CHS SPOTLIGHTS

Trout in the Classroom Release Day!

The third week of May was our trout release week! My environmental science classes partnered up with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and Trout Unlimited to be part of the National Trout in the Classroom program. We received about 130 rainbow trout fry in early January. The fish were about a half inch long when we received them. The students were in charge of feeding the fish, cleaning the tank, and monitoring the water quality. They learned about the stages of life of rainbow trout and how big of an impact they have on the local ecosystems. We ended up releasing 102 trout into Sheridan Pond. They ranged from 1.5 inches to about 4 inches in size. These trout will continue to grow bigger and bigger in the pond as they have more space now and more food sources. They will also provide a much needed boost to the ecosystem in the pond and fishing opportunities for the local youth. We are thankful for the support of the WI DNR and Trout Unlimited for the awesome hands on learning opportunities that the trout presented.



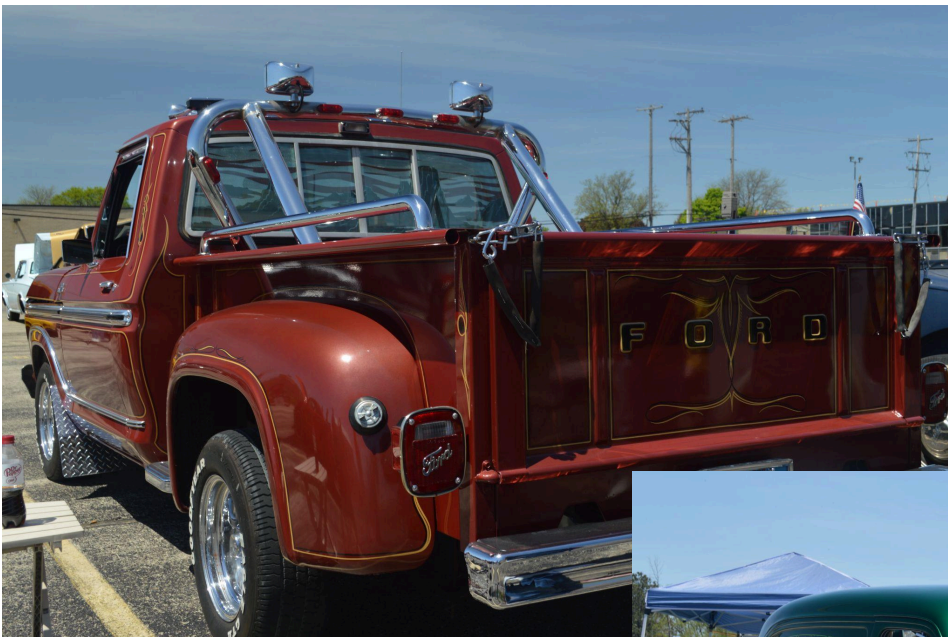
Cudahy High School's FIRST Annual Custom Car Show

Art Department Update



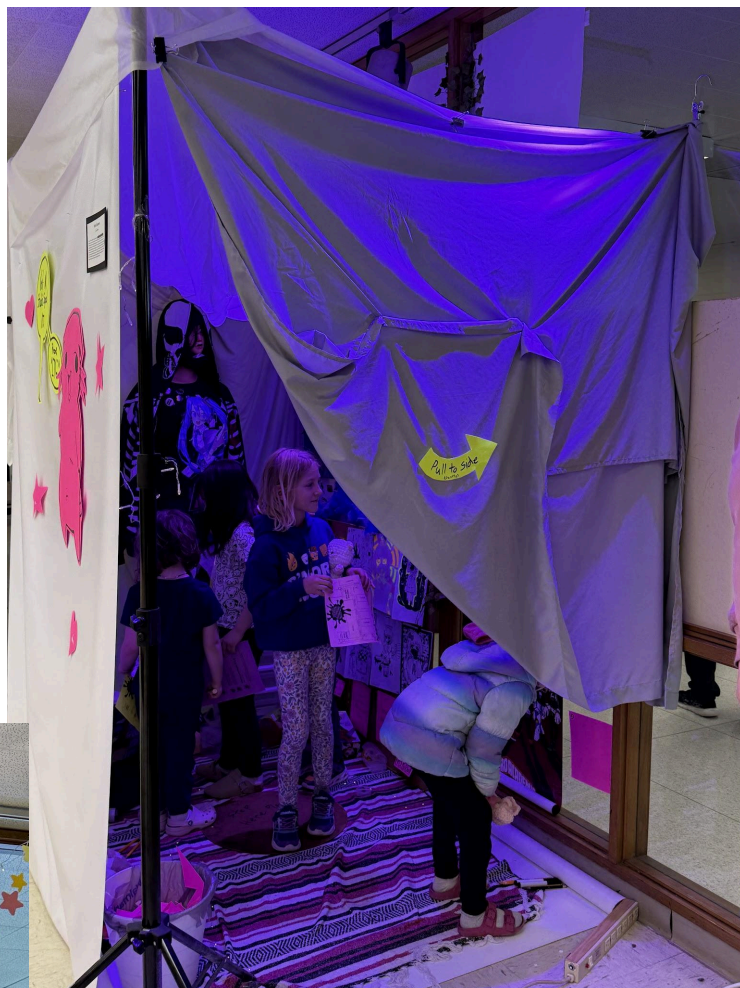
Students throwing on the wheels during our annual Art Splash. Visitors were able to sit and watch them throw various forms. Multiple people said watching them was “mesmerizing”.

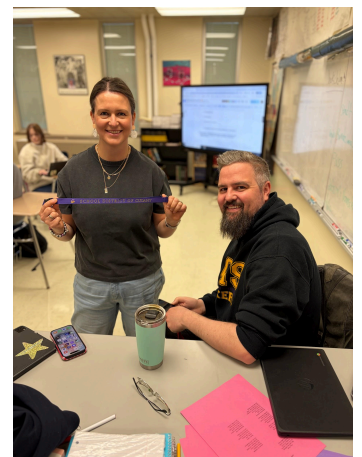

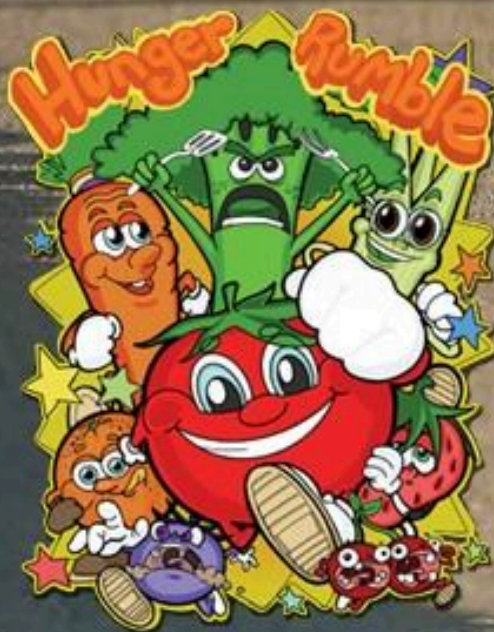

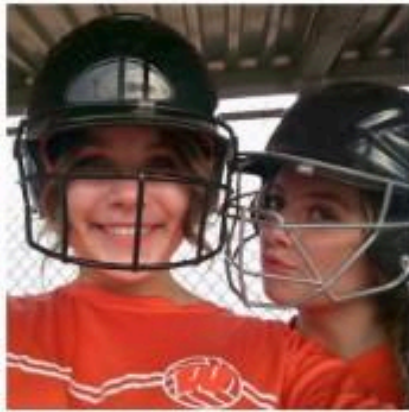
