Genetic Testing Finds Strong Authenticity Rate Among Covington Restaurants, With Compliance Concerns Remaining

SeaD Genetic Testing Reveals Majority of Covington Restaurants Serving Authentic Local Shrimp

Covington, La. — February 24, 2026 — SeaD Consulting today announced the results of genetic testing using its Rapid ID Genetic High-accuracy Test ([RIGHTTest™](#)) conducted on shrimp dishes served at restaurants across Covington, Louisiana. Testing revealed a high rate of authentic domestic wild-caught shrimp being served, though compliance and disclosure issues persist at a small number of establishments.

Covington, located on Louisiana's Northshore, is known for its strong culinary scene and proximity to Gulf seafood supply chains. Consumers frequently expect restaurants in the region to serve authentic Louisiana wild-caught shrimp.

Between recent sampling dates, SeaD teams conducted random genetic testing at **24 restaurants throughout Covington**. Samples were analyzed to determine whether shrimp marketed or implied as local wild-caught Louisiana shrimp were authentic.

Key Findings

- **21 of 24 restaurants (87%)** were confirmed to be serving authentic American wild-caught shrimp
- **3 of 24 restaurants (13%)** were found to be serving imported, farm-raised shrimp
- Among the three restaurants serving imports:
 - **One** displayed signage stating some items may contain imported seafood; however, staff verbally represented the shrimp as Gulf shrimp and the restaurant website claims only local Louisiana seafood is used

- o **One** listed Gulf shrimp on the menu line item but testing revealed imported product
- o **One** listed imports on the menu and verbally stated the shrimp was Ecuadorian

These findings show a **strong overall authenticity rate in Covington**, while highlighting continued inconsistencies between menu claims, staff representations, and verified sourcing at a minority of locations.

Louisiana Labeling Law Compliance Concerns

Louisiana law requires restaurants serving imported shrimp to clearly disclose that information to consumers through signage or menu language.

SeaD's findings indicate **partial but insufficient compliance** among the restaurants found to be serving imports. In multiple cases, consumer-facing messaging conflicted with genetic results, potentially creating confusion for diners seeking local seafood.

Andrew Blanchard, Head of the Louisiana Shrimp Task Force, said, "We are happy to share all the results of the genetic testing with the Louisiana Department of Health, upon their request, for investigation and enforcement. When local shrimp is so abundant, transparency remains critical for maintaining consumer trust and supporting Louisiana fishermen."

SeaD's Covington testing demonstrates encouraging progress in shrimp authenticity compared to some previously tested Louisiana markets. However, the presence of undisclosed imports at a subset of restaurants underscores the continued need for:

- Clear menu transparency
- Accurate staff communication
- Consistent compliance with Louisiana seafood disclosure laws, especially at seafood restaurants where consumers assume they are receiving American wild-caught shrimp
- Ongoing consumer awareness

Maintaining trust in Louisiana's seafood brand depends on alignment between what restaurants claim and what is actually served.
