Statement of Intent

We believe that identifying the barriers to learning enables us to target these areas so that the pupil's learning improves to help to narrow gaps between disadvantaged children and their peers, particularly in English and maths.

We use evidence to identify how best to use our funding. We do this by identifying:

- which specific activities have been found to be the most effective in addressing the types of challenge that our pupils face
- what implementation strategies may be important to ensure success in our school
- the potential scale of impact that we can achieve for specific activities

The EEF's toolkit helps leaders compare the effectiveness of a variety of strategies.

We believe that the effective use of pupil premium requires discussion with school leaders and staff members to identify the strategies that we will fund.

Challenges

Challenge number	Detail of challenge
1	Training staff for the Implementation of the universal offer of teaching
2	Some pupils need additional pre teaching or post teaching in order to consolidate their learning in phonics to support early reading
3	Lack of high quality reading material at home.
4	Some disadvantaged pupils require additional SEND support
5	Some families find it difficult to ensure children arrive at school before the start of the day
6	Some families cannot afford for their children to have access to extra curricular clubs, non curricular visits or uniform

Support for Breakfast Cub, other clubs and uniform for identified children (6)	Children to be at school on time everyday, have access to extra curricular activities and have school uniform

Provide training to all staff to deliver impactful phonics lessons, keep up and catch up sessions in line with new scheme	Quality of phonics sessions has led to significant impact in phonic skills of pupils and this is supporting a love of reading from the early years upwards
Provide training to TAs in effective pre teaching with designated groups, and post teaching as required	Greater progress seen by the pupils in Reading, Writing and Maths
Training for EYFS / KS1 teacher / TA in mastering number (NCETM)	Quality of maths teaching has improved
Provide visual support to enable increased concentration on teaching and feedback	Pupils concentration and attitude to learning ave increased and pupils are now using the feedback from staff to improve their work
Additional support for identified SEND pupils	SEND pupils are supported more quickly and have increased opportunities for development of their learning therefore SEND have made good progress compared to their pupil passport targets
