State and Status of Women in the World - HANDOUT 1

Women can be categorized as one of the world's most oppressed and the largest of the unreached people groups.

Literacy:

1. Of the 773 million illiterate people of the world, two-thirds are girls and women.
2. Educated women are more able to find work and earn more than illiterate
3. Women, though worldwide, on average, women who work earn 24% less than men.
4. A child born to a mother who can read and write is 50% more likely to survive past the age of 5.
5. Illiteracy prevents women from accessing information that improves health and well-being.
6. Illiteracy keeps women from reading and learning God's word and His care for them.

Health:

1. Approximately 810 women die every day from pregnancy or delivery related issues. 99% occur in developing countries.
2. Preventable complications after birth such as fever, anemia, fistula, urinary leakage, and depression affect 20 million women yearly.
3. Yearly, 16 million girls between the ages of 15-19 give birth. In developing countries, complications from pregnancy and childbirth are the leading cause of death in this age group.
4. An estimated 1.8 million children are living with HIV, contracted from their mothers during pregnancy, childbirth, or breastfeeding. Lack of access to medical care is a major obstacle to preventing this problem.

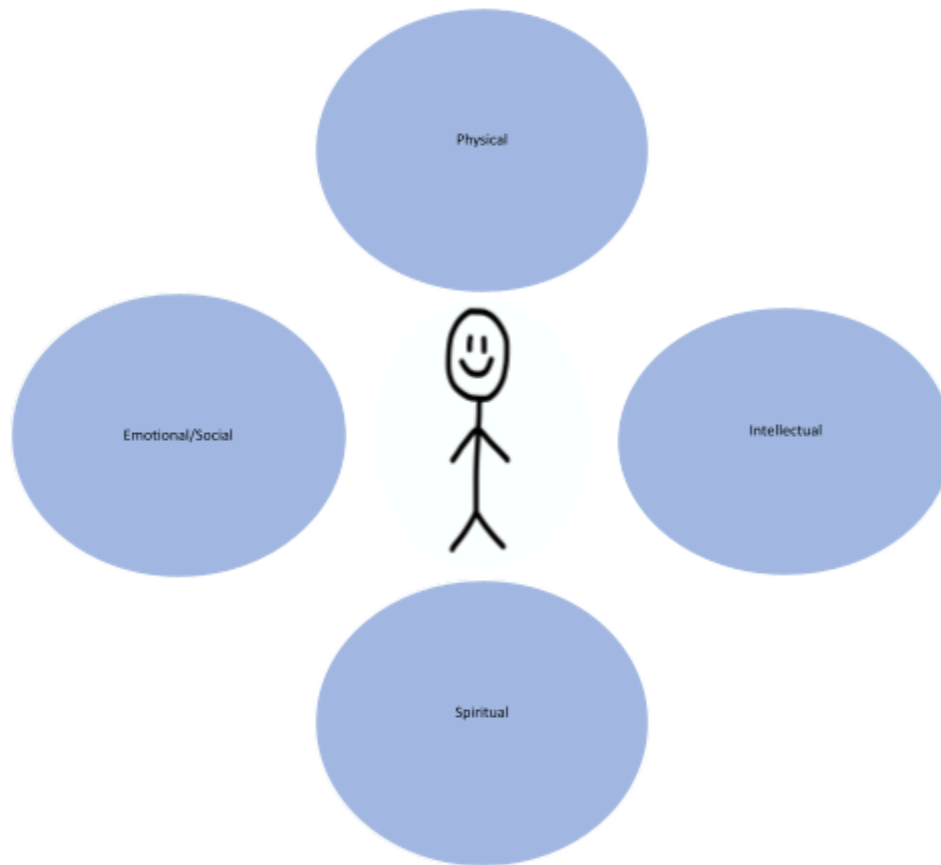
Work:

1. Women working outside the home typically earn less than men and are more likely to work in unstable jobs with no benefits.
2. Women do nearly all the childcare, cooking and care of the home, even when they work outside the home.
3. Many, many women work with no pay.
4. On a global scale, women cultivate more than half the food grown.

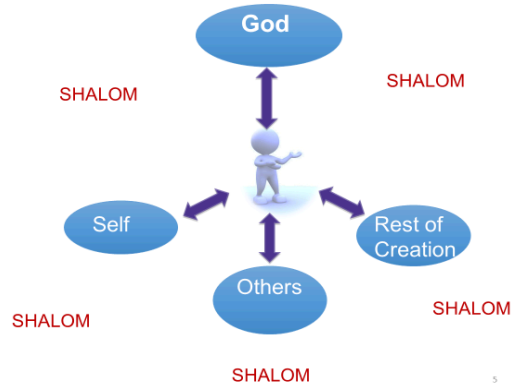
Status:

1. The low status of women impacts all these statistics.
2. Women are more likely to live in poverty than men.
3. Violence against women is tolerated and even approved in many cultures. One out of every 3 women around the world have suffered physical and/or sexual violence.
4. About 71% of human trafficking victims are women and girls.
5. The low status of women in many cultures leaves them with no recourse for self protection.

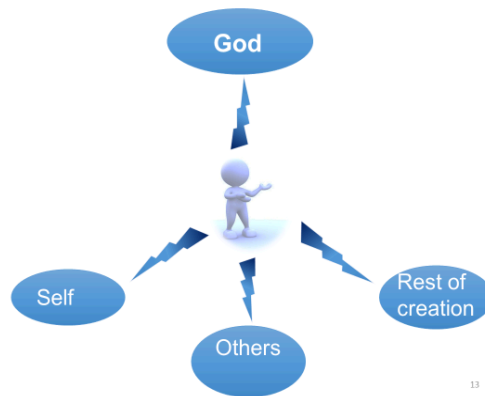

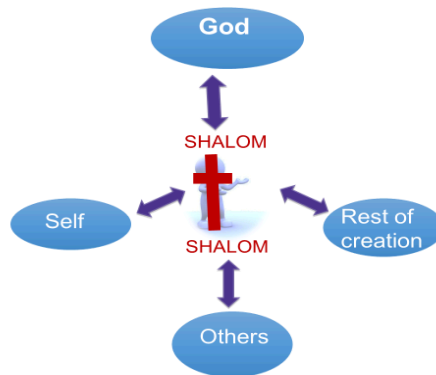
FOUR FUNDAMENTAL RELATIONSHIPS

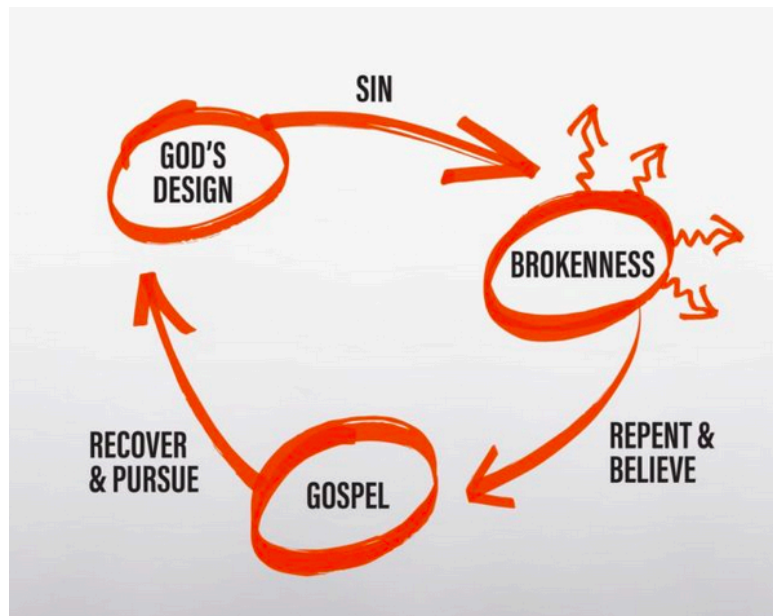
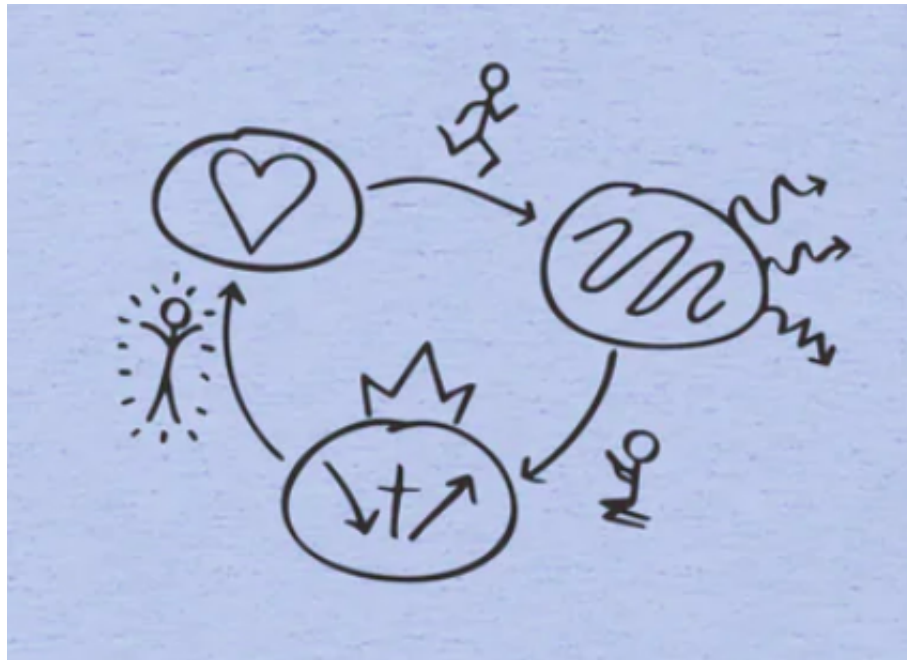

