Causes of the Russian Revolution

Background Info:

- I. The Russian Empire
 - A. Hadn't industrialized as much as Germany and Britain
 - B. Recently abolished serfdom
 - C. 1861- the largest and most diverse country
 - D. 4 million people who spoke more than one hundred different languages and over one hundred different ethnic groups.
 - E. Politically: Tsar was the ruler given complete authority by God and Orthodox Church.
 - F. Socially: Backwards country, non-Russian minorities (Poles, Jews, Finns and Ukrainians)
 - G. Economically: Privileged nobles owned most of land and millions of serfs worked in virtual slavery on the land.
- II. Key takeaway: Russia was unstable politically and socially, and they had only just begun to industrialize

Cause #1: Peasant Lives

- A. If you remember the assignment we had about peasant lives, you know that peasant life sucked
 - a. They didn't have enough food
 - b. The peasants were dirty, uncivilized, and lived in terrible conditions
- B. They were overworked and treated like dirt
- C. Peasants were unhappy with their circumstances in Russia

Cause #2: Working Conditions

- I. With industrialization comes more workers
 - A. Working conditions were terrible
 - 1. 11 hour work days
 - 2. Unsafe conditions
 - B. The workers demand for shorter work days, higher wages and better working conditions
 - C. Nobody listens to the workers' demands, so Bloody Sunday happens
- II. Bloody Sunday
 - A. Industrial workers are unhappy, so they sign a petition (150,000 people)
 - B. The workers go to the Winter Palace to present the petition
 - 1. Tsar Nicholas has the army shoot into the crowd

2. People start to resent the royal family

Cause #3: Corruption

- I. Rasputin could help the son, Alexi, with his hemophilia
 - A. HUGE MISTAKE
 - 1. This angers both nobles and peasants
 - a) Nobles: Why does this lowly peasant get to work in the palace with the royalty?
 - b) Peasants: Why does he get to work with royalty and we don't?
 - 2. Everyone hated Rasputin except the King and Queen
 - 3. The people start spreading salacious rumors about the Queen and Rasputin
 - 4. This turned the public opinion even more against the monarchy

Cause #4: Military Humiliation

- I. Russia went into the Russo-Japanese war for something petty (argument over who should get parts of Manchuria and Korea)
 - A. Russia thought it would be easy to just squash the Japanese quickly
 - B. Japanese defeats them despite everyone's beliefs that Russia would win easily
- II. World War I
 - A. Russia lost millions of people in just the first year
 - B. Morale of the Russian troops was low
 - C. Russia was running out of food, supplies, and patriotism
 - D. By the end of WWI, all the social classes wanted change
