Abstract explicitly contains: brief background, research objectives, research methods, and important research findings. Abstract is written in 1 (one) paragraph (14pt Times New Roman font, Justify, 1 space).

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1. Introduction

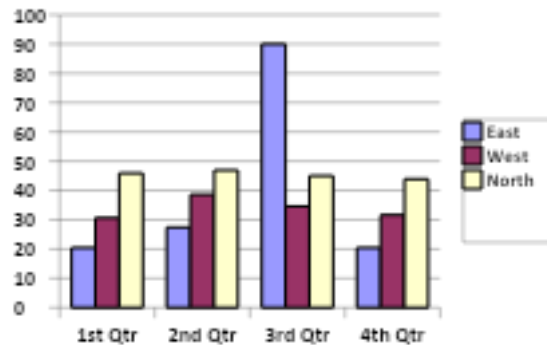
The introduction should contain (in sequence) a general background, a review of previous literature (state of the art) as the basis for the statement of scientific novelty of the article, a statement of scientific novelty, and a research problem or hypothesis. At the end of the introduction, the purpose of the article's study should be written. In the format of a scientific article, a literature review is not permitted as in a research report, but is realized in the form of a review of previous literature (state of the art) to show the scientific novelty of the article. Writing references uses the reference application mendeley with APA style format.

2. Method

Present the research method in detail, containing the author's procedures in conducting research and finding research results. Include the reasons why the method was used. Avoid using too many sub-chapters. Present it flowingly in narrative form.

3. Results and Discussion

The results should be presented well including descriptive and inferential statistics. Present tables of data processing results efficiently and attractively. Figures should include sources that are treated the same as citations. The required images and tables can be displayed between the text in the center position and not exceeding the specified manuscript margin. Each image and table are given a number and title. The image title is placed right below the image with a sequential number like example image 2, while the table title is placed right above the table like example table 1.

Tables or images that are estimated to require more space can be presented in portrait form, or presented on a separate page. Tables or images should also not be interrupted on a page and then continued on the next page. Tables or images must be described by stating the table number or image number. Explanations of tables or images should be on the same page as the page where the table or image is presented.

If the manuscript contains mathematical equations, these equations should be written using Microsoft Equation Editor or the Math Type add-on (<http://www.mathtype.com>) for equations in your paper (Insert | Object | Create New | Microsoft Equation or Math Type Equation). “Float over text” should not be selected. Mathematical equations should be described by stating the equation number. The explanation of the mathematical equation should be on the same page as the page where the equation is presented.

The conclusion is a short answer to the problem discussed. The conclusion is not made into points, but is described in 1 (one) paragraph. Use narrative with effective sentences and show the impact of this research.

Include research limitations. Research limitations form the basis of research suggestions. Include research suggestions. Write the suggestions in one paragraph after the conclusion.

5. References

Contains references used in research up to 10 years ago using APA Style. The scientific articles cited must have clear sources (preferably with DOI) and are listed in the reference list. Use the Mendeley reference application to cite and create a reference list. Here is an example of a bibliography:
