Academy English 2

Estimated Work Outside of Class: 1-2 hrs per week

Course Description:

Academy English is a multi-grade course designed to develop proficiency of the English language through reading comprehension and analysis, writing development, speaking fluency, vocabulary acquisition and grammar usage. It is part of a series of classes intended to fulfill the California state standards requiring three years of high school English. The course is differentiated based on students' individual knowledge and skills. All students will examine universal themes, analyze character development, recognize the significance of various literary devices in fiction and nonfiction selections and begin developing their literary analysis writing skills. In daily lessons, students will be supported in their development of effective studies and organization. This course is based on CA state standards of diplomacy and is not college preparatory in level. This course builds upon the skills introduced in Academy English 1.