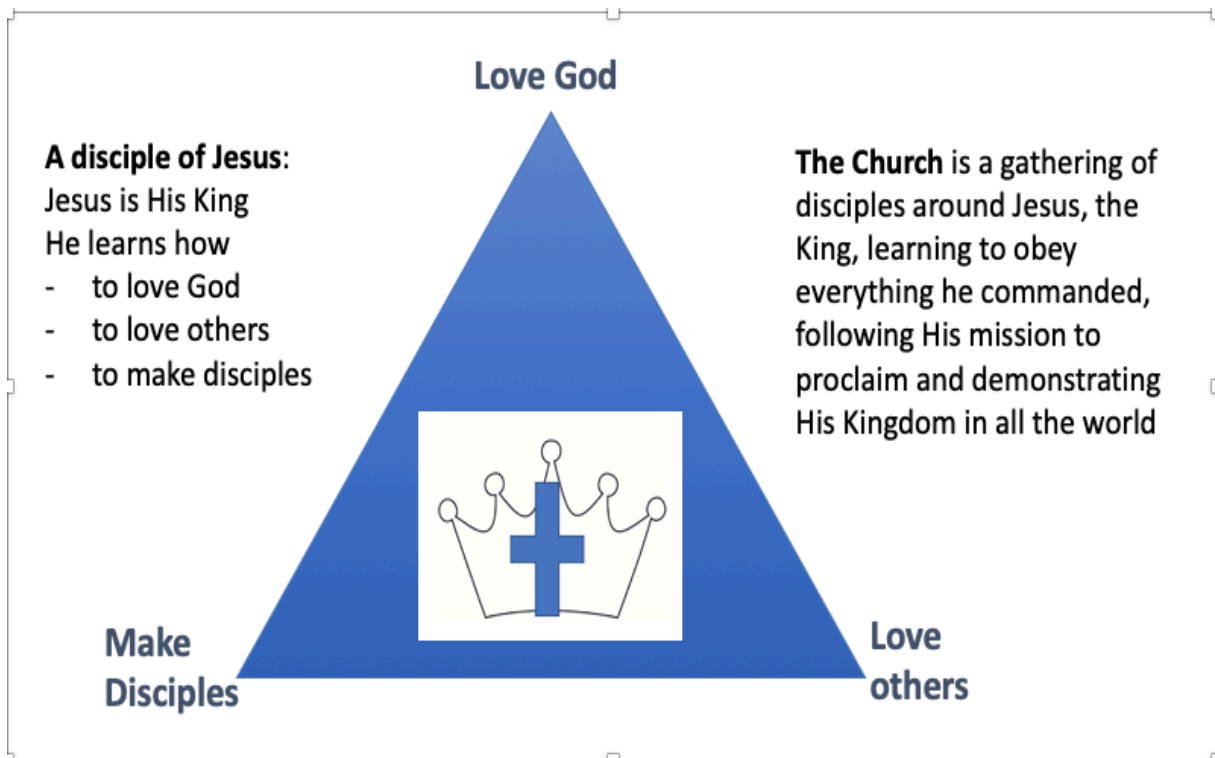

Women's IDMM Approach Process - HANDOUT 1

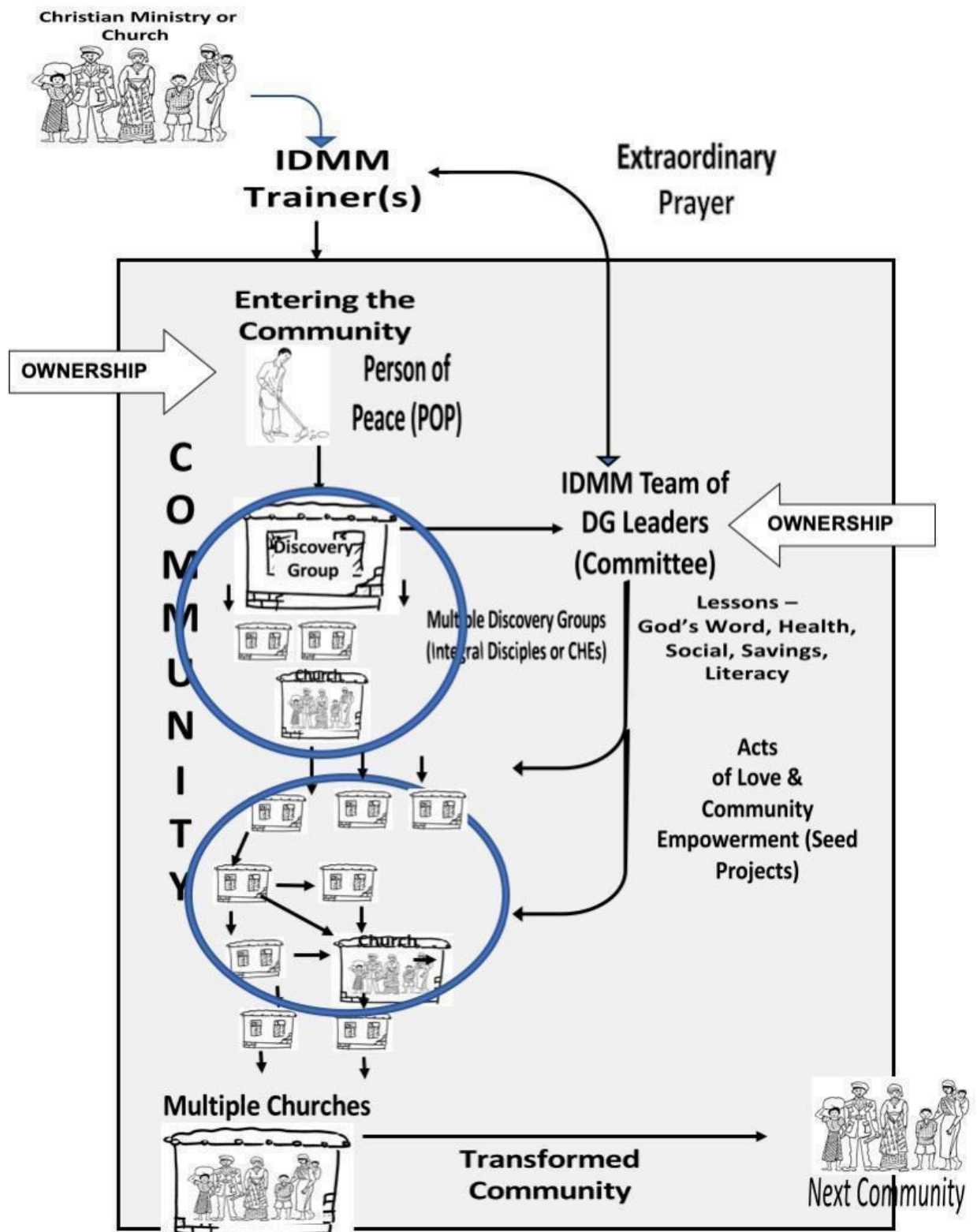
During this training, we will review each step in this process and the important guiding principles. Each step in the process needs to be understood and implemented as we develop integral disciple makers in the community.

1. IDMM Team members are trained in IDMM. (sit with you and then you send out the team)
2. The IDMM Team pray earnestly for the peoples and area where they hope to minister. They do prayer walks in the area.
3. The IDMM Team enters the community and start to gather information about the community.
4. The IDMM Team have conversations with many people in the community. They drink a lot of tea
5. They pray for persons of peace.
6. As they are having a spiritual conversation, they find a person who is open to the truths of God's word and desires change in their community.
7. The IDMM Team encourages the person of peace to share with their extended family and friends what they are learning about the Kingdom of God.
8. The IDMM Team starts a discovery group with family or friends of the person of peace.
9. They begin to listen to God's Word together and answer three questions:
 - a. What do we learn about God?
 - b. What do we learn about man?
 - c. If we believe this is God's Word, what will we do about it? I will...
10. They also have a health lesson each week. The IDMM team models how to lead the group.
11. First, the IDMM team models how the group is led (M=MODEL)
12. Then, after a few sessions, they encourage the person of peace to lead the discovery group. The IDMM team helps as needed. (A=ASSIST)
13. Next, the leader watches the person of peace as they lead. (W=WATCHES)
14. The IDMM trainer leaves the group and the person of peace continues to lead their group. (L=LAUNCH OR LEAVE)
15. The IDMM trainer prays for the person of peace and his/her family to seek God, learn about Jesus and receive Him. They discover truth in the stories of Jesus from New Testament.
16. They pray to receive Christ.
17. New believers are baptized.
18. The discovery group continues to grow and soon the person of peace identifies a person in his/her group to lead a new group.
19. They go through the same process of modeling, assisting, watching and letting the new leader lead on his own.
20. Individuals in the groups are encouraged to reach out to practical needs of their neighbors and friends through Acts of Love.
21. The IDMM trainer meets weekly with the discovery group leaders. He asks them about their group, their study of God's Word, and introduces new passage of God's Word to study.
22. The IDMM trainer and discovery group leaders practice leading relevant health or social topic.
23. The discovery group leader returns to his group and models a process of Looking back (reviewing the past week), looking up (discovering truth in God's Word), looking forward (sharing who they will share with in the coming week) and looking out (addressing health and social needs in their lives).

