Slice #5 Rising Action	 Write about 3-4 main events which build tension as the author writes the story. Be descriptive in what is happening at each point in the story. Do not give away the climax here. Include one picture to represent one of the events. Example: When Winnie stumbles upon Jesse by the spring, things start to get messy. The Tucks kidnap Winnie and tell her their big secret: they're immortal. Unfortunately for them, the secret is out. A man in a yellow suit has overheard the secret-spilling session and is planning to majorly exploit Winnie and the Tucks. (this is only one event) 	/15
