If you have flood damage to your private roads, driveways, culverts:

Here are steps to take:

- Complete the Flood Damage Resident Form: <u>Flood Damage Resident Form VT 211 (vermont211.org)</u> This reporting helps Vermont apply for federal disaster designation
- Report damages to your town of residence
- Get a quote for the work that needs to be done; some resources listed below
- If you can do a temporary fix, do so. Keep all receipts for work that is done.

When and if Vermont qualifies for individual FEMA funding, the following must be met (this information is from 8/17/23 and may change in a new declaration):

To qualify for assistance from FEMA, you must have owned and occupied your home at the time of the disaster, and a FEMA inspection must determine that repairs are necessary for a vehicle to access the property. In addition, you must meet at least one of the following conditions:

- The road or bridge is the only access to the property
- No one can access the home due to damaged infrastructure
- The safety of the occupants could be adversely affected because emergency services vehicles cannot reach the residence (this will only be considered if access was available before the disaster)

When multiple households share a privately-owned access route, each household should apply separately so they can be considered for all forms of aid. Assistance for the route will be shared among applicants, requiring additional coordination and documentation.