24. The IDMM trainer introduces the idea of seed project – a small project that the discovery groups can plan and do in the community to address a need in the community.
25. The discovery groups go out and does a seed project such as cleaning up garbage in the community.
26. IDMM Trainers and Discovery groups pray earnestly for their neighbors and friends to follow God in the same way they have.
27. New groups are started by community members (not IDMM team). IDMM Team members are trained in principles and practice of both integral ministry and Disciple Making Movement (IDMM).

IDMM = Integral Disciple Making Movement (CHE-DMM)

Proverbs 31:10-31

Who can find a virtuous and capable wife? She is worth more than precious rubies. Her husband can trust her, and she will greatly enrich his life. She will not hinder him but help him all her life. She finds wool and flax and busily spins it. She is like a merchant's ship; she brings her food from afar. 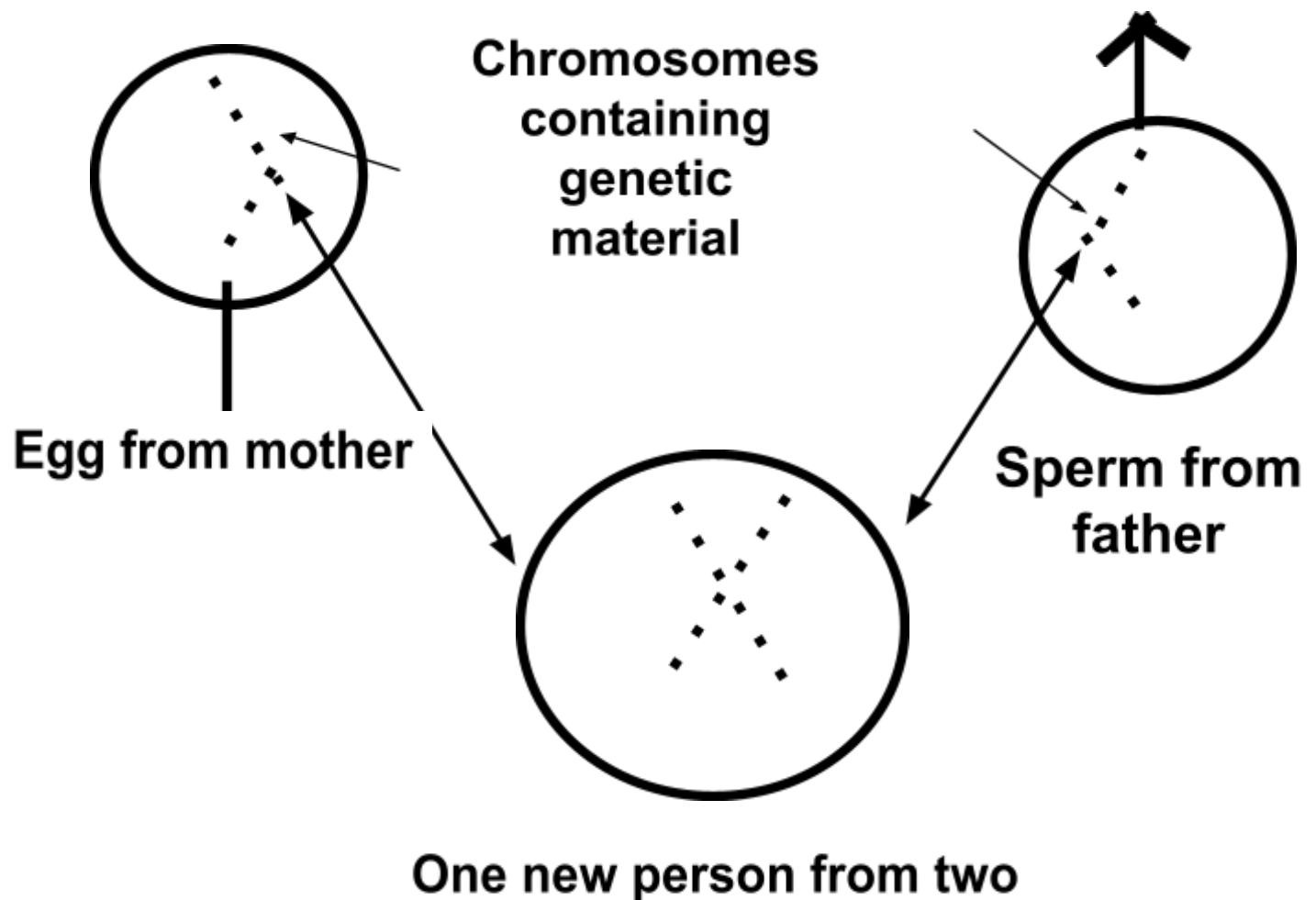
When she speaks, her words are wise, and kindness is the rule when she gives instructions. She carefully watches all that goes on in her household and does not have to bear the consequences of laziness.

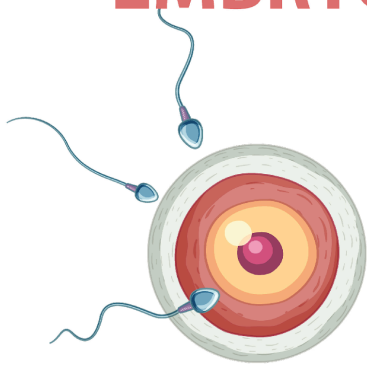
One New Person from Two - HANDOUT 2

HUMAN FERTILISATION AND EMBRYONIC DEVELOPMENT



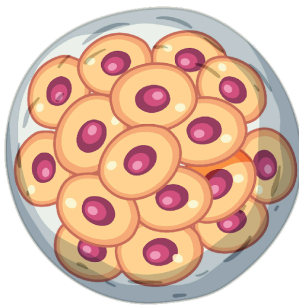

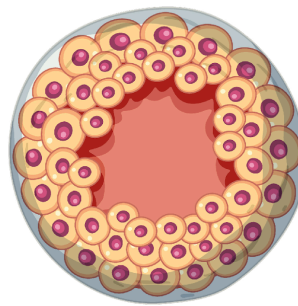

Prayer Walking the Community HANDOUT 2

How do we learn about ways that God is already working in this community?

1. Ask God to show you what he is doing already there
2. Walk around looking and listening and asking God for his guidance
3. Ask God to lead us to people He wants us to meet.
4. Ask God to show the Person of Peace
5. Let people feel it is safe to tell us their story. Create a safe space where they can do this
6. Look for what God is awakening in me about this place
7. Information, just being there, be a listener
8. Have conversation not interview
9. Start spiritual conversations with people.
10. Listen to stories people tell about others and their place
11. Observe, Use the senses – smell, taste, hearing, sight
12. Develop friendships/ relationships
13. Review previous studies done in the area

How do we respond in prayer to the information we are gathering?

1. Pray for the ministry in the community
2. Wait on the Lord for guidance.
3. Be disciplined and unified in prayer.
4. Maintain journals of prayer activities.
5. Prayer walks through the community.
6. Enlist the local church to pray with the IDMM team.
7. Pray for protection from spiritual forces (Ephesians 6:10-18).
8. Keep relationship with God strong and up-to-date.
9. Meditate and pray through God's Word for leading in prayer.
10. Pray specifically for people who are under influence of spiritual forces.
11. Fuel intercessory prayer through gathering of spiritual information.

Walking and Praying through the Community

1. Even if you live in the community, look at it with the eyes and attitude of a stranger.
2. If not from the community, find a Person of Peace to walk with you, if possible. Luke 10:1-12
3. Walk around observing how the people live and socialize with each other. Use all your senses.

4. As you walk, pray for what you see and sense from God's Spirit. Begin to discern why there are certain values or behavior in the community.
5. If you see people outside, greet them, tell them who you are and that you are interested in learning about this place
 - a. How long have you lived here?
 - b. What do you like about this community?
 - c. If you could change one thing about your community, what would that be?
6. Listen to stories about people and the community
7. Record observations and findings after you finish walking

DISCOVERY GROUP PROCESS

I. LOOKING BACK

1. What are you thankful for this week?
2. What are you struggling with this week? How about your family, friends, and neighbors?
3. With whom did you share last week's learnings?
4. How did it go with your "I will's"? Ask about spiritual, physical and social changes.

II. LOOKING UP

1. Read a passage, tell a story or do a drama of the story – 10-15 verses maximum. Others listen
2. Another person reads the passage or tells the story. Others listen.
3. Another person restates passage in his own words, without interpretation
4. Group adds or removes content so that the restatement is most accurate and understandable
5. Ask another person to retell in their own words.

6. Three Questions:

- a. What does this passage teach us about God?
- b. What does this passage teach us about people?
- c. If this is God speaking, how will you respond this week to what you have learned?
"I will..."

