Prerequisite: Biology, Algebra 1. **There will not be class on June 19.** Open only to students attending Swiss semester abroad. **Permission of the Department Chair and Upper School Head is required.** A textbook is not required for this class. Students will be encouraged to reflect on both their intuitions and what they take to be universal values as they relate to their respective worldviews. Students will also analyze their own belief-forming and decision-making

processes, especially in conflicted and morally ambiguous situations. Finally, this course will examine some of the most important ethical theories in the history of human thought, as well as how to apply these theories to today's real-world ethical issues.
