## A. To qualify for CSF membership, follow these guidelines:

- 1. You must earn a minimum of 10 CSF points from your final grades on last year's report card.
  - a. The first 4 points must be from LIST I
  - b. The first 7 points (including the 4 points described in a) must be from LISTS I and II.
  - c. The remaining points may come from any LIST (I, II, or III).
- 2. You must use no more than 5 courses to qualify.
- 3. No CSF points are given for physical education, courses taken in lieu of physical education, subjects repeated to improve a grade,
  - courses including clerking and office/teaching assistant, and courses taken on a pass/fail basis.
- 4. CSF Points are granted as follows:
  - A = 3 CSF Points
  - B = 1 CSF Point
  - C = 0 CSF Points
  - D or F in any course = Disqualified from membership
- \* 1 additional CSF point shall be granted for a grade of A or B in an AP or Honors course, up to a maximum of 2 such points per application period