7. Guidelines:

- a. The leader is facilitator not teacher
- b. The group focuses on the Word of God, to listen and obey
- c. Facilitator depends on the Holy Spirit
- d. Facilitator will answer questions or share as a member of the group
- e. Focus on the passage. No cross referencing or outside resources
- f. Others can ask "where do you find this in the text?" if a member goes to outside resources

III. LOOKING FORWARD

1. With whom will you share what you learned this week?
2. Name and pray together for our Very Important Person (VIP) (not yet a believer around me that God has put on my heart)
3. Ask God (Time of listening) how I can be a witness in actions and words to my VIP. Share and Pray

IV. LOOKING OUTWARD (INTEGRAL DISCIPLE MAKING)

1. Do you know someone who has a need that we can help with this week? (Plan an Act of Love that the group can do). When there are multiple discovery groups, they can plan small community projects (seed projects).
2. Are there any health issues or other problems that you are concerned with? (The disciple maker can share with his coach who can give him picture book to teach a health lesson)
3. Short health lesson (topic chosen based on needs in community)

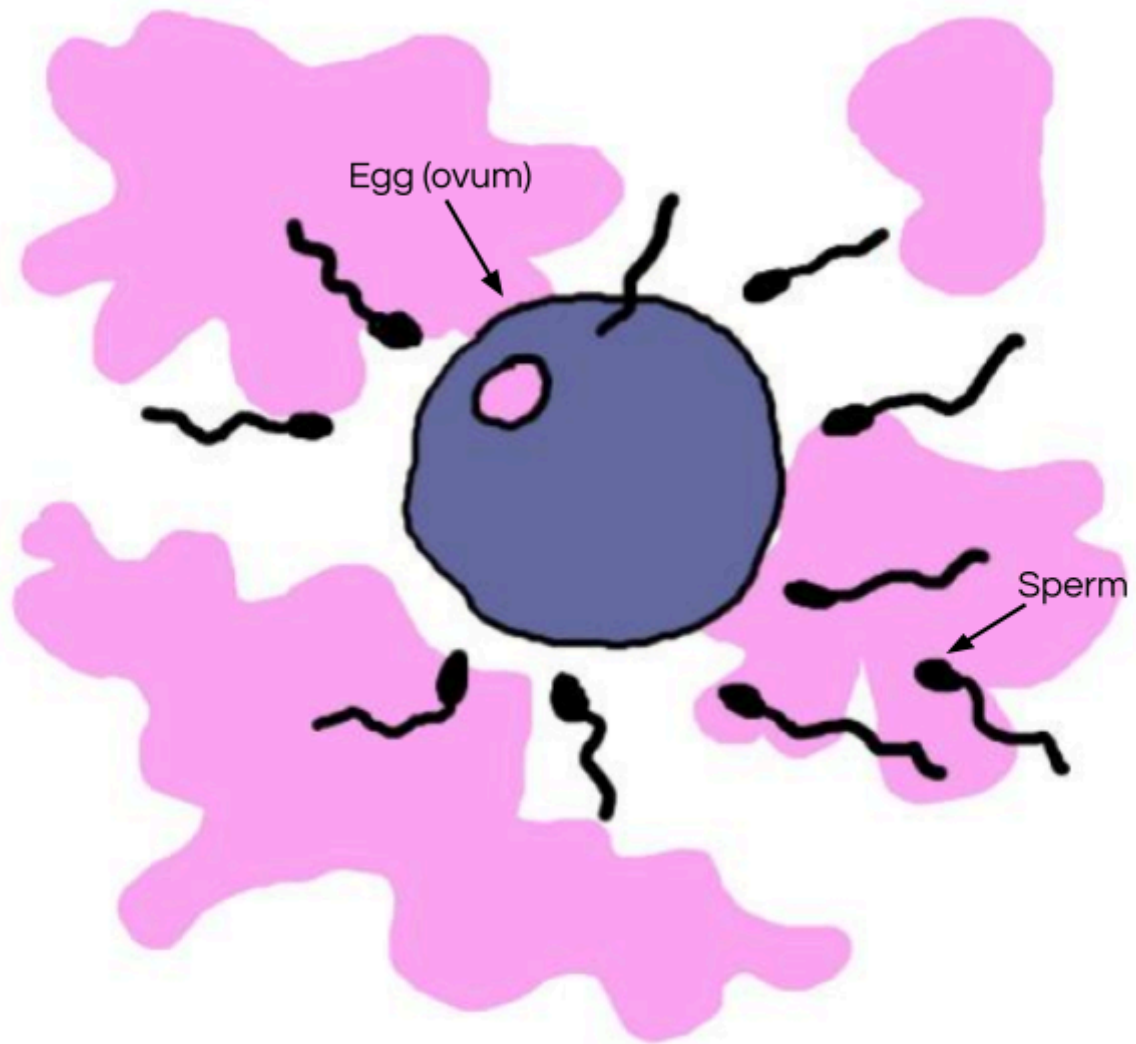

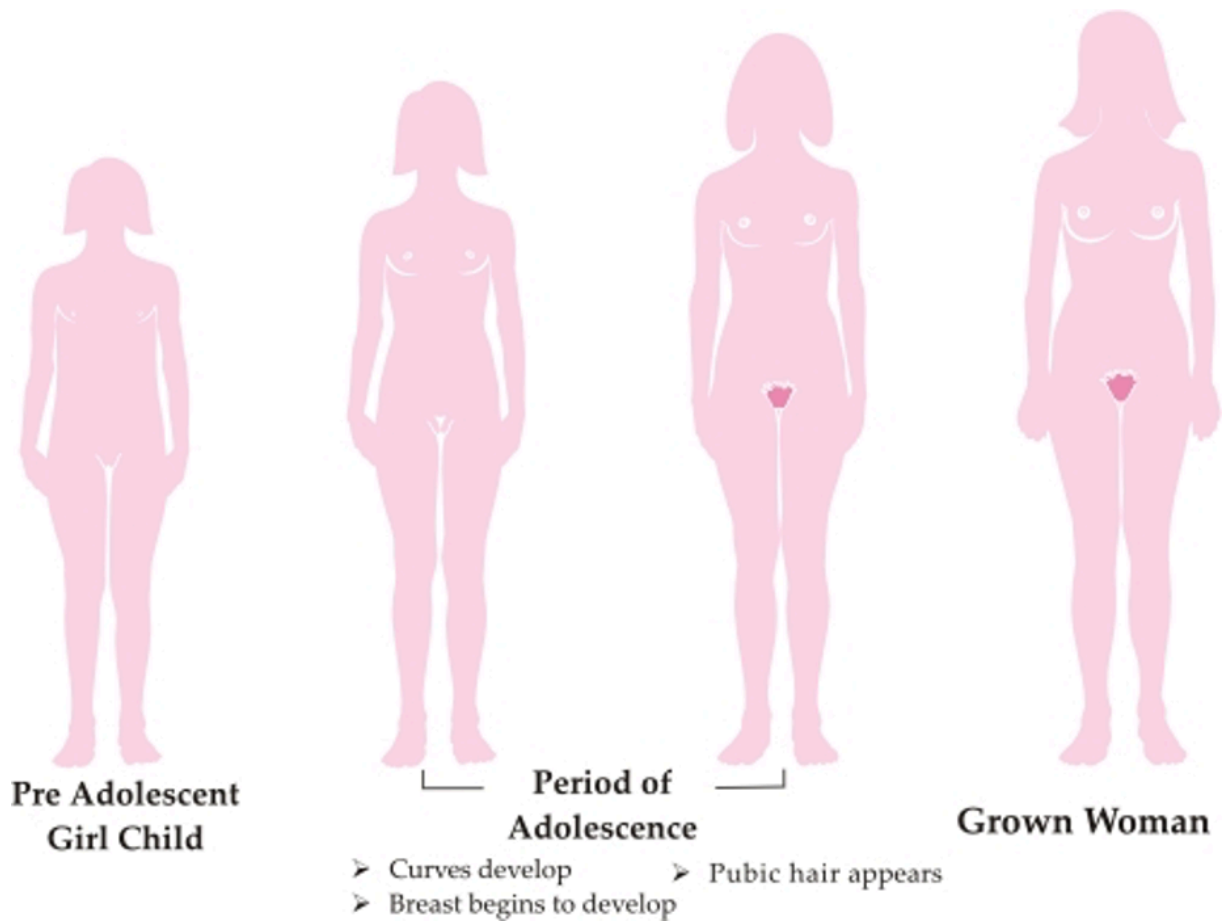

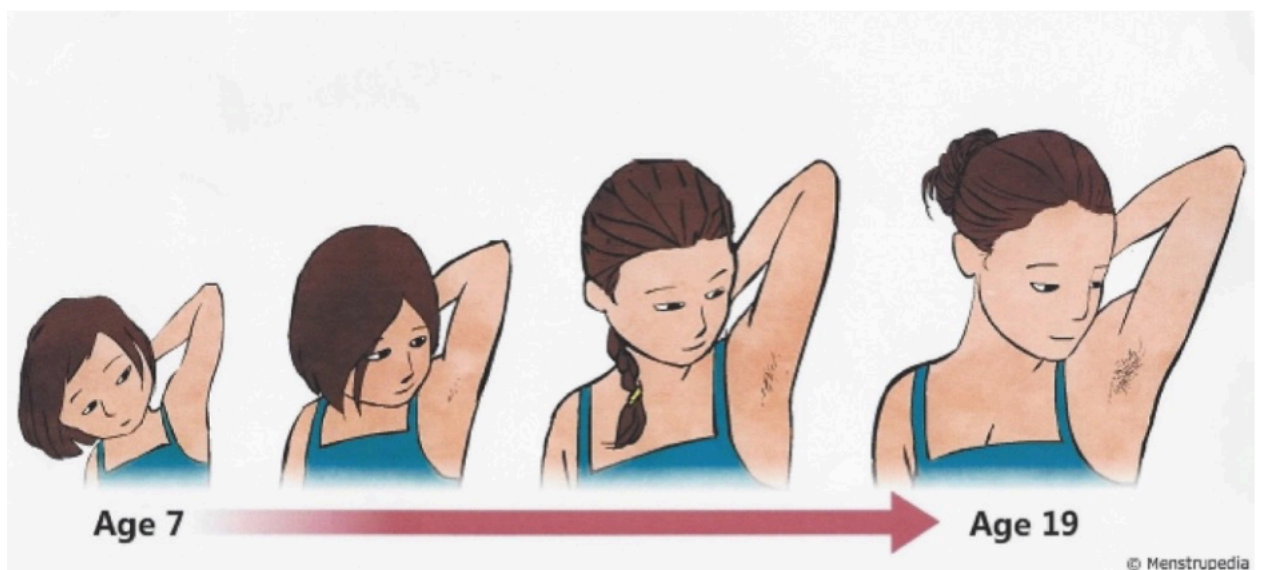

Diagram: Three Stages of Womanhood Timeline

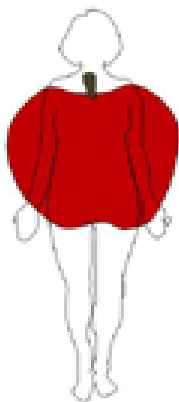
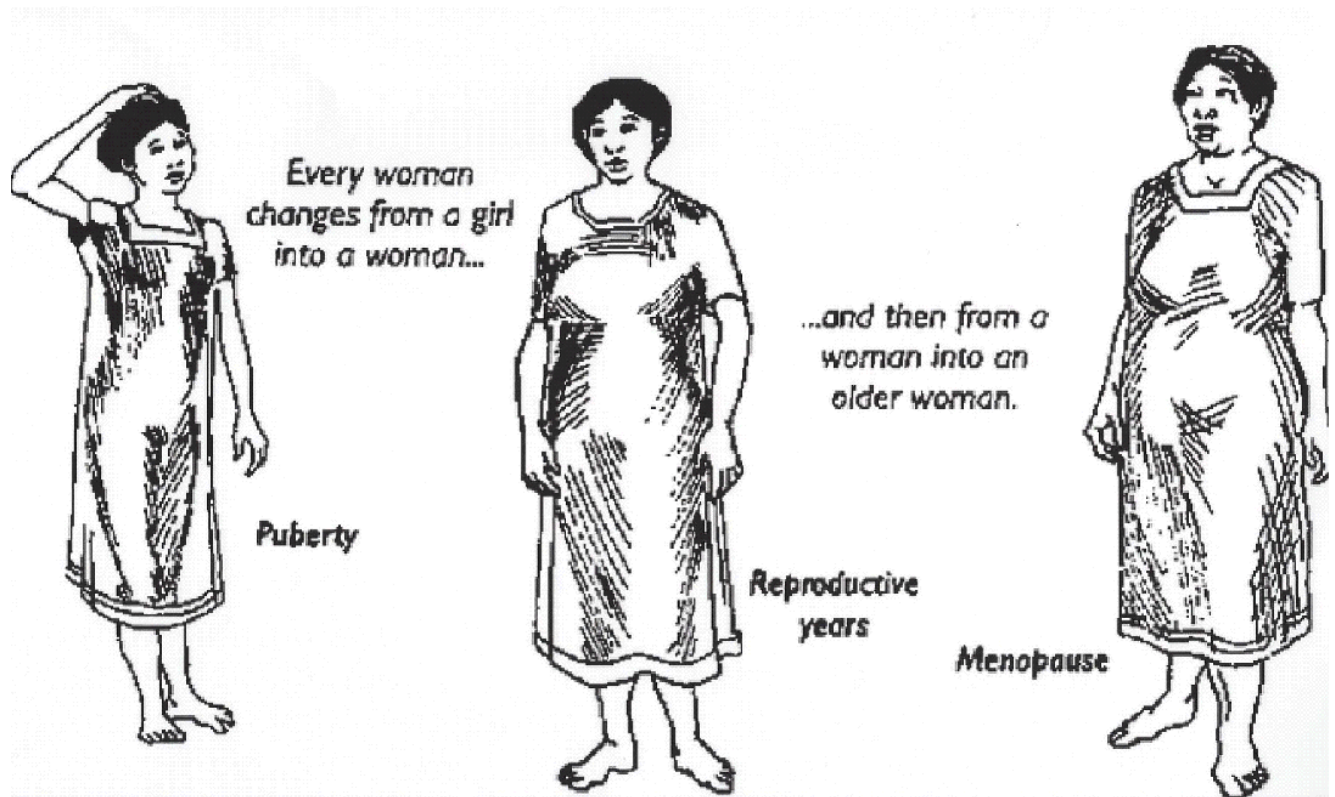

Menopause is thought to play a role in many women's midlife transition from a pear-shaped body to a more apple-shaped body.

