<b>Slice #1 Title</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The book title (capitalized and underlined)</li> <li>• The author</li> <li>• Your name</li> <li>• A picture that represents your book</li> </ul>	/10
<b>Slice #2 Setting</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Describe the time and place in detail. ( reminder, there could be more than one time/place)</li> <li>• Include a quote from the text (cite page number) that best describes the setting and creates a word picture in your mind.</li> <li>• Include a picture that represents the setting.</li> </ul> <p>Example: The novel <u>Tuck Everlasting</u> takes place in the year 1881. It starts in a heavily wooded Ohio town of Treegap. Winnie Foster lives in a middle-class house with a white picket fence at the edge of town. The story takes place in the mysterious woods at the edge of town. The scary woods have a magic spring in the center. The Tuck family has an untidy shack here as well.</p> <p>"...every surface, every wall, was piled and strewn and hung with everything imaginable, from onions to lanterns to wooden spoons to wash tubs." <b>Slice #3 Characters</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Include the names of ALL major characters and at least 3 minor characters.</li> <li>• For all characters mentioned you must include complete sentences that describe them, their part in the plot of the story and give 3 character traits that describe them.</li> <li>• Include a picture of one of the main characters.</li> </ul> <p>Example: Winnie Foster, the young heroine of the story, is a <b>curious, adventurous, and independent</b> girl. She is very tired of having her family watch her every move and telling her what to do. She is "kidnapped" by Tucks and is ready to explore.</p>	/15
<b>Slice #4 Conflict</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Describe what the problem is in the story.</li> <li>• What mystery is trying to be solved?</li> <li>• What roadblocks do they encounter along the way?</li> </ul> <p>Example: The conflict arises when the Tuck family drinks from a spring which makes them immortal, unable to grow old or die. When Winnie, a young girl, finds out their secret,</p>	/15

	<p>they decide to kidnap her in order to keep their secret safe. An unexpected thing occurs when a stranger wants to bottle the spring water and sell it.</p>	
<p><b>Slice #5</b> <b>Rising Action</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write about 3–4 main events which build tension as the author writes the story.</li> <li>• Be descriptive in what is happening at each point in the story.</li> <li>• Do not give away the climax here.</li> <li>• Include one picture to represent one of the events.</li> </ul> <p>Example: When Winnie stumbles upon Jesse by the spring, things start to get messy. The Tucks kidnap Winnie and tell her their big secret: they're immortal. Unfortunately for them, the secret is out. A man in a yellow suit has overheard the secret-spilling session and is planning to majorly exploit Winnie and the Tucks. (this is only one event)</p>	/15
<p><b>Slice #6</b> <b>Climax</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This is the most exciting part, or the part when everything is revealed and the last clue is found.</li> <li>• Include a picture to show this scene.</li> </ul> <p>Example: When Yellow Suit Guy shows up and threatens Winnie and the Tucks, Mae lets him know who is boss—by hitting him over the head with the base of a shotgun. The constable shows up and accuses the Tucks of kidnapping Winnie. She stands up for her newfound family. She is officially part of their family now.</p>	/15
<p><b>Piece #7</b> <b>Clues</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write out three clues from the story.</li> <li>• These are probably things you did not realize were important at the time, but when the mystery was solved you realized they were.</li> <li>• Include a picture for each clue.</li> </ul> <p>Example: The first clue was when..... The second clue was when.... The third clue was when....</p>	/15
<p><b>Piece #8</b> <b>Rating</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Personal rating of the book.</li> <li>• Use some form of visual rating system like 3 out of 5 stars colored or 4 out of 4 thumbs up.</li> <li>• Include an explanation of your rating.</li> </ul>	/10
