a shock to some, a first-term Congresswoman running against an establishment Democrat in the primary. Well, here's the thing Lauren, I'm not running against any Democrat. I'm running for the people of Superior and their vision of what responsible government should look like.

Lauren Thorken: You keep mentioning responsible government. What does that mean to you?

KevieMason: Responsible government to the people of Superior, including myself, means putting their welfare first.