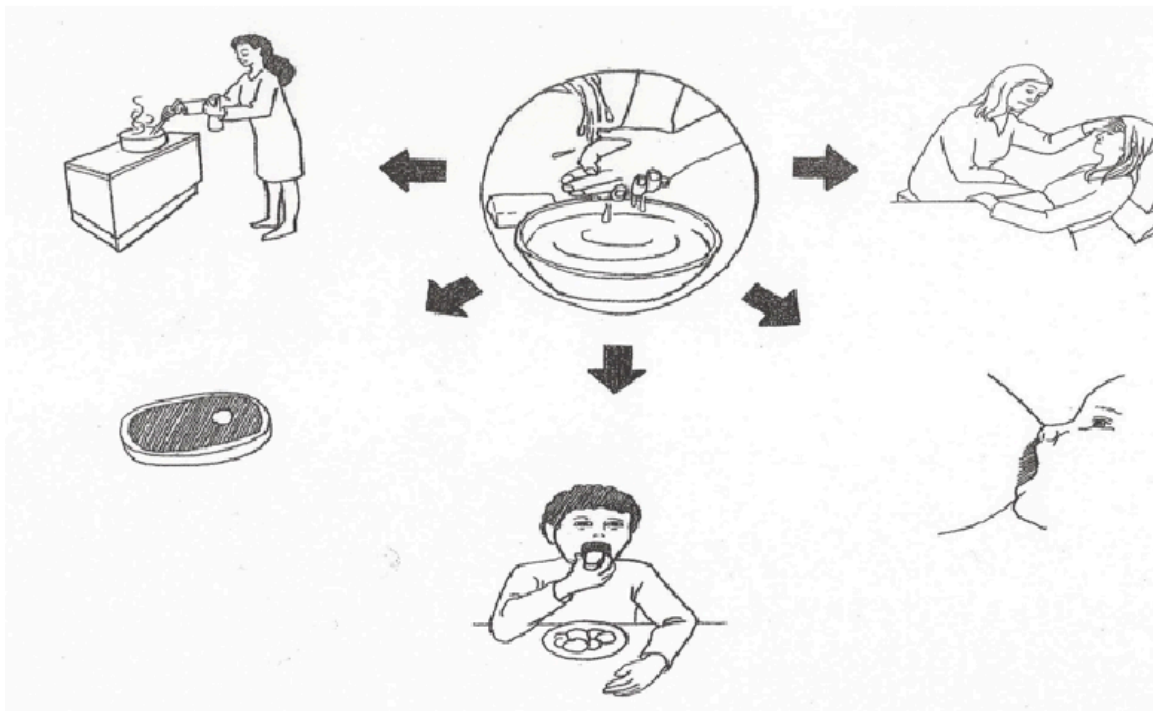

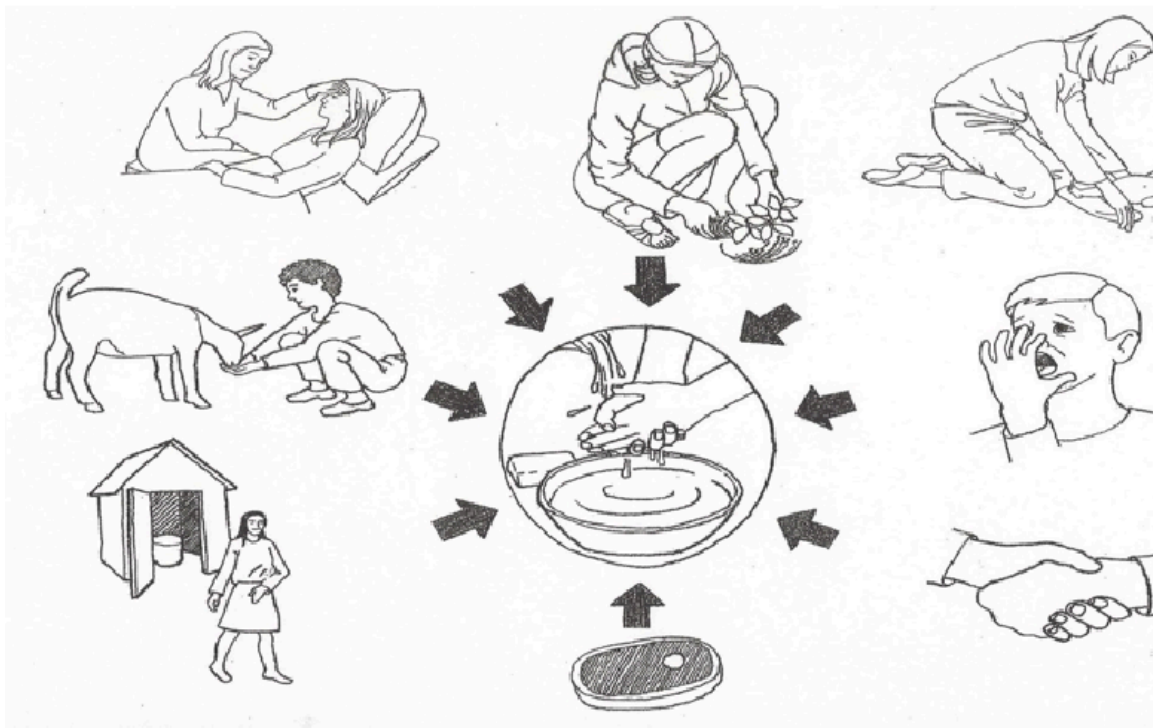

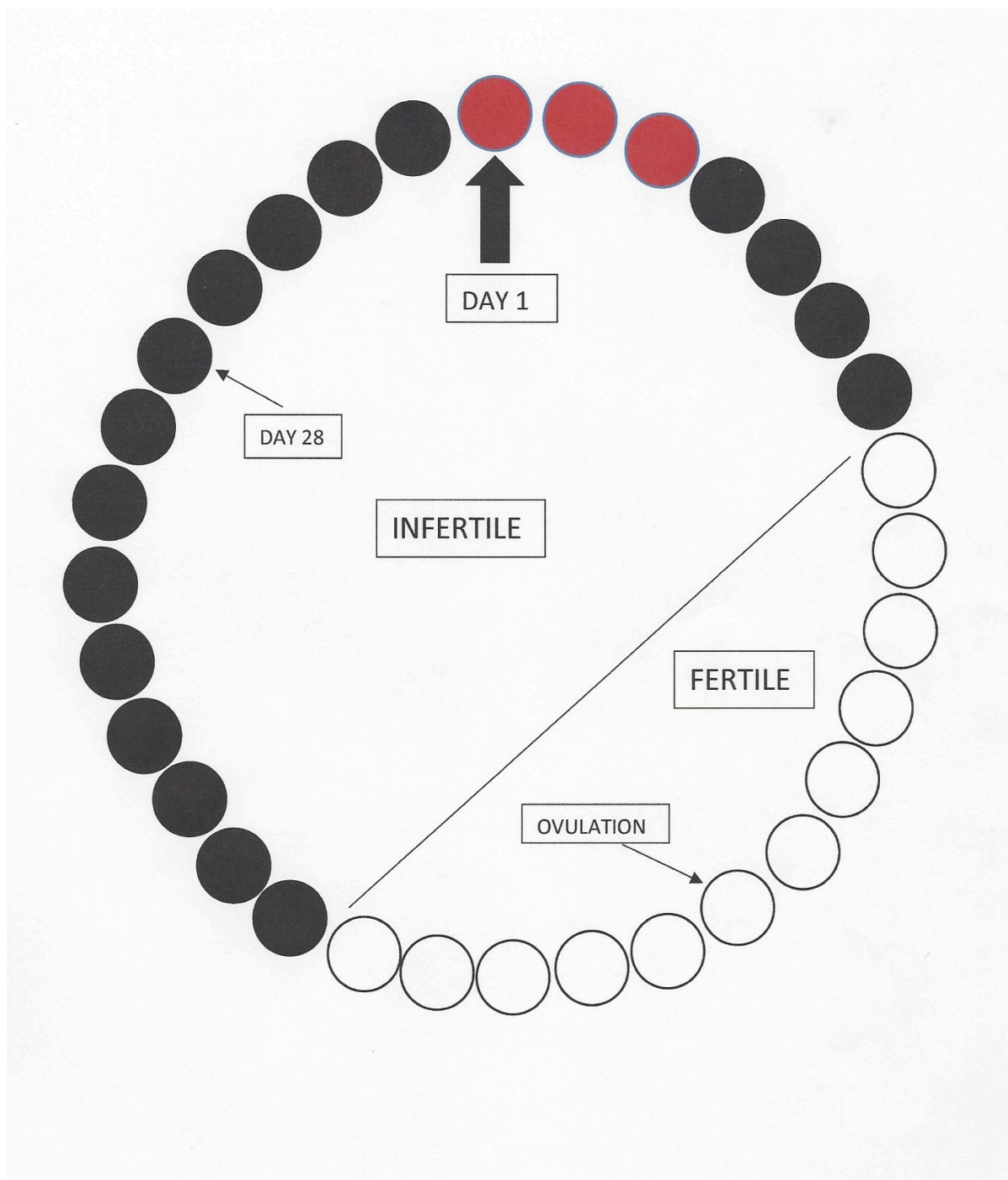

HOW TO USE MONTHLY CYCLE BEADS

Monthly Cycle Beads help you keep track of your menstrual cycle. Each bead represents 1 day of your cycle. Monthly Cycle Beads work well for women whose cycles are normally between 26 and 32 days long.

The **RED** beads represent the first days of your period (menses, when bleeding starts). On the day your period starts mark the first **RED** bead with the marker clip, rubber ring or other way to mark. Each day move the marker to a new bead (**RED** to **RED**).

The **BLACK** beads mark the days you are least likely to become pregnant if you have unprotected sex.

The **WHITE** beads mark the days you are most likely to become pregnant if you have unprotected sex. If you want to avoid pregnancy, abstain from sex or use protection on those days. Having unprotected sex during the days marked by the **WHITE** beads increases the chance of becoming pregnant for those who are planning a pregnancy.

When your next menstrual cycle begins, move the marker to the first **RED** bead. If your period does not start by the day after you mark the last **BLACK** bead, your menstrual cycle is longer than 32 days (or you may be pregnant). If this happens more than once a year, Monthly Cycle Beads will not work well for you.

It is wise to also mark the first day of each period on a calendar, in case you forget to move your marker.

Remember:

RED bead #1 marks the first day of each menstrual cycle (the day bleeding begins).

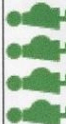
BLACK beads mark the days you are least likely to get pregnant.

WHITE beads mark the days you are most likely to get pregnant.

To String Your Monthly Cycle Beads:

Lay string to the LEFT. From the right: Add 3 **RED (R)** beads. Add 4 **BLACK (B)** beads. Add 12 **WHITE (W)** beads. Add 13 **BLACK** beads. If you want to add a clasp to make it into a necklace, you can do that. Add the marker clip, rubber ring or other type of marker.

Practical Steps: What can you do to stand up to the negative beliefs/self-talk?
HANDOUT

1. **Identify the Negative Thoughts/Self-Talk.** If you are feeling bad about yourself, what thoughts are going through your head? What are you thinking? When you feel anxious or worried about something, what thought triggered that feeling?
2. **Pick a Scripture Verse that Identifies Best with You.** What truths do you need to remember? Write down a phrase or verse from Scripture that speaks to you. Keep it on a notecard or as a note on your phone. Write it on a sticky note and put it next to your mirror at home. Memorize that phrase or verse. Keep it with you at all times.
3. **Speak the truth.** When those negative thoughts begin to creep into your mind, speak the Scripture verse you chose out loud. Say it more than once, more than twice if you need to and remind yourself that you are speaking God's truth and what He thinks about you!
4. **Ask God to Help You.** Ask God to help you distinguish the negative thoughts/lies from His truth. Think about this question: This thought that I have, would my enemy say this about me, or would God say this about me? Use this to distinguish God's voice from the voice of negativity and lies.
5. **Give thanks.** Thank God for hearing you, for helping, and for the truth! You may not feel like anything is different – don't let your feelings dictate the truth. Let the truth dictate reality in your life. Thank God for showing you His truth!
6. **Remind yourself daily of His love through visualization exercises.** Visualization is a way of holding a mental image of God/Jesus as a way of encountering Him and allowing the Holy Spirit to speak truth over your life.

TESTIMONY HANDOUT

Do's in testimony writing:

1. Ask the Lord to give you wisdom and guidance as you write.
2. Prepare your testimony so you can share it with groups as well as with individuals.
3. Keep within your time limit.
4. Be realistic. Do not imply that Christ removes all of life's problems, but rather that He enables you to live through them as you walk in obedience to Him.
5. Consider your audience. Be sensitive to them. Write and speak to communicate with the particular group to whom you are speaking. Be relevant to the audience.
6. Give how-to's.

Don'ts in testimony writing:

1. Don't make statements that reflect negatively on the church, other organizations, or other people.
2. Avoid mentioning denominations.
3. Avoid speaking in a preaching manner. Preaching won't communicate nearly as well as sharing "yourself" with the audience. Speak about personal experiences in your own life to which they can relate. Let the Holy Spirit do the convicting.
4. Don't use vague terms such as "joyful", "peaceful", "happy", or "changed" without explaining them.
5. Avoid using Biblical words such as "saved", "converted", "convicted", or "sin" without clarifying what you mean. These words do not communicate to a non-Christian.
6. Forcing testimony on another.
7. Condemning others or being too long.

Writing style hints:

1. Begin with an attention-getting sentence or incident. Avoid using flowery words or phrases that are unnatural to you.
2. Be positive from start to finish.
3. Be specific. Give enough details to arouse interest.
4. Be accurate.
5. Include interesting, thought provoking experiences.
6. Use one or two Scripture verses, but only where they would relate directly to your experience and fit in naturally.
7. Write a closing that makes your testimony sound finished and logical.
8. The closing of the testimony should relate to the main theme of the testimony.

