<u>abroad</u>	Adverb	The man has been living abroad for many years.
<u>absolutely</u>	Adverb	I am absolutely coming to the party tomorrow.
<u>accident</u>	Noun	I'm sorry I did that. It was an accident.
<u>advantage</u>	Noun	Travelling with friends has many advantages.
<u>advertise</u>	Verb	The packaged-tour was advertised on TV.
<u>afford</u>	Verb	How do you afford to travel so much?
<u>aisle</u>	Noun	I prefer to sit in an aisle seat on airplanes.
<u>architecture</u>	Noun	The architecture of that building is beautiful.
<u>baggage</u>	Noun	Do you know where we can pick up our baggage?
<u>basically</u>	Adverb	I basically just answer emails all day at my job.

<u>depart</u>	Verb	What time does your plane depart?
<u>description</u>	Noun	Could you please provide us with a description of the man that stole your bag?
<u>destination</u>	Noun	We left Vancouver and went to Melbourne, Australia. This means Melbourne was our destination.
<u>disadvantage</u>	Noun	We didn't take a tour because there were many disadvantages over planning the trip ourselves.
<u>equator</u>	Noun	I crossed the equator when I flew to Peru.
