







U.S., Army Transport Service Arriving and Departing Passenger Lists, 1910-1939, for Albert P. Smith, ancestry.com








Note that this is a WWII draft card. Men who were born on or after Feb. 17, 1897 were required to register. Albert Smith was born on Feb. 21, 1897, just barely making the draft for both world wars. He was 44 years old.