How to present your testimony:

1. Rehearse your testimony until it becomes natural. You should know your testimony well enough so it doesn't sound memorized as you present it.
2. Share your testimony with conviction in the power of the Holy Spirit. You should believe what you are sharing in your testimony.
3. Smile often. Ask the Lord to give you a pleasant countenance. Your smile will relax the audience and interest them in what you are saying.
4. Speak clearly but in a natural, relaxed tone. Speak loudly enough to be heard.
5. Avoid nervous mannerisms such as rubbing your nose, swaying, jingling coins in your pocket, playing with a pencil, clearing your throat, or using many "you know's" and "uh's". These nervous mannerisms become distractions for the audience. They will not pay close attention to your words when they are distracted.
5. Avoid arguing or using emotional pressure or methods in your testimony to obtain decisions for Christ. The Bible teaches that men and women are born of the Spirit, not through the persuasiveness or logic of others.

Remember that a successful testimony is one given in the power of the Holy Spirit and leaving the results to God.

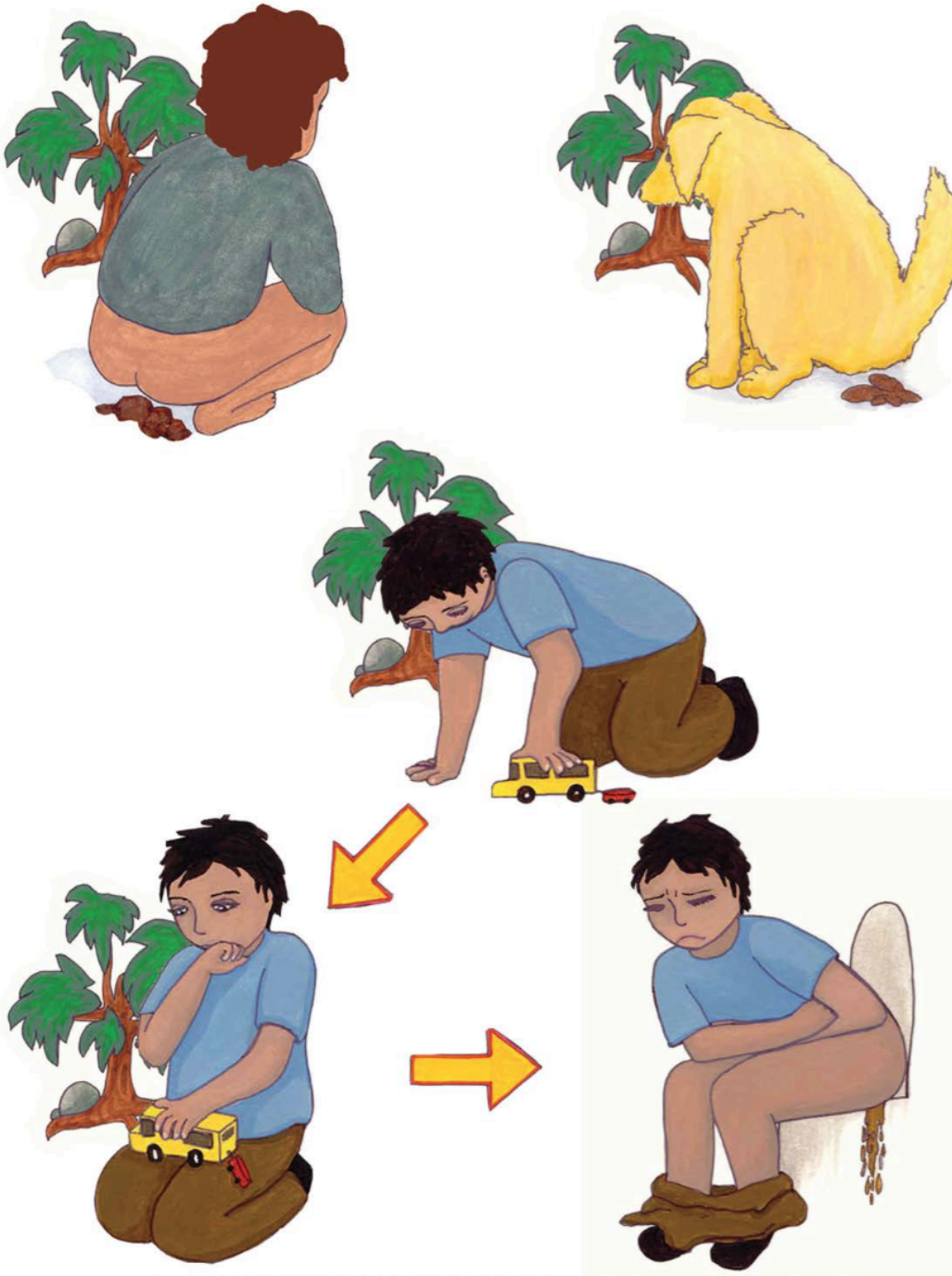

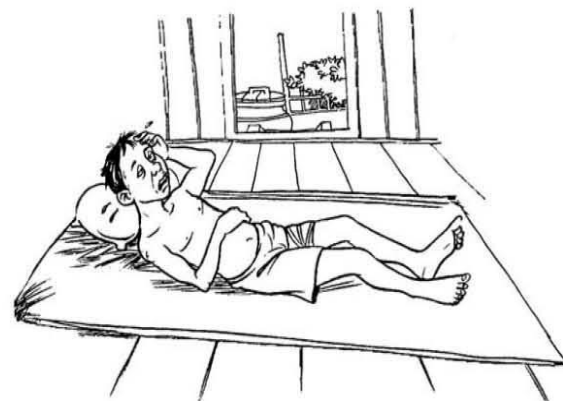

Now this person has **malaria**.

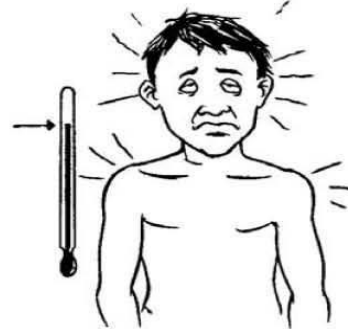
SIGNS OF MALARIA:

Malaria has 3 stages that reoccur every 2 or 3 days and last several hours. These 3 stages are:

1. Chills



2. Fever



3. Sweat



TREATMENT AT HOME:



If you suspect malaria or have repeated fevers, go to a health center or hospital for a blood test and treatment.



If there is no health center nearby, start home treatment:

1. Take paracetamol for fever.



2. Check with your provider to see what malaria medicine they recommend for your area. Go to a pharmacy and buy malaria medicine. Take the medicine according to instructions.



Ten Characteristics Of Local Church Seed Projects

1. Motivated by God's intentions
2. Covered by prayer
3. Simple and short – completed in 1-2 days
4. Well planned
5. Use Local resources - low or no cost
6. It does not manipulate people
7. Done outside the church with the community
8. Beneficiaries participate
9. Intentionally wholistic/integral
10. God is glorified.

Seed projects are small-scale ministry projects, carried out by a group of disciples of Jesus along with community members to demonstrate God's love to their community.

Here are some examples:

- A garbage cleanup
- Latrine repair at the home of a disabled community member
- A football game
- A community seminar on nutrition
- Building a roof shelter for a bus stop
- Painting a community building
- Building a small footbridge connecting populated areas

Which Are Seed Projects?

- A garbage cleanup
- Development of a child-care center
- Latrine repair at the home of a church member
- Formation of a baseball team
- A baseball game
- Formation of a housewives' club
- Painting a room in the church building
- A government-sponsored literary program
- A community seminar on nutrition
- A child feeding program
- A seven-week Bible study on the Gospel of John

Seed Project Planning Guide

Pray: Ask the Holy Spirit to show you God's concern and intentions concerning a physical, spiritual, wisdom, or social need in your community.

Scripture: Select a Scripture passage that reflects God's intentions about the need. Discuss how this Scripture demonstrates that meeting the need honors God. (The principle objective is to honor God, not to meet a need.)

Meditate: Meditate silently and then discuss thoughts about the need.

Choose: If several needs are discussed, write them on a blackboard or large paper. Discuss and narrow the list to one you believe God is calling you to meet.

Vision: Ask the Lord to show you what changes would exist if God's full intentions were met in this area. Write down the changes.

Select: Select one specific project or ministry activity that will move people closer to God's intentions for them in their area of need (our definition of development). Discuss how this project can do that. Keep in mind that, although the preparation may take longer, the project itself should be able to be completed within a few days.

Writing the Plan: Using the blank "Seed Project Plan Worksheet", write your own plan for a seed project that will meet the need selected. Make sure to indicate the secondary impact areas.

Steps: List project steps in the order that they should be implemented.

People Consulted: List the people who should be consulted for each step.

Resources: List the resources needed for each step.

Person Responsible: List the person(s) responsible for carrying out each step.

Dates: List the date that each step will be carried out.

Criteria: Compare your plan with the seed project characteristics. If some are not met, adjust the plan accordingly.

Prayer Continue to pray that the Lord will guide you and bless this seed project, so that the people served and those who observe what is

happening will be blessed and give thanks to God for what they experience and see.

Evaluation: When your seed project is completed, use the Seed Project Report to evaluate your experience.

STARTER: MULTIPLYING INTEGRAL DISCIPLE MAKERS

Role Play: Two people are talking.

1st Hello, my friend, how are you? How is your ministry going?

2nd I am so pleased! Last month I led 23 people to Jesus! They've got their ticket for heaven and are saved from hell. They're good to go! My goal for this next month is to lead 30 people to Jesus! I hope more people are going to get their ticket! What about you?

1st For the last 8 months, I have been meeting regularly with a young, single mother from my work. She has become a believer in Christ and has had a complete lifestyle change. She is learning to spend consistent time in the Word and in prayer. I even invited her to work out with me because she now recognizes the importance of caring for herself physically and emotionally. I have been training her as a disciple on how to love God and her neighbors. Now she has started to share the Good News of the Kingdom of God to her neighbors and she is making new disciples of Jesus. She started leading a Bible study at her apartment complex and the families around her are beginning to change!

2nd That's great. But it seems very slow to me!

Role Play: Women's IDMM Process Overview

Two ministry leaders talking

1st I'm thinking about this IDMM approach. I am still trying to understand how it will work in more difficult countries like here.

2nd I agree. It might not work where we can't preach about Jesus openly.

1st I really wonder how we can expect to see physical and economic changes in the community as well as people beginning to follow Jesus and meet together in groups.

2nd That is a good question. I sure hope there is an answer!

Role Play Created in the Image of God/Woman's Worth
Women's IDMM - HANDOUT 1

Option 1 (From Created in the Image of God)

STARTER Role play: **It's Not Fair!**

Girl talking to her mother while sweeping on the floor.

Daughter: I don't know why God made me to be a girl. Girls are not very important.

Mom: Well, God knows best.

Daughter: But it is not fair that boys are more important than girls. Even when we grow up, we're less important. I don't understand!!! We make the babies and all the food. How can we be less important?

Mom: That's just the way it is! God made it like that.

Daughter: Well, it's not fair that God loves boys more than girls.

OPTION 2 (From A Woman's Worth)

STARTER: Role Play: **It's a Boy!**

This role play involves 3 people: pregnant woman in labor, friend of woman, and husband who is available by phone.

1st scene- Pregnant woman and friend go to the hospital for delivery.

Friend excitedly calls husband to report the birth of a healthy baby girl.

Husband answers and says, "Another girl? I'm going back to work. Tell her I'll see her when she gets home."

2nd scene-3 years later...Pregnant woman and same friend go to the hospital for delivery. Friend calls the husband excitedly to report the birth of a healthy boy.

Husband answers and shouts for joy. He says, "I'll be right over, I'm calling a taxi! We'll have to arrange a party!"

ROLE PLAY - Learning to Pray Like Jesus

Role Play: Two friends are talking.

1st Can you come to our prayer time tonight?

2nd I would like to! But I am too busy.

1st Oh! What are you doing?

2nd First I have to work in the garden. And then I will listen to the news. Oh, and there's a big football game on television tonight.

1st So you don't have time to pray?

2nd Not tonight. Maybe another time.

RIVER CROSSING ROLE PLAY

Role play:

(Draw two lines with chalk on the floor to be banks of a river. Draw two circles representing stepping stones and a larger circle in the middle to represent an island).

Scene 1: Two men come to the river and want to cross but do not know how to swim. The current is strong, and they are afraid to cross. An outsider comes along and sees their difficulty. He offers to help them cross using the stepping stones (or shallow places in river), but they are afraid. He agrees to carry one on his back but only manages to reach the island in the middle. There he leaves the first man and returns back to shore where the other man is waiting.

Scene 2: The outsider returns to the riverbank to the waiting village member but is now too tired to carry him. He refuses to carry the second man but agrees to help show him how to walk across on the stones (or in the shallow places). Halfway across, the village member feels confident enough to manage on his own. The 2nd village member and outsider cross the river, but the first villager is still left on the island. He shouts for help. The outsider walks away and instructs the second village member to go back and show the village member on the island how to walk on the stones or shallow places and reach shore.

----SHOWD questions----

S = What do you See?

H = What is Happening?

Points from the river crossing role play:

- A. When you carry the person, you don't teach him to do it himself.
- B. If you teach someone to do something, teach so he can teach another person so there can be multiplication.
- C. Sometimes you hurt more than help a person by doing it for him.
- D. You learn better by doing and not just seeing.
- E. When the developer leaves and the people are not taught, the project will die.
- F. Use local resources.
- G. A teacher was needed.
- H. We learn by example and encouragement.
- I. Explanation needed.
- J. Repetition important.
- K. More motivation when there is a need.
- L. Sometimes we only do half a job.
- M. Doing it for someone doesn't get the job done.
- N. Task too great for one.
- O. Just because someone can do something doesn't mean they can teach others.
- P. Trainer himself needs to know how to do the task.
- Q. Step by step instruction as person is able to learn and progress.
- R. Don't need vast experience to teach someone else.
- S. Bring out the point that real development is helping people to do things themselves and not just doing things for them.

Second act shows importance of multiplication

ROLE PLAY: How God Designed Women & The Stages of Womanhood

Option 1: How God Designed Women

STARTER: Role play: ***Where Do Babies Come From?***

An adolescent daughter is asking her mother many questions about how babies arrive.

The mother doesn't want to tell her and acts embarrassed. The young girl continues to ask her mother questions.

Finally, the mother in desperation, tells her daughter that the way you get babies is at night when you're asleep, an angel leaves the baby under your bed.

Option 2: The Stages of Womanhood

STARTER: Role play: ***I Think I Might Be Dying!***

Young girl talking to her friend:

1st: I'm so scared! I think I might be dying!

2nd: What!!! Why do you think that?

1st: I can't tell you. I don't know. I just started bleeding one day! At first it was a little bit, but now it's more. It happened last month, too!

2nd: Oh, no! What do you think we should do? Maybe you should tell your mother. Maybe you need to go to the doctor.

1st: I'm too afraid! What if she thinks I am bad? I can't tell my mother! I'm so afraid (starts crying).

Option 3: The Stages of Womanhood - Menopause

Role play: **What is Wrong with You, Mother?**

This role play is for use in section IV of Three Stages of Womanhood, Puberty Through Menopause, if it is taught separately.

Mother and her adult daughter are outside preparing food. They are both working hard - the daughter is peeling the vegetables and the mother is scraping coconut.

Mother: Why do I always seem to get the hard work? I am an old woman; you should be doing more of the work now! I'm hot (as she tries to fan herself with her hand), I'm tired and all of these people coming for dinner are mostly your friends not mine. They were supposed to come tomorrow, not today!

Daughter: What is wrong with you, mother? You are always so cranky, so grumpy lately. You're up in the middle of the night, and you don't want to get up in the morning. You forgot my friends were coming today. You used to love it when my friends came."

Mother sneezes loudly and has a frustrated look on her face, looks down at her leg and sees she has just lost urine. "I'm done with this coconut, you finish it! I am going to the toilet."

STARTER: Handwashing Activity

This is a practical exercise in proper handwashing technique.

- A. Have all participants rub both hands, front and back, with colored chalk or glitter mixed with a little oil.
- B. Divide participants into four groups. Have each group clean their hands with the following methods:
 - Group 1: wiping hands on a dry cloth
 - Group 2: wash with plain water
 - Group 3: wash briefly (less than 20 seconds) with soap and water
 - Group 4: wash vigorously with soap, water, and a small nail brush. Bring large group back together and compare the washing methods. Ask the following questions:

- 1. **Which method got the hands the cleanest?**
 - 2. **Which method did the least amount of good?**
 - 3. **Was washing with water good enough?**
 - 4. **What about drying your hands in the air?**
 - 5. **What would happen if you dried your hands on a dirty towel?**

- C. Have all participants wash hands with soap, water, and brush.

Fertility Awareness

Starter Role play: ***I Wish I Had Your Problem!***

Two women friends talking

1st: We have wanted to have a baby, but I haven't gotten pregnant in the last 4 years. I want to please my husband and I, too, have been longing for a child.

2nd: I wish I had your problem; I have a child every year. I don't feel I can take care of another baby now. I wish I could know how to avoid another pregnancy. I have so much work to do, and I need to help my husband with the animals and farm. My husband says that it costs too much to go to the hospital or to buy medicine for birth control. I don't know what to do!

STARTER Role Play: Not Good Enough - Truth, Lies, & God's Promises

1st I'm really excited about all of this information we are learning in Women's IDMM! I think it's going to be a great way to reach out to the ladies around me. But I'm feeling anxious and worried about doing it.

2nd Why are you so worried about it?

1st I'm worried I'm not good enough to do it. What if I screw up and fail? What if I forget everything I learned? I'm not sure I am capable of doing this.

2nd Yeah, I understand how you feel. I worry about not being good enough too.

Relational Evangelism – STARTER

Role Play:

- 1st** I want to tell my friend how he can be saved. (Holds up his Bible.) Where do I begin?
- 2nd** Why don't you show your friend the ten commandments? They'll be saved after that.
- 3rd** No, have your friend start reading the Bible, beginning in Genesis and reading all the way through Revelation. Then your friend will be saved.

Role Play: Two friends are talking – (5”) - Acts of Love & Seeds Projects

1st I am really struggling with something. I know I am supposed to love my neighbor, but his goat is eating all of my tomatoes. I don't feel much love for him right now.

2nd Yes, I also struggle with loving my neighbor. She has been speaking a lot of gossip about me since I became a believer. It is hard to love her.

1st I know that the Word of God tells us to love God and love others. But, it is so hard to do this.

2nd It sure is. Almost impossible. But maybe there is a way.

What Am I Going To Do From This Seminar?

Role Play: Two friends talking

1st This has been a great seminar and I've learned a lot but I'm not sure what to do with it

2nd Me either. So many new ideas, where to I start? What do I need to do to apply what I've learned?

1st I wish I knew but I don't know what to do
